

# TO FILE NO. 15-16/125

This Resolution requests the state legislature to initiate the process of changing the elected position of county treasurer to an appointed position. Currently under Wis. Stat. § 17.21 (3) a vacancy in the county treasurer is filled by appointment by the county board. This process was used in 2013 when a select committee consisting of the county board chair, 1<sup>st</sup> vice chair, 2<sup>nd</sup> vice chair along with the finance & budget committee chair and vice chair was responsible for reviewing and interviewing candidates for the county treasurer position and forwarding a recommendation to the county board to fill the vacancy in the office of county treasurer. The recruitment process used was the same as recruitment for all appointed county positions. This process resulted in 33 applications for the position which was narrowed to 7 applicants by the select committee. The select committee reviewed each applicants training and experience and interviewed the prior to making its recommendation. This process resulted in adoption of a Resolution on July 16, 2013 appointing Glenda Lyons as Eau Claire County Treasurer effective September 7, 2013 through January 2, 2017.

Under Article XII of the Wisconsin Constitution, amending the constitution requires a majority vote of both houses of the legislature, then after the next general election another majority vote of both houses of the legislature and final approval by a majority of the popular vote cast by Wisconsin citizens.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors that it requests state legislature begin the process of changing the position of county treasurer from elected to appointed ultimately giving the voters of the state of Wisconsin the opportunity to make the final decision.



#### **PROJECT: Tower Site Lease Extension**

#### BACKGROUND

In 2001 Eau Claire County signed a 20-year agreement to allow Airadigm Communications, Inc. (now SBA Communication Corporation) to construct a tower on county property at the highway department Altoona shop site. Eau Claire County is paid annually for the use of this property. This lease expires in December of 2020 and SBA Communications has requested an extension of the lease for another 25 years.

## PROPOSAL/LEASE TERMS

- 1. The extension is for 25 years.
- 2. Rent in addition to the rent of \$44,140 per year from January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2020 and the co-location fee of \$\$1500 per user per year; and
- 3. The rent will increase 4% per year beginning in 2021; and
- 4. A signing bonus of \$10,000 will be paid (upon signing); and
- 5. The County has the option to terminate the lease in 2030.

Note that currently the tower is shared (co-located) by three cell companies so the County receives \$4,500 (3 x \$1,500) in addition to the \$44,140/year. Total revenue received for 2016 is \$48,640.

# **FISCAL NOTE**

The revenues are paid to Highway Department (currently applied to the Highway equipment fund).

The revenues increase 4% per year based on this extension.

WHEREAS, SBA Communications Corporation has requested that the lease be extended for a 25-year period and the purchasing director has negotiated terms of such an extension; and

WHEREAS, the main points of the agreement are:

- 1. Rent in addition to the rent of \$44,140 per year from January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2020 and the co-location fee of \$\$1500 per user per year; and
- 2. The rent will increase 4% per year beginning in 2021; and
- 3. A signing bonus of \$10,000 will be paid (upon signing); and
- 4. The County has the option to terminate the lease in 2030.

WHEREAS, the extension will substantially enhance the current revenue pull from the cellular tower site.

This resolution is necessary due to the fact that the current entity providing medical examiner services to Eau Claire County is no longer able to continue to provide such services in 2016. Christopher Kruse, Medical Examiner for Dunn County has agreed to be appointed as medical examiner for Eau Claire County and provide all required services through himself and those he appoints as Deputy Medical Examiners. The Medical Examiner and Deputies will be hired as limited term employees for up to 6 months with the ability of the county administrator to extend the service for an additional 6 months. The cost of services for a year will be approximately \$125,000, which is within the amount budgeted.

In the 2015 county budget process the county administrator established a Medical Examiner Workgroup to do a program review and identify options for providing medical examiner services. The Medical Examiner Workgroup completed its program review on December 16, 2015. During the initial 6 month transition phase the county administrator will review the options identified for providing medical examiner services along with how services are being provided during the transition period and make a recommendation to the committee on administration regarding how such services should be provided in the future.

Fiscal Impact: Within budgeted amount-Cost is approximately \$62,500 for six months.

### TO FILE NO. 15-16/113

The Eau Claire County Sheriff's Office currently utilizes 1 FTE Administrative Specialist III position to provide coverage at the Eau Claire County Jail's front lobby. This position was created/granted during the staffing and budgeting plans for the newly constructed jail. The position took over many tasks and job duties that were assigned to Correctional Officers in the previous jail. This re-assignment was an attempt to reduce the costs associated with these duties.

This position has been under constant evaluation since the jail opened in September of 2012. During this evaluation period the Eau Claire County Jail has experienced several difficulties with this position and is requesting the conversion of the 1 FTE Administrative Specialist III position to a Correctional Officer position to increase efficiencies within the jail and to increase the safety and security of visitors, inmates, and staff. This conversion would also provide a better service to the community as the Correctional Officer would be able address a much broader range of concerns from the public instead of having to re-direct them to several other locations for answers and/or services.

This conversion would allow for greater monitoring of all visitors to the facility to include those that are approved for professional visitations in the semi-contact visiting rooms. We have experienced an increase in the number of unauthorized visitors gaining access to the semi-contact rooms. Having an experienced Correctional Officer approving and/or denying access would increase the safety and security of the facility.

The front lobby is utilized as an area for the public to drop off clothing and other approved items. Each of these items requires a search by a correctional officer for the safety of the facility. Having a correctional officer at this location to immediately complete the search would increase efficiency of delivery, reduce the number of lost items, and again would increase the security of the facility. The assigned correctional officer could also assist with releasing inmate property which is a function that cannot currently be performed from the front lobby area. Medications currently can only be accepted through Central Control as they need to be counted, logged, and turned over to nursing by correctional staff. This practice could be moved to the front lobby increasing efficiency both for staff and the public as they would not have to drop medications off at a separate location than other items. This would also help alleviate pressure on the Central Control post to increase safety.

In addition, the Sheriff's Office intends to re-assign additional duties to this position or area that are currently being done by correctional officers within the jail. This will increase the efficiency within the jail and assist with areas of understaffing such as the Booking/Receiving area that was recently mentioned as an understaffed area in our annual DOC inspection document. These tasks include accepting, logging, searching, and scanning inmate mail; greater monitoring of the approximately 8,550 inmate visits per year; security "wanding" of professional visitors granted access to the secure portions of the jail; and answering questions of the public that cannot be addressed by the current staffing plan resulting in call transfers to correctional officer work stations.

This change would also allow for another person to cover for overtime shifts to help reduce the number of day off order-ins in an effort to reduce staff stress and turnover. It would also provide for an additional person to respond to an emergency if/when needed.

During this evaluation period the Sheriff's Office has had a great number of citizen complaints about services we are unable to provide at the lobby window. At one time we were able to assign a uniformed correctional officer who was on a Progressive Return to Work Plan to this area. During the time of this assignment we observed an increase in efficiency at this location and within the facility as a whole due to the greater level of service we were able to provide to the public and staff.

## Fiscal Impact

The fiscal impact would not exceed \$8,959, depending upon the costs for health insurance for the affected individuals. There are currently several vacancies in the Sheriff's Office which will be filled in the coming months. The savings in health insurance resulting from these vacancies will offset the expenses to implement this change.

The details of the engagement with Clifton Larson Allen include, but are not limited to the following assessment:

#### Comprehensive Review of Current State Receipting Processes and Procedures:

- a. Conduct a comprehensive operational review of your current state processes and procedures associated with receipting at collection sites to be defined by the County.
- Meet with the County's accounting staff and other key individuals involved in the processes to discuss, review and obtain more comprehensive current state information on the County's processes and procedures.
- c. Document the County's adopted current state receipting processes and procedures. Identify and document any differences between adopted and actual processes and procedures being followed by County staff.
- d. Identify key checks and balances, identify current key internal controls and identify key internal control strengths and weaknesses in current processes.
- e. Prepare a report that will document all findings, recommendations for process improvements, and key internal control gaps and weaknesses.
- Review and discuss all findings and recommendations for process improvements and key internal control gaps and weaknesses with management.

The methodology employed allows for the county to begin with a narrow construct and expand as needed to address internal controls in other key areas. The consultant will also provide guidance on options for long term management of a strong internal control function.

Internal Controls are to be an integral part of any organization's financial and business policies and procedures. Internal controls consists of all the measures taken by the organization for the purpose of; (1) protecting its resources against waste, fraud, and inefficiency; (2) ensuring accuracy and reliability in accounting and operating data; (3) securing compliance with the policies of the organization; and (4) evaluating the level of performance in all organizational units of the organization. Internal controls are simply good business practices.

Everyone within the County has a role in internal controls. The roles vary depending upon the level of responsibility and the nature of involvement by the individual. The Board of Supervisors, together with Administration, establish the presence of integrity, ethics, competence and a positive control environment. The department heads have oversight responsibility for internal controls within their units. Managers and supervisory personnel are responsible for executing control policies and procedures at the detail level within their specific unit. Each individual within a unit is to be cognizant of proper internal control procedures associated with their specific job responsibilities.

The Internal Audit role is to examine the adequacy and effectiveness of the County internal controls and make recommendations where control improvements are needed. This can be accomplished in multiple ways, through the use of consulting services or the creation of a position within County government. It is important that this activity remain independent and objective, the consultant or employee that conducts the internal audit does not have the primary responsibility for establishing or maintaining internal controls. However, the effectiveness of the internal controls are enhanced through the reviews performed and recommendations made by Internal Auditing.

**Fiscal note**: The initial engagement with CLA is \$6,700. The additional \$50,000 in funding will only be utilized after the initial assessment as needed. A 2/3 vote of the Board is required for passage.
