Supervisor Moore called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m.

Appointment of Committee Clerk- Discussion/Action

ACTION: Supervisor Clark made a motion to appoint Angle Harmon as committee clerk. Motion carried, 4-0.

Highway Department Space Needs Study – Jon Johnson - Information Only – Discussion

The members received a Highway Dept. Facility Space Needs report developed by Ayres Associates. Norman Barrientos and Michael Stoffel gave the committee an overview of the report. In the report there is a summary detailing what is needed to repair each of the highway buildings as is now. The second part of the study discusses options for a new plan design and cost for optimal operations. The group will continue to discuss the options and will be brought back to a future committee meeting.

<u>Law Enforcement Software – Intergovernmental Agreement – Frank Draxler–</u> Discussion/Action

Frank briefed the members on the purchase of law enforcement software. He is present to discuss the intergovernmental agreement between the City of Eau Claire and Eau Claire County. The City Council will be addressing purchasing and agreement next week. Frank provided the committee with a fact sheet and resolution (Resolution #16-17/016). Information Systems have funds available to purchase the software.

ACTION: Supervisor Beckfield made a motion to approve the intergovernmental agreement and purchase of law enforcement software. Motion carried, 4-0.

Review Amended Ordinance #16-17/002 – Discussion/Action

Janet Loomis was present to inform the committee on the suggested changes on amendment #1 to Ordinance #16-17/002. The ordinance was seen for first reading by the full county board at the April 19, 2016 meeting.

Medical Examiner Fee Update – Discussion/Action

Keith provided an update on the medical examiner fee update since legislation passed last year changing the fees. Eau Claire County collected the increase in fees. Fees have since been changed back.

Medical Examiner Contract Update – Discussion/Action

Kathy mentioned that the Medical Examiner services are being contracted and provided by the current Medical Examiner from Dunn County.

Review/Approval of Citizen Appointments to Select Commissions, Boards, and Councils / **Discussion-Action**

All the members present discussed the citizen appointments to the select commissions, boards and councils. The following decisions were made:

The ADRC appointment has been placed on hold to obtain more applications. Barry Wells will be reappointed to the CV Regional Airport Commission. Karen Meier-Tomesh will be reappointed to the Board of Land Use Appeals. Glory Adams and Ricky Strauh will be appointed to the Land Conservation Commission. Kathryn White, James Hager, Larry Ganske, Jack Running, Jason Knecht, and Steve Vargo will be appointed to the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC). John Frank will be appointed to the West Central Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission.

UW-Oshkosh Graduate Students Project Update – Discussion/Action

Kathy updated the members on the project that was recently completed by the graduate students as UW-Oshkosh. A presentation was developed and proposed to Kathy by the students.

Strategic Planning - Discussion

Currently, the county board and department managers have been working with a strategic planning consultant. The final process was discussed and will be completed in June.

Review of WCA – Annual Business Meeting/Resolutions from Eau Claire Co. – Discussion/Action

The members were resolution #16-17/017 that lists resolutions that have been adopted since July 2015 that took positions on proposed state legislation. These resolutions will be brought to the WCA annual business meeting in September.

structures have reached the end of their useful life or it would be in the best interests of the county to terminate the lessor-lessee relationship, leases will be terminated by the managerdirector. In the event that at the termination of a leasehold, structures or fixtures remain which were erected or affixed to the property by the lessee and title to which has not been turned over to the airport by the terms of the lease, such structures or fixtures shall be removed by the lessee within 90 days of the termination date. Upon failure of the lessee to so comply, the airport may, at its option, either assume ownership of the structure and fixtures or demolish them and charge the costs thereof against the former lessee.

SECTION 10. That Section 12.11.040 of the code be amended to read:

12.11.040 Lease transfers, subleases. In order for the manager director to consider or grant any lease transfer or subleases of a lease, the lessee making such a request must have satisfied all terms and conditions of its current lease, and have no moneys due and owing to the airport. Transfer of an existing lease without alteration to another party, is subject to approval of the manager director. No sub-lease will be allowed unless lessee enters into a Hangar Keepers Agreement with the airport and payment of the established fee for the right to conduct the business of renting hangar space.

SECTION 11. That Section 12.11.050 of the code be amended to read:

12.11.050 Lease rates. Lease rates shall be established under Chapter 12.23, by the commission. Rate adjustments during the term of the lease shall be set forth within the lease.

A. The standard procedure for requesting a lease involves the solicitation of or receipt by the managerdirector of a written proposal by a prospective lessee, or the receipt by the managerdirector of a written proposal from a party seeking to sublease space from an existing leaseholder.

C. Requests by existing lessees for additional leased areas will be considered only if the lessee has no moneys owed to the airport under the terms of its present lease, and only if it has been, in the judgment of the managerdirector, conscientious in adhering to the provisions of the current lease.

E. Commercial leases: All requests for commercial leases require the filing with the managerdirector of a written application which must include:

1. Name, address and telephone number of applicant(s);

2. A detailed description of the proposed operation;

3. A detailed description and layout plan of all

4. The background and qualifications of the applicant(s) and the number of

6. Statements and documents demonstrating the financial stability of the (s).

12.25.100 Removal of illegally parked vehicles.

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A. No vehicles shall be parked or stopped in loading zones, auto rental parking areas or business parking areas unless the owner or occupant thereof has the consent of the airport manager director or the party under whose control the given parking area is placed. Any vehicle illegally parked or stopped may be removed and impounded by the airport manager director or designee and released to the owner thereof only upon presentation of proper identification and payment of all towing and storage charges and forfeitures assessed under this chapter.

B. The airport manager <u>director</u> or designee may remove and impound any vehicle which is illegally parked, disabled or abandoned, which creates an operational hazard whether in

the general parking area or elsewhere upon the airport premises. Such vehicles shall be released to the owner thereof only upon presentation of proper identification and payment of all towing and storage charges and forfeitures assessed under this chapter.

C. Upon impoundment of a vehicle under this section, the airport manager director or designee shall ascertain the name and address of the owner and shall notify the owner by registered or certified mail of the action which has been taken.

D. Neither the county nor the commission shall not be liable for damage which occurs to any vehicle which might result during the impoundment process.

SECTION 23. That Subsections A. & B of Section 12.26.005 of the code be amended to read:

A. The terms "airport," "airport manager<u>director,</u>" "commission," "person," "personnel," "security policy," and "vehicle" shall have the meanings set forth at 12.25.005.

 B. "Emergency equipment" means ambulances, crash rescue and firefighting apparatus and such other equipment as the airport manager director may, from time to time, designate as being necessary to safeguard airport runways, taxiways, ramps, buildings and other property.

SECTION 24. That Section 12.26.020 of the code be amended to read:

12.26.020 Pedestrian traffic on airport. No pedestrian shall be allowed beyond the terminal area, the apron or aircraft tie-down area unless for the purpose of egress from or ingress to an aircraft, or unless authorized by the airport managerdirector. Pedestrian traffic is prohibited on the runway and upon outlying areas of the airport except for those employees of the county, state and federal government or contractors engaged in airport construction or maintenance work.

It shall be the duty of the airport manager<u>director</u>, personnel and the security police to enforce the regulations of this chapter and to issue citations for violations hereof. 12.30.020 Collection of fuel flowage fee.

A. Each bulk oil distributor who delivers aviation fuel to any person or organization on the premises of the Chippewa Valley Regional Airport shall, within the first 25 days of the month next following delivery, prepare a statement of such aviation fuel deliveries and shall mail or deliver the same, together with a check covering the total amount of the fee imposed under 12.30.010 to the airport manager director. All checks shall be made payable to Eau Claire County.

B. Every person or organization receiving aviation fuel shall monthly submit to the airport manager director a list of all aviation fuel delivered to them and shall keep a record of all fuel invoices in their office, available for inspection by the commission.

Qualifications for Groundwater Advisory Committee

- ~ For the past five years I have studied the DNR listing of high capacity well applications to determine where they are being drilled, the usage amount of water, and the purpose of the well. I particularly note the wells being used for industry compared to wells for irrigation. I pass what I learn on to several other groups/citizens. During the process of studying the high capacity wells, I've contacted the DNR numerous times to clarify information on applications.
- \sim In conjunction with my efforts to look at the proliferation and use of water from high capacity wells, I wrote a brochure for Save the Hills Alliance on such wells and water use in the state.
- ~ My interest in surface and ground water led me to apply for the Land Conservation Committee citizen's position. I have completed two years and plan to continue participation. That led me to the issues of surface water contamination, knowledge of government programs, relationship of farms practices to water contamination (both surface and underground), and watershed programs.
- \sim I faithfully attend meetings given by the USGS to remain updated on the Chippewa county study of the effects of water use by agriculture and sand mining on surface and groundwater.
- ~ For the past few years I have attended the meetings of the Groundwater Advisory Committee as a public citizen to grow my knowledge of waters on the local level.
- \sim As often as possible I try to attend the Highway Committee meetings, Parks and Forests Committee meetings, and Planning and Development meetings. My goal is to get a good feel of how county government operates, how it is structured, and laws (both county and state) that affect county governance.
- ~ Due to the numerous attempts to deregulate water in Wisconsin, I have written repeated letters to the governor and legislature in an attempt to preserve protections for our waters. That necessitates constantly keeping up with hearings and legislation coming out of Madison.
- ~ What began as documentation for the water use related to high capacity wells has snowballed. The more I've learned about water the more questions I have and the desire to learn more simply increases. I view participating in the Water Advisory Committee as a chance to contribute and also a chance to learn.
