Colleen Bates, Chair, called the meeting to order at 5:01 p.m. Welcome and introduction of new Human Services Board member Kim Cronk, replacing Stephannie Regenauer. Kim will be officially sworn in at the County Board meeting on September 20 and is attending tonight's meeting as a guest.

Approval of the September 19, 2016 Meeting agenda — David Mortimer made a motion to approve today's agenda. Second by Rick Kayser. Colleen suggested we move agenda item #8 up on the agenda as we may have quorum concerns by the end of the meeting. This was acceptable to the Board. The motion carried unanimously and the agenda for today was approved.

Review/Approval of July 25, August 1 and August 15, 2016 Human Services Board meeting minutes — Mark Olson made a motion to approve all the Human Services Board meeting minutes as sent. Second by Paul Maulucci. The meeting minutes were approved unanimously.

<u>Approval of Advisory Committee appointment</u> – Diane reviewed the application with the Board members and recommended Christina Hehli be appointed to the Birth to Three and Family Support/CCOP Program Advisory Committee. David Mortimer made a motion to appoint Christina Hehli to the said Advisory Committees. Second by Dianne Robertson. The motion carried unanimously.

<u>Public Input</u> - Per Board operating procedures, a period of public input was held. No one was present for public input. Dianne Robertson made a motion to close the public input session. Second by Paul Maulucci. The motion carried unanimously and the Public Input session was closed.

<u>Children's Community Options, Birth to Three and Family Support Update</u> – Bill Stein, Social Work Manager, was present at the meeting to give an update on the above listed programs. When the state approves the meeting guidelines for the Children's Community Options Program, Bill will share with the Board.

<u>Update on Community Activities</u> – Tom reported on two upcoming community activities:

- Poverty Summit Kick off on Oct 6, doors open at 6 at Grace Lutheran Church at 202 W. Grand Avenue. There will be a series of sessions running through March 9, 2017.
- Children's Mental Health Summit Tom distributed the proposed agenda for the Spotlight on Children & Adolescents on November 9 at 8:30-4 at the Florian Gardens.

Discussion continued about the new hospital being built by Marshfield Clinic. Let's write them a letter of support encouraging them to build a mental health component to the new hospital.

Also discussion about the *Wellness Shack* needing a larger new facility. Community meeting being planned.

Nick Smiar arrived at 5:50 p.m.

Review of June & July 2016 Financial Statements including the Alternate Care report -

Tammy Stelter was present at the meeting and reported on the 2016 fiscal reports. What are we doing to reduce out of home placements? Tom reported we are trying with some success a new "Strengthening Families" program at DHS. We contract with 3 part time Lutheran Social Services workers to run this program.

- WIMCR (Wisconsin Medicaid Cost Reporting) update Tammy and Diane received a letter from the state last week. They will share the letter via email highlighting the budgeting process for settlement of this funding.
- Develop talking points for County Board members if they get questions about the 2017 DHS budget.

<u>Director's Report</u> by Diane Cable

<u>2017 Budget Update</u> – Administration and Finance continue to be supportive of changes at DHS to include a behavioral health unit within the Department.

<u>Legislative Update</u> – DHS partnering with CJCC on the Stepping Up Initiative

<u>Update on Comprehensive Community Services (CCS)</u> – New staff hired on September 12 with 49 referrals and 15 active cases.

<u>ALICE Report</u> – This report was developed by United Way and highlights areas of Eau Claire County's economic condition.

<u>Status of child abuse cases</u> – As of 8/31/16 Eau Claire County had 297 cases of child abuse; referrals to CPS are at 900. Staff also track drug related cases.

<u>Juvenile Court Intake (JCI) Integration</u> – Diane and Rob continue to meet with the judges about the integration of DHS and JCI in 2017 for implementation by 2018.

<u>Fiscal Services Manager update</u> – Diane reported she should be able to a make a hiring announcement by the next DHS Bd. meeting.

<u>Personnel Update</u> – Jackie reported on the current vacancies for the department.
