# Treatmentedone

Treatment courts serve as a sentencing alternative that seeks to divert individuals with substance use and/or mental health disorders from prison and/or reduce jail time by providing structure, accountability and treatment in a community setting. The program specifically works to address those factors that contribute to criminal behavior in order to reduce the likelihood of future justice system involvement. Eau Claire County operates four different treatment courts: Drug Court, Alternatives to Incarcerating Mothers (AIM) Court, Mental Health Court and the Chippewa Valley Veterans Treatment Court. Along with reducing recidivism, the courts promote long-term recovery and help keep family units intact, thereby positively impacting local behavioral health and family services systems.
