Chairman Henning called the meeting to order at 6:16 a.m.

Motion: Vice Chairman Chilson moved for approval. Motion Approved 5-0

4. Public comment - No public comment

5. Presentation by CORRE Engineering on CTH HH bridge design

Kevin Meter and Randy Anderson of CORRE Inc. spoke on the CTH HH bridge design that is scheduled to be built next summer. This bridge is county funded. The bridge will included a box girder bridge design. Plans are moving forward and design approval anticipated in March 2018. Bridge will take approximately 6-8 weeks to complete with road closure. Public meeting will be held concerning the bridge and its design. Eau Claire County currently is planning on 6 new bridges in the next 5 years. Along with these new bridges, the highway department is developing a maintenance program to prolong the life of new and existing bridges.

6. AB 475 and SB 386 - Discussion/Action

Commissioner Johnson discussed both AB 475 and SB 386 which requires rear amber strobe lights on horse drawn vehicles after dark and during inclement weather for safety concerns.

 Motion by Supervisor Clark for letter of support toward legislation and county board in support of AB 475 and SB 386 with suggestion of amendment toward lighting being used 24 hours a day instead of just during dark and inclement weather. Motion carried 5-0

7. Presentation on PASER rating

Engineer Rod Thorson spoke on the history of PASER development and pavement management 101. Handout concerning pavement management contained items related to:

- State Stature 86.302
- PASER (Pavement Surface Evaluation & Rating)
- PCI (Pavement Condition Index)
- WISLR (Wisconsin Information system for Local Roads)
- Field inspections and office analyses

The PASER rating occurs every 2 years for all 420 miles of Eau Claire County highways. From this data, engineering works with the highway commissioner to develop future planning, road construction, and maintenance.

- SUPPORTING PROPOSED LEGISLATION AB 475 AND SB 386 CHANGING LIGHTING REQUIREMENTS FOR ANIMAL-DRAWN VEHICLES OPERATED ON HIGHWAYS -

WHEREAS, under current law, a vehicle drawn by an animal operating during hours of darkness requires at least one front lamp or lantern white light visible from a distance of 500 feet and two rear lamps or lanterns red light visible from a distance of 500 feet; and

WHEREAS, recent fatalities and accidents on highways in Wisconsin by animal drawn vehicles are happening due to visibility related issues; and

WHEREAS, SB 585 amends Wis. Stat. § 347.24(2) to include lighting requirements during inclement weather, as well as striking the use of lamps or lanterns, requiring lights, and requiring strobe lighting on the rear of animal drawn vehicles.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors hereby supports Assembly Bill 475 and Senate Bill 386 changing lighting requirements for animal-drawn vehicles operated on highways.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors directs the county clerk to forward this resolution to the governor, assembly members and senators representing Eau Claire County and the Wisconsin Counties Association.

Dear Members of the Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety,

In Eau Claire County we are currently experiencing accelerated wear as well as damage to highway maintenance and improvement projects. In the attached pictures you can see the damage that is happening due to excessive traction methods being use by animal drawn vehicles.

In the attached pictures you'll see County Highway D and County Highway AF. The County Highway D project is the same maintenance project that was completed on County Highway AF. From the pictures you can see the difference in damage to a highway that are caused by animal drawn vehicles. The maintenance cost to sealcoat one mile of rural county highway is \$17,000.00. The cost to re-apply a fog seal of oil is \$3,500.00 per mile.


For the County Highway CF project the new asphalt surface has been damaged to the point where 70% of the asphalt surface is damaged. The surface condition is one of the most important factors of highway longevity. The cost to replace the asphalt pavement on this county highway is \$185,000.00 per mile.










07/26/2016 County Highway CF - Eau Claire County; New Construction 2016 - Damage to Asphalt Surface
