- SUPPORTING CONTINUED FUNDING OF THE ESSENTIAL AIR SERVICE (EAS) PROGRAM -

WHEREAS, President Trump's FY18 Budget eliminates funding for the Essential Air Service (EAS) program which provides funding for airline service to the Chippewa Valley; and

WHEREAS, EAS is a federal program enacted to guarantee air service to small communities in the U.S., served by certificated airlines prior to airline deregulation to maintain a minimal level of scheduled air service that otherwise would not be profitable; and

WHEREAS, the EAS program provides access to the national air transportation system in 173 communities in 36 states; and

WHEREAS, approximately 30% of the airports in the United States receiving airline service are getting the service under the EAS program; and

WHEREAS, the EAS program is user fee funded with a portion of the funds coming from aviation overflight fees and the remaining funds coming from the Aviation Trust Fund which is funded through aviation user fees; and

WHEREAS, access to the national transportation system for scheduled air service through the Chippewa Valley Regional Airport is essential for attracting and maintaining businesses to the Chippewa Valley.

WHEREAS, currently The Chippewa Valley Regional Airport has daily scheduled airline service to Chicago; and

WHEREAS, the Chippewa Valley Regional Airport served 43,578 total passengers in 2016; and

WHEREAS, loss of scheduled air service will negatively impact the ability of the Chippewa Valley Regional Airport to support private and business aircraft operations since the amount of user fee funded capital improvements the airport receives is tied to the number of passenger enplanements; and

WHEREAS, if Chippewa Valley Regional Airport drops below 10,000 passengers per year the Federal Aviation Administration funding for airport capital improvements will drop from \$1 million per year to \$150,000 per year; and

WHEREAS, air passengers utilizing the Chippewa Valley Regional Airport in 2014 spent \$4.3 million and supported 70 additional jobs in the Chippewa Valley, with a payroll of \$1.3 million; and

WHEREAS, the direct effect of the airport on the Chippewa Valley economy in 2014 totaled 157 employees, a payroll of \$7.8 million and \$41.6 million in economic output.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors that it supports continued funding for the EAS program.

WHEREAS, the license for the State of Wisconsin for the year commencing with January 1, 2017 and with the City of Eau Claire with the year commencing July 1, 2017, should be procured for the purpose of facilitating operation of the Airport Restaurant and Lounge.

Stats. § 125.51(5)(b) 2., the county concessionaire, Hangar 54 Grill, LLC d/b/a Hangar 54 Grill is hereby directed to make an application to the City of Eau Claire for a "Class B" Fermented Malt Beverages License commencing July 1, 2017 and to the State of Wisconsin for a "Class B" Intoxicating Liquor License commencing January 1 2017 for use at the Chippewa Valley Regional Airport.

- SUPPORTING RETENTION AND EXPANSION OF WISCONSIN'S AGING AND DISABILITY RESOURCE CENTERS' DEMENTIA CARE SPECIALIST PROGRAM AND PROMOTING THE WORK OF THE DEMENTIA COALITION IN EAU CLAIRE COUNTY-

WHEREAS, in Wisconsin, it is estimated that 115,000 individuals age 65 and older are living with some form of clinically diagnosable dementia, and by 2040 that population is expected to grow to 240,000; and

WHEREAS, in Eau Claire County, it is estimated that over 2,000 individuals are living with some form of clinically diagnosable dementia, and the care and treatment of persons with dementia is now being described as a public health emergency; and

WHEREAS, 90% of people with dementia live in their home and 22% live alone; a diagnosis of dementia doesn't mean a person has to lose their dignity or their ability to remain in their home and part of the community; and

WHEREAS, Eau Claire County has made a significant commitment to persons with dementia through the critical work of the Aging and Disability Research Center's (ADRC's) Dementia Care Specialist (DCS), and through the work of the Dementia Coalition, which includes the Purple Angel Program (Business Training Program), and Memory Cafés; and

WHEREAS, the DCS and Dementia Coalition strive to improve the quality of life for all those affected, including people living with memory loss and their caregivers, while helping them to remain in the community where they want to live and cost-savings to taxpayers can be realized and

WHEREAS, each day that an individual remains in the community, and outside of expensive publicly funded

institutional care facilities, saves the taxpayers an estimated \$161 per day or \$58,925 annually, making the DCS program a wise and sound investment of public dollars.

WHEREAS, the ADRC of Eau Claire County has experienced a steady growth in contacts by customers, caregivers and professionals (there were 17,271 contacts in 2016); and

WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin Department of Health Services' proposed budget does not include funding for the DCS positions in 2017-2019, thereby removing this valuable expertise and coalition support from the community.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors respectfully requests that these critical programs and services be consistently available in Eau Claire County and around the State of Wisconsin by having the state add Dementia Care Specialists funding to ADRC base allocations in the next proposed 2017-2019 biennial state budget.

- SUPPORT FOR REINSTATING THE FORESTATION STATE TAX-

WHEREAS, the Forestation State Tax (mill tax) was enacted in the 1930's for the purpose of acquiring, preserving and developing the forests of the state and has served as a segregated funding source for the Department of Natural Resources Division of Forestry and for grants and assistance to county forests and other programs that support, enhance and protect forest management, forest health and the timber industry; and

WHEREAS, the Mill Tax has served to support the state's \$24 billion forest products industry and helped support the state's \$20 billion tourism industry; and

WHEREAS, the 2017-2019 Wisconsin State Budget proposal includes a provision to eliminate the Mill Tax and replace this forestry funding source with state General Purpose Revenues; and

WHEREAS, it will likely be difficult to fully fund necessary forestry programs in the future when competing against transportation, education, health care, and other programs for limited General Purpose Revenue funds.

WHEREAS, a stable source of funding is necessary for maintaining our public lands in Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, an adequate fire program is critical for protecting Wisconsin's forests; and

WHEREAS, the forestry account funds a significant portion of Wisconsin's Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program debt; and

WHEREAS, the forestry account funds a significant portion of Wisconsin's Payment In Lieu of Tax on state owned lands purchased under the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin County Forests have relied on forestry funding to meet the state's statutory obligation to "compensate counties for the public uses, benefits and privileges these lands provide; all in a manner which will provide a reasonable revenue to the towns in which such lands lie."

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors supports reinstating the Forestation State Tax but at a level more appropriate to funding Wisconsin's core forestry services as identified in Wis. Stat. § 70.58 (1).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors would support alternatives to the mill tax that are a segregated, permanent revenue source to help fund Wisconsin's vitally important forestry and timber industries and directs the county clerk to forward this resolution to the governor, assembly members and senators representing Eau Claire County and the Wisconsin Counties Association.

WITHDRAWAL OF APPROXIMATELY 36 ACRES (MORE OR LESS) FROM COUNTY FOREST LAW; DIRECTING THE PARKS AND FOREST DIRECTOR TO MAKE APPLICATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES FOR WITHDRAWAL OF SAID COUNTY LAND FROM THE COUNTY FOREST LAW

WHEREAS, under Article VIII. A. of the 2013 dredge spoils site agreement between Eau Claire County and the Lake Eau Claire Protection Rehabilitation District "Lake District" the county proposes to withdraw Site 5 consisting of approximately 36 acres (more or less),; and

WHEREAS, the land withdrawn is described as:

Parcel of land located in the Southwest ¼ (SW ¼) of the Southwest ¼ (SW ¼), Section 6, Township 26 North, Range 5 West and the Northwest ¼ (NW ¼) of the Northwest ¼ (NW ¼,) Section 7, Township 26 North, Range 5 West described as follows:

Commencing at the Southwest corner of said Southwest ¼ (SW ¼); thence East along the south line of said Southwest ¼ (SW ¼) of the Southwest ¼ (SW ¼) a distance of 133 feet to the point of beginning; thence North parallel to the East right of way line of County Highway "G" 1320 feet more or less to the North line of Southwest ¼ (SW ¼) of the Southwest ¼ (SW ¼); thence East along the North line of said Southwest ¼ (SW ¼) of the Southwest ¼ (SW ¼) a distance of 973 feet more or less to the centerline of a driveway/trail; thence South parallel with said East right of way line a distance of 1614 feet; thence West along a line parallel to the South line of said Southwest ¼ (SW ¼) of the Southwest ¼ (SW ¼) a distance of 973 feet; thence North parallel to the said East right of way line 294 feet to the point of beginning. Containing 36 acres more or less. This parcel is surrounded by county forest; and

WHEREAS, unless the land is withdrawn any dredge deposits can only be used for public works purposes; and

WHEREAS, withdrawal will allow the district to enter into an agreement to use the dredge spoils as reclamation material; and

WHEREAS, the thirty-six acre (more or less) site will allow continued use for future dredge spoils for approximately 25 years; and

WHEREAS, any proceeds gained from the sale of forest products or spoils shall be deposited into the non-lapsing Forest Land Acquisition account; and

WHEREAS, the committee on parks and forest recommends sufficient funds be allocated in 2018 to purchase a replacement parcel for the withdrawn area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors that it hereby approves withdrawal of the parcel consisting of approximately 36 acres (more or less) from the county forest law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Parks & Forest Director is hereby directed to make application to the Department of Natural Resources for withdrawal of said county land from the County Forest Law.

SUPPORTING CREATION OF A NONPARTISAN PROCEDURE FOR THE PREPARATION OF LEGISLATIVE AND CONGRESSIONAL REDISTRICTING PLANS

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article VI, Section 3 of the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Legislature is directed to redistrict state legislative districts "according to the number of inhabitants" at its next session following the decennial federal census. The legislature also reapportions congressional districts at the same interval pursuant to federal law; and

WHEREAS, because state and federal legislative redistricting is controlled by the majority party at the time of the redistricting, legislative and congressional plans in Wisconsin have been subject to partisan influence that puts the desires of politicians ahead of the electoral prerogative of the people. Redistricting to achieve partisan gains is improper, whether it is done by Republicans or Democrats; and

WHEREAS, a panel of federal district court judges has ruled that the redistricting done in Wisconsin in 2011 was unconstitutional. Legal costs in defense of the 2011 redistricting has al- ready cost taxpayers in excess of \$2.1 million, with the litigation still ongoing; and

WHEREAS, the state and congressional districts belong to the citizens of Wisconsin and not to any legislator, interest group or political party. The redistricting process should not be a tool used by those in power to protect and bolster their power, but should be designed with the best interest of Wisconsin's democracy and its citizens; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin's historical practice of redistricting by the majority party in each legislative chamber is an outdated practice that stifles political competition, discourages compromise, ensures continued control by the party in power, and lacks the transparency necessary to reinforce citizens' faith in the democratic process; and

WHEREAS, there is a critical need at this time to restore trust, compromise and fair com- petition to Wisconsin politics;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors calls upon the State Legislature, before the start of the next redistricting process following the 2020 federal census, to pass legislation that creates a fair, nonpartisan procedure for the preparation of legislative and congressional redistricting plans, that promotes more accountability and transparency, prohibits the consideration of voting patterns, party information, and incumbents' residence information or demographic information in drawing the maps, except as necessary to ensure minority participation as required by the U.S. Constitution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors advocates for an amendment to the Wisconsin Constitution giving the responsibility of legislative redistricting to a nonpartisan commission; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Clerk is directed to send a copy of this resolution to the Governor of the State of Wisconsin, assembly members and senators representing Eau Claire County and the Wisconsin Counties Association.

SECURING STATE FUNDING TO SUPPORT COMMUNICABLE DISEASE CONTROL FOR POPULATION HEALTH

WHEREAS, Wisconsin has no dedicated, stable federal and state funding sources for communicable disease control and prevention; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin statutes and administrative rules designate required communicable disease prevention and control work; and

WHEREAS, Eau Claire County had over 900 reportable communicable disease cases in 2015 as compared to just over 500 in 2007; and

WHEREAS, a strong local public health infrastructure that responds to and controls communicable disease issues, but also prevents them is paramount to the health of all citizens; and

WHEREAS, emerging and communicable diseases threaten health security, economics, and quality of life for all; and

WHEREAS, communicable diseases such as Ebola, H1N1, measles, HIV and AIDS, tuberculosis, influenza, syphilis, gonorrhea, rabies, hepatitis, polio, and pertussis, can threaten the lives and well-being of Wisconsin residents; and

WHEREAS, emerging and re-emerging threats such as Ebola, H1N1, SARS and measles threaten personal and community safety and require substantial resources to contain; and

WHEREAS, blood borne pathogens that cause long-term diseases such as hepatitis C are occurring at unprecedented rates—rates that are accelerating as a result of the opiate epidemic; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin local health department communicable disease programs protect residents by investigating and controlling communicable diseases collecting data, educating the community about prevention and the importance of immunizations, and caring for those affected by these diseases; and

INITIAL RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE BORROWING OF NOT TO EXCEED \$9,750,000; AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION PROMISSORY NOTES THEREFOR

WHEREAS, the County Board of Supervisors of Eau Claire County, Wisconsin (the "County") hereby finds and determines that it is necessary, desirable and in the best interest of the County to raise funds for the public purpose of paying the cost of 2017 capital projects and highway improvements (collectively, the "Project"), and there are insufficient funds on hand to pay said costs;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of Supervisors of the County that:

Section 1. Authorization of the Notes. For the purpose of paying costs of the Project, there shall be borrowed, through the issuance of general obligation promissory notes pursuant to Section 67.12(12) of the Wisconsin Statutes, a principal sum not to exceed NINE MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$9,750,000) (the "Notes").

<u>Section 2. Sale of the Notes</u>. The County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes and directs that the Notes be offered for public sale. At a subsequent meeting, the County Board of Supervisors shall consider such bids for the Notes as may have been received and take action thereon.

Section 3. Notice of Sale. The County Clerk, in consultation with the County's financial advisor, Ehlers & Associates, Inc. ("Ehlers"), is hereby authorized and directed to cause the sale of the Notes to be publicized at such times and in such manner as the County Clerk may determine and to cause copies of a complete, official Notice of Sale and other pertinent data to be forwarded to interested bidders as the County Clerk may determine.

Section 4. Official Statement. The County Clerk shall cause an Official Statement concerning this issue to be prepared by Ehlers. The appropriate County officials shall determine when the Official Statement is final for purposes of Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12 and shall certify said Statement, such certification to constitute full authorization of such Statement under this resolution.

RESOLUTION AWARDING THE SALE OF \$9,750,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION PROMISSORY NOTES, SERIES 2017A

WHEREAS, on September 19, 2017 by a 3/4 vote, the County Board of Supervisors of Eau Claire County, Wisconsin (the "County") adopted an initial resolution authorizing the issuance of general obligation promissory notes (the "Notes") in an amount not to exceed \$9,750,000 for the purpose of paying the cost of 2017 capital projects and highway improvements (collectively, the "Project") (the above-referenced initial resolution is referred to herein as the "Initial Resolution");

WHEREAS, the County Board of Supervisors hereby finds and determines that the Project is within the County's power to undertake and therefore serves a "public purpose" as that term is defined in Section 67.04(1)(b), Wisconsin Statutes;

WHEREAS, the County is authorized by the provisions of Section 67.12(12), Wisconsin Statutes, to borrow money and issue general obligation promissory notes for such public purposes;

WHEREAS, none of the proceeds of the Notes shall be used to fund the operating expenses of the general fund of the County or to fund the operating expenses of any special revenue fund of the County that is supported by the property taxes;

WHEREAS, the County has directed Ehlers & Associates, Inc. ("Ehlers") to take the steps necessary to sell the Notes to pay the cost of the Project;

WHEREAS, Ehlers, in consultation with the officials of the County, prepared a Notice of Sale (a copy of which is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u> and incorporated herein by this reference) setting forth the details of and the bid requirements for the Notes and indicating that the Notes would be offered for public sale on October 3, 2017;

WHEREAS, the County Clerk (in consultation with Ehlers) caused a form of notice of the sale to be published and/or announced and caused the Notice of Sale to be distributed to potential bidders offering the Notes for public sale on October 3, 2017;

WHEREAS, the County has duly received bids for the Notes as described on the Bid Tabulation attached hereto as Exhibit B and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Bid Tabulation"); and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the bid proposal (the "Proposal") submitted by the financial institution listed first on the Bid Tabulation fully complies with the bid requirements set forth in the Notice of Sale and is deemed to be the most advantageous to the County. Ehlers has recommended that the County accept the Proposal. A copy of said Proposal submitted by such institution (the "Purchaser") is attached hereto as Exhibit C and incorporated herein by this reference.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of Supervisors of the County that:

Section 1. Ratification of the Notice of Sale and Offering Materials. The County Board of Supervisors of the County hereby ratifies and approves the details of the Notes set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto as and for the details of the Notes. The Notice of Sale and any other offering materials prepared and circulated by Ehlers are hereby ratified and approved in all respects. All actions taken by officers of the County and Ehlers in connection with the preparation and distribution of the Notice of Sale, and any other offering materials are hereby ratified and approved in all respects.

Section 1A. Award of the Notes. For the purpose of paying the cost of the Project, there shall be borrowed pursuant to Section 67.12(12), Wisconsin Statutes, the principal sum of NINE MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$9,750,000) from the Purchaser in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Proposal. The Proposal of the Purchaser offering to purchase the Notes for the sum set forth on the Proposal, plus accrued interest to the date of delivery, resulting in a true interest cost as set forth on the Proposal is hereby

accepted. The Chairperson and County Clerk or other appropriate officers of the County are authorized and directed to execute an acceptance of the Proposal on behalf of the County. The good faith deposit of the Purchaser shall be retained by the County Treasurer and applied in accordance with the Notice of Sale, and any good faith deposits submitted by unsuccessful bidders shall be promptly returned. The Notes shall bear interest at the rates set forth on the Proposal.

Section 2. Terms of the Notes. The Notes shall be designated "General Obligation Promissory Notes, Series 2017A"; shall be issued in the aggregate principal amount of \$9,750,000; shall be dated October 24, 2017; shall be in the denomination of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof; shall be numbered R-1 and upward; and shall bear interest at the rates per annum and mature on September 1 of each year, in the years and principal amounts as set forth on the Pricing Summary attached hereto as Exhibit D-1 and incorporated herein by this reference. Interest shall be payable semi-annually on March 1 and September 1 of each year commencing on September 1, 2018. Interest shall be computed upon the basis of a 360-day year of twelve 30-day months and will be rounded pursuant to the rules of the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board. The schedule of principal and interest payments due on the Notes is set forth on the Debt Service Schedule attached hereto as Exhibit D-2 and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Schedule").

Section 3. Redemption Provisions. The Notes maturing on September 1, 2025 and thereafter are subject to redemption prior to maturity, at the option of the Issuer, on September 1, 2024 or on any date thereafter. Said Notes are redeemable as a whole or in part, and if in part, from maturities selected by the Issuer, and within each maturity by lot, at the principal amount thereof, plus accrued interest to the date of redemption.

<u>Section 4. Form of the Notes</u>. The Notes shall be issued in registered form and shall be executed and delivered in substantially the form attached hereto as <u>Exhibit E</u> and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 5. Tax Provisions.

(A) Direct Annual Irrepealable Tax Levy. For the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the Notes as the same becomes due, the full faith, credit and resources of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged, and there is hereby levied upon all of the taxable property of the County a direct annual irrepealable tax in the years 2017 through 2026 for payments due in the years 2018 through 2027 in the amounts set forth on the Schedule.

(B) Tax Collection. So long as any part of the principal of or interest on the Notes remains unpaid, the County shall be and continue without power to repeal such levy or obstruct the collection of said tax until all such payments have been made or provided for. After the issuance of the Notes, said tax shall be, from year to year, carried onto the tax roll of the County and collected in addition to all other taxes and in the same manner and at the same time as other taxes of the County for said years are collected, except that the amount of tax carried onto the tax roll may be reduced in any year by the amount of any surplus money in the Debt Service Fund Account created below.

(C) Additional Funds. If at any time there shall be on hand insufficient funds from the aforesaid tax levy to meet principal and/or interest payments on said Notes when due, the requisite amounts shall be paid from other funds of the County then available, which sums shall be replaced upon the collection of the taxes herein levied.

Section 6. Segregated Debt Service Fund Account.

(A) Creation and Deposits. There be and there hereby is established in the treasury of the County, if one has not already been created, a debt service fund, separate and distinct from every other fund, which shall be maintained in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Debt service or sinking funds established for obligations previously issued by the County may be considered as separate and distinct accounts within the debt service fund.

Within the debt service fund, there hereby is established a separate and distinct account designated as the "Debt Service Fund Account for \$9,750,000 General Obligation Promissory Notes, Series 2017A" (the "Debt Service Fund Account") and such account shall be maintained until the indebtedness evidenced by the Notes is fully paid or otherwise extinguished. The County Treasurer shall deposit in the Debt Service Fund Account (i) all accrued

interest received by the County at the time of delivery of and payment for the Notes; (ii) any premium which may be received by the County above the par value of the Notes and accrued interest thereon; (iii) all money raised by the taxes herein levied and any amounts appropriated for the specific purpose of meeting principal of and interest on the Notes when due; (iv) such other sums as may be necessary at any time to pay principal of and interest on the Notes when due; (v) surplus monies in the Borrowed Money Fund as specified below; and (vi) such further deposits as may be required by Section 67.11, Wisconsin Statutes.

(B) Use and Investment. No money shall be withdrawn from the Debt Service Fund Account and appropriated for any purpose other than the payment of principal of and interest on the Notes until all such principal and interest has been paid in full and the Notes canceled; provided (i) the funds to provide for each payment of principal of and interest on the Notes prior to the scheduled receipt of taxes from the next succeeding tax collection may be invested in direct obligations of the United States of America maturing in time to make such payments when they are due or in other investments permitted by law; and (ii) any funds over and above the amount of such principal and interest payments on the Notes may be used to reduce the next succeeding tax levy, or may, at the option of the County, be invested by purchasing the Notes as permitted by and subject to Section 67.11(2)(a), Wisconsin Statutes, or in permitted municipal investments under the pertinent provisions of the Wisconsin Statutes ("Permitted Investments"), which investments shall continue to be a part of the Debt Service Fund Account. Any investment of the Debt Service Fund Account shall at all times conform with the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and any applicable Treasury Regulations (the "Regulations").

(C) Remaining Monies. When all of the Notes have been paid in full and canceled, and all Permitted Investments disposed of, any money remaining in the Debt Service Fund Account shall be transferred and deposited in the general fund of the County, unless the County Board of Supervisors directs otherwise.

Section 7. Proceeds of the Notes; Segregated Borrowed Money Fund. The proceeds of the Notes (the "Note Proceeds") (other than any premium and accrued interest which must be paid at the time of the delivery of the Notes into the Debt Service Fund Account created above) shall be deposited into a special fund separate and distinct from all other funds of the County and disbursed solely for the purpose or purposes for which borrowed or for the payment of the principal of and the interest on the Notes. In no event shall monies in the Borrowed Money Fund be used to fund operating expenses of the general fund of the County or of any special revenue fund of the County that is supported by property taxes. Monies in the Borrowed Money Fund may be temporarily invested in Permitted Investments. Any monies, including any income from Permitted Investments, remaining in the Borrowed Money Fund after the purpose or purposes for which the Notes have been issued have been accomplished, and, at any time, any monies as are not needed and which obviously thereafter cannot be needed for such purpose(s) shall be deposited in the Debt Service Fund Account.

Section 8. No Arbitrage. All investments made pursuant to this Resolution shall be Permitted Investments, but no such investment shall be made in such a manner as would cause the Notes to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Section 148 of the Code or the Regulations and an officer of the County, charged with the responsibility for issuing the Notes, shall certify as to facts, estimates, circumstances and reasonable expectations in existence on the date of delivery of the Notes to the Purchaser which will permit the conclusion that the Notes are not "arbitrage bonds," within the meaning of the Code or Regulations.

Section 9. Compliance with Federal Tax Laws. (a) The County represents and covenants that the projects financed by the Notes and the ownership, management and use of the projects will not cause the Notes to be "private activity bonds" within the meaning of Section 141 of the Code. The County further covenants that it shall comply with the provisions of the Code to the extent necessary to maintain the tax-exempt status of the interest on the Notes including, if applicable, the rebate requirements of Section 148(f) of the Code. The County further covenants that it will not take any action, omit to take any action or permit the taking or omission of any action within its control (including, without limitation, making or permitting any use of the proceeds of the Notes) if taking, permitting or omitting to take such action would cause any of the Notes to be an arbitrage bond or a private activity bond within the meaning of the Code or would otherwise cause interest on the Notes to be included in the gross income of the recipients thereof for federal income tax purposes. The County Clerk or other officer of the County charged with the responsibility of issuing the Notes shall provide an appropriate certificate of the County certifying that the County can and covenanting that it will comply with the provisions of the Code and Regulations.

(b) The County also covenants to use its best efforts to meet the requirements and restrictions of any

different or additional federal legislation which may be made applicable to the Notes provided that in meeting such requirements the County will do so only to the extent consistent with the proceedings authorizing the Notes and the laws of the State of Wisconsin and to the extent that there is a reasonable period of time in which to comply.

Section 10. Designation as Qualified Tax-Exempt Obligations. The Notes are hereby designated as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" for purposes of Section 265 of the Code, relating to the ability of financial institutions to deduct from income for federal income tax purposes, interest expense that is allocable to carrying and acquiring tax-exempt obligations.

Section 11. Execution of the Notes; Closing; Professional Services. The Notes shall be issued in printed form, executed on behalf of the County by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Chairperson and County Clerk, authenticated, if required, by the Fiscal Agent (defined below), sealed with its official or corporate seal, if any, or a facsimile thereof, and delivered to the Purchaser upon payment to the County of the purchase price thereof, plus accrued interest to the date of delivery (the "Closing"). The facsimile signature of either of the officers executing the Notes may be imprinted on the Notes in lieu of the manual signature of the officer but, unless the County has contracted with a fiscal agent to authenticate the Notes, at least one of the signatures appearing on each Note shall be a manual signature. In the event that either of the officers whose signatures appear on the Notes shall cease to be such officers before the Closing, such signatures shall, nevertheless, be valid and sufficient for all purposes to the same extent as if they had remained in office until the Closing. The aforesaid officers are hereby authorized and directed to do all acts and execute and deliver the Notes and all such documents, certificates and acknowledgements as may be necessary and convenient to effectuate the Closing. The County hereby authorizes the officers and agents of the County to enter into, on its behalf, agreements and contracts in conjunction with the Notes, including but not limited to agreements and contracts for legal, trust, fiscal agency, disclosure and continuing disclosure, and rebate calculation services. Any such contract heretofore entered into in conjunction with the issuance of the Notes is hereby ratified and approved in all respects.

<u>Section 12. Payment of the Notes; Fiscal Agent.</u> The principal of and interest on the Notes shall be paid by the County Clerk or County Treasurer (the "Fiscal Agent").

Section 13. Persons Treated as Owners; Transfer of Notes. The County shall cause books for the registration and for the transfer of the Notes to be kept by the Fiscal Agent. The person in whose name any Note shall be registered shall be deemed and regarded as the absolute owner thereof for all purposes and payment of either principal or interest on any Note shall be made only to the registered owner thereof. All such payments shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and discharge the liability upon such Note to the extent of the sum or sums so paid.

Any Note may be transferred by the registered owner thereof by surrender of the Note at the office of the Fiscal Agent, duly endorsed for the transfer or accompanied by an assignment duly executed by the registered owner or his attorney duly authorized in writing. Upon such transfer, the Chairperson and County Clerk shall execute and deliver in the name of the transferee or transferees a new Note or Notes of a like aggregate principal amount, series and maturity and the Fiscal Agent shall record the name of each transferee in the registration book. No registration shall be made to bearer. The Fiscal Agent shall cancel any Note surrendered for transfer.

The County shall cooperate in any such transfer, and the Chairperson and County Clerk are authorized to execute any new Note or Notes necessary to effect any such transfer.

Section 14. Record Date. The 15th day of the calendar month next preceding each interest payment date shall be the record date for the Notes (the "Record Date"). Payment of interest on the Notes on any interest payment date shall be made to the registered owners of the Notes as they appear on the registration book of the County at the close of business on the Record Date.

Section 15. Utilization of The Depository Trust Company Book-Entry-Only System. In order to make the Notes eligible for the services provided by The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York ("DTC"), the County agrees to the applicable provisions set forth in the Blanket Issuer Letter of Representations, which the County Clerk or other authorized representative of the County is authorized and directed to execute and deliver to DTC on behalf of the County to the extent an effective Blanket Issuer Letter of Representations is not presently on file in the County Clerk's office.

<u>Section 16. Payment of Issuance Expenses</u>. The County authorizes the Purchaser to forward the amount of the proceeds of the Notes allocable to the payment of issuance expenses to KleinBank, Chaska, Minnesota at Closing for further distribution as directed by Ehlers.

Section 17. Official Statement. The County Board of Supervisors hereby approves the Preliminary Official Statement with respect to the Notes and deems the Preliminary Official Statement as "final" as of its date for purposes of SEC Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities and Exchange Act of 1934 (the "Rule"). All actions taken by officers of the County in connection with the preparation of such Preliminary Official Statement and any addenda to it are hereby ratified and approved. In connection with the Closing, the appropriate County official shall certify the Preliminary Official Statement and any addenda. The County Clerk shall cause copies of the Preliminary Official Statement and any addenda to be distributed to the Purchaser.

Section 18. Undertaking to Provide Continuing Disclosure. The County hereby covenants and agrees, for the benefit of the owners of the Notes, to enter into a written undertaking (the "Undertaking") if required by the Rule to provide continuing disclosure of certain financial information and operating data and timely notices of the occurrence of certain events in accordance with the Rule. The Undertaking shall be enforceable by the owners of the Notes or by the Purchaser on behalf of such owners (provided that the rights of the owners and the Purchaser to enforce the Undertaking shall be limited to a right to obtain specific performance of the obligations thereunder and any failure by the County to comply with the provisions of the Undertaking shall not be an event of default with respect to the Notes).

To the extent required under the Rule, the Chairperson and County Clerk, or other officer of the County charged with the responsibility for issuing the Notes, shall provide a Continuing Disclosure Certificate for inclusion in the transcript of proceedings, setting forth the details and terms of the County's Undertaking.

Section 19. Record Book. The County Clerk shall provide and keep the transcript of proceedings as a separate record book (the "Record Book") and shall record a full and correct statement of every step or proceeding had or taken in the course of authorizing and issuing the Notes in the Record Book.

Section 20. Bond Insurance. If the Purchaser determines to obtain municipal bond insurance with respect to the Notes, the officers of the County are authorized to take all actions necessary to obtain such municipal bond insurance. The Chairperson and County Clerk are authorized to agree to such additional provisions as the bond insurer may reasonably request and which are acceptable to the Chairperson and County Clerk including provisions regarding restrictions on investment of Note proceeds, the payment procedure under the municipal bond insurance policy, the rights of the bond insurer in the event of default and payment of the Notes by the bond insurer and notices to be given to the bond insurer. In addition, any reference required by the bond insurer to the municipal bond insurance policy shall be made in the form of Note provided herein.

Section 21. Conflicting Resolutions; Severability; Effective Date. All prior resolutions, rules or other actions of the County Board of Supervisors or any parts thereof in conflict with the provisions hereof shall be, and the same are, hereby rescinded insofar as the same may so conflict. In the event that any one or more provisions hereof shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provisions hereof. The foregoing shall take effect immediately upon adoption and approval in the manner provided by law.

- APPROVING ALTERATION OF SUPERVISORY DISTRICT BOUNDARIES RESULTING FROM NEW WARDS FOR THE CITY OF EAU CLAIRE -

WHEREAS, state statutes allow the county board to consider changes in the boundaries of supervisory districts based on annexations that occur after the passage of the 10-year county redistricting plan in order to administer elections; and

WHEREAS, the City of Eau Claire has created wards 67-70 due to annexations since the Eau Claire County Resolution R155-048, File No. 11-12/079 was passed on September 20, 2011 that approved the final supervisory district plan and R159-044, File No. 11-12/063 was passed November 3, 2015 that approved alterations; and

WHEREAS, exact maps of the described parcels, along with certified copies of the City of Eau Claire ordinances, have been duly filed with the Eau Claire County Clerk; and

WHEREAS, changes in said supervisory district boundaries are allowed by law, provided that the total number of supervisory districts is left unchanged.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors that the City of Eau Claire wards 67-70 are hereby included in the supervisory districts enumerated.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Clerk is hereby directed to forward all notices required under Wis. Stat. Chapter 59 to the Secretary of State for the purpose of advising that office of said boundary changes.

- AUTHORIZING ENGAGEMENT OF VON BRIESEN & ROPER, S.C. AND CRUEGER DICKINSON LLC, TOGETHER WITH SIMMONS HANLY CONROY LLC, AS COUNSEL FOR EAU CLAIRE COUNTY IN RELATION TO CLAIMS AGAINST OPIOID MANUFACTURERS AS SET FORTH IN THE ATTACHED ENGAGEMENT LETTER: DIRECTING THE COUNTY BOARD CHAIR TO EXECUTE THE ENGAGEMENT LETTER ON BEHALF OF EAU CLAIRE COUNTY-

WHEREAS, Eau Claire County ("County") is concerned with the recent rapid rise in troubles among County citizens, residents and visitors in relation to problems arising out of the use, abuse and overuse of opioid medications, which according to certain studies impacts millions of people across the country; and

WHEREAS, issues and concerns surrounding opioid use, abuse and overuse by citizens, residents and visitors are not unique to the County and are in fact, issues and concerns shared by all other counties in Wisconsin and for that matter states and counties across the country, as has been well documented through various reports and publications and is commonly referred to as the Opioid Epidemic ("Opioid Epidemic:); and

WHEREAS, the societal costs associated with the Opioid Epidemic are staggering and, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, amount to over \$75 billion annually; and

WHEREAS, the National Institute for Health has identified the manufacturers of certain of the opioid medications as being directly responsible for the rapid rise of the Opioid Epidemic by virtue of their aggressive and, according to some, unlawful and unethical marketing practices; and

WHEREAS, certain of the opioid manufacturers have faced civil and criminal liability for their actions that relate directly to the rise of the Opioid Epidemic; and

WHEREAS, the County has spent millions in unexpected and unbudgeted time and resources in its programs and services related to the Opioid Epidemic; and

WHEREAS, the County is responsible for a multitude of programs and services, all of which require the County to expend resources generated through state and federal aid, property tax levy, fees and other permissible revenue sources; and

WHEREAS, the County's provision of programs and services becomes more and more difficult every year because the costs associated with providing the Opioid Epidemic programs and services continue to rise, yet the County's ability to generate revenue is limited by strict levy limit caps and stagnant or declining state and federal aid to the County; and

WHEREAS, all sums that the County expends in addressing, combatting and otherwise dealing with the Opioid Epidemic are sums that cannot be used for other critical programs and services that the County provides to County citizens, residents and visitors; and

WHEREAS, the County has been informed that numerous counties and states across the country have filed or intend to file lawsuits against certain of the opioid manufacturers in an effort to force the persons and entities responsible for the Opioid Epidemic to assume financial responsibility for the costs associated with addressing, combatting and otherwise dealing with the Opioid Epidemic; and

WHEREAS, the County has engaged in discussions with representatives of the law firms of Von Briesen & Roper, S.C., Crueger Dickinson LLC and Simmons Hanly Conroy LLC (the "Law Firms") related to the potential for the County to pursue certain legal claims against certain opioid manufacturers; and

WHEREAS, the County has been informed that the Law Firms have the requisite skill, experience and wherewithal to prosecute legal claims against certain of the opioid manufacturers on behalf of public entities seeking to hold them responsible for the Opioid Epidemic; and

WHEREAS, the Law Firms have proposed that County engage the Law Firms to prosecute the aforementioned claims on a contingent fee basis whereby the Law Firms would not be compensated unless County receives a financial benefit as a result of the proposed claims and the Law Firms would advance all claim-related costs and expenses associated with the claims; and

WHEREAS, all of the costs and expenses associated with the claims against certain of the opioid manufacturers would be borne by the Law Firms; and

WHEREAS, the Law Firms have prepared an engagement letter, which is submitted as part of this Resolution ("Engagement Letter") specifying the terms and conditions under which the Law Firms would provide legal services to County and otherwise consistent with the terms of this Resolution; and

WHEREAS, County is informed that the Wisconsin Counties Association has engaged in extensive discussions with the Law Firms and has expressed a desire to assist the Law Firms, County and other counties in the prosecution of claims against certain of the opioid manufacturers; and

WHEREAS, County would participate in the prosecution of the claim(s) contemplated in this Resolution and the Engagement Letter by providing information and materials to the Law Firms and, as appropriate, the Wisconsin Counties Association as needed; and

WHEREAS, County believes it to be in the best interest of County, its citizens, residents, visitors and taxpayers to join with other counties in and outside Wisconsin in pursuit of claims against certain of the opioid manufacturers, all upon the terms and conditions set forth in the Engagement Letter; and

WHEREAS, by pursuing the claims against certain of the opioid manufacturers, County is attempting to hold those persons and entities that had a significant role in the creation of the Opioid Epidemic responsible for the financial costs assumed by County and other public agencies across the country in dealing with the Opioid Epidemic.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors authorizes and agrees to be bound by the Engagement Letter and hereby directs the County Board Chair to execute the Engagement Letter on behalf of the County; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors shall endeavor to faithfully perform all actions required of County in relation to the claims contemplated herein and in the Engagement Letter and hereby directs all County personnel to cooperate with and assist the Law Firms in relation thereto.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Eau Claire County Clerk shall forward a copy of this Resolution, together with the signed Engagement Letter, to the Wisconsin Counties Association, 22 E. Mifflin Street, Suite 900, Madison, Wisconsin, 53703.

-RATIFYING A 5-YEAR AGREEMENT BETWEEN EAU CLAIRE AND CHIPPEWA COUNTIES; AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY BOARD CHAIR AND THE COUNTY CLERK TO EXECUTE THE AGREEMENT ON BEHALF OF EAU CLAIRE COUNTY-

WHEREAS, since January, 1991 the Chippewa Valley Regional Airport has been governed by an airport commission, and since 1999 costs have been shared under an Ownership and Operation Agreement, primarily funded by Eau Claire County; and

WHEREAS, the airport is vital to economic development in Chippewa and Eau Claire Counties and continued financial assistance from Chippewa County will help to maintain and improve the competitiveness and efficiency of the airport operation; and

WHEREAS, representatives of Eau Claire and Chippewa Counties have negotiated an agreement, a copy of which is attached, the major points of which are:

- 1. Term-5 years.
- 2. Annual funding and participation Eau Claire and Chippewa County will contribute base amounts equivalent to their 2018 contributions plus 1% in 2021 and then increase the base amount 1% in 2023 over the prior base amounts.
- 3. Commission membership 7 members. The Eau Claire County Board Chair shall appoint 1 county board supervisor, 3 citizen members and the Chippewa County Board Chair shall appoint 1 county board supervisor and 2 citizen members. The periods of appointment are 2 years and are staggered so that no more than 4 appointments will be made in any 1-year.
- 4. Ownership-Eau Claire County would retain ownership with an option to purchase that could be exercised by Chippewa County during the specified time period.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors that the attached "Chippewa Valley Regional Airport Ownership and Operation Agreement" for the term January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2023 is ratified.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Eau Claire County Board Chair and County Clerk are authorized to execute the agreement on behalf of Eau Claire County.

-APPROVING ALTERATION OF SUPERVISORY DISTRICT BOUNDARIES RESULTING FROM NEW WARDS FOR THE CITY OF EAU CLAIRE -

WHEREAS, state statutes allow the county board to consider changes in the boundaries of supervisory districts based on annexations that occur after the passage of the 10-year county redistricting plan in order to administer elections; and

WHEREAS, the City of Eau Claire has created wards 71-72 due to annexations since the Eau Claire County Resolution R155-048, File No. 11-12/079 was passed on September 20, 2011 that approved the final supervisory district plan and R159-044 and subsequent resolutions that approved alterations; and

WHEREAS, exact maps of the described parcels, along with certified copies of the City of Eau Claire ordinances, have been duly filed with the Eau Claire County Clerk; and

WHEREAS, changes in said supervisory district boundaries are allowed by law, provided that the total number of supervisory districts is left unchanged.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors that the City of Eau Claire wards 71-72 are hereby included in the supervisory districts enumerated.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Clerk is hereby directed to forward all notices required under Wis. Stat. Chapter 59 to the Secretary of State for the purpose of advising that office of said boundary changes.

- MOVING THE 2018 ANNUAL MEETING ON BUDGET FROM NOVEMBER 13, 2018 TO NOVEMBER 7, 2018 -

WHEREAS, section 2.04.010 C. of the county code requires the annual meeting to adopt the county budget to take place on a Tuesday after the 2nd Monday of November in each year; and

WHEREAS, in 2018 this would mean that the budget meeting would begin on November 13, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Department of Revenue requires that "Certification of the Apportionment of State and County Property Taxes and Charges" form PC-400 is due November 15, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the form PC-400 cannot be completed until after the county board adopts the county budget for 2019; and

WHEREAS, an election will be held on Tuesday, November 6, 2018, prompting the Annual Meeting to be held on Wednesday, November 7, 2018.

WHEREAS, the Lake Altoona County Park, Master Park Plan ("Plan") dated September 8, 2017 prepared by Ayres Associates was presented to the county board by the parks and forest director at the October 17, 2017 county board meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Plan is broken into three phases at a total cost of \$9,944,317 with Phase 1 costing \$2,980,307, Phase 2 costing \$4,407,861 and Phase 3 costing \$2,556,150; and

-TO REAPPLY FOR A "CLASS B" INTOXICATING LIQUOR LICENSE FOR USE IN THE RESTAURANT AND LOUNGE, CHIPPEWA VALLEY REGIONAL AIRPORT, UNDER SECTION WIS. STATS. § 125.51(5)(b) 2. -

WHEREAS, Eau Claire County is leasing its Airport Terminal Restaurant and Lounge to Hangar 54 Grill, LLC d/b/a Hangar 54 Grill; and

WHEREAS, Wis. Stats. § 125.51(5)(b) 2., provides that counties which own an airport in actual operation may, by Resolution of the Board of Supervisors, apply annually for a "Class B" Intoxicating Liquor License for use on the airport premises, which application shall be on behalf of the County's concessionaire; and

WHEREAS, the applications are to be made to the State of Wisconsin as to the "Class B" Intoxicating Liquor License and to the City of Eau Claire as to the "Class B" Fermented Malt Beverages License; and

WHEREAS, Hangar 54 Grill, LLC d/b/a Hangar 54 Grill constitutes the concessionaire for purposes of the application by Eau Claire County for the said licenses; and

WHEREAS, the license for the State of Wisconsin for the year commencing with January 1, 2018 and with the City of Eau Claire with the year commencing July 1, 2018, should be procured for the purpose of facilitating operation of the Airport Restaurant and Lounge.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors that pursuant to Wis. Stats. § 125.51(5)(b) 2., the county concessionaire, Hangar 54 Grill, LLC d/b/a Hangar 54 Grill is hereby directed to make an application to the City of Eau Claire for a "Class B" Fermented Malt Beverages License commencing July 1, 2018 and to the State of Wisconsin for a "Class B" Intoxicating Liquor License commencing January 1, 2018 for use at the Chippewa Valley Regional Airport.

-ADOPTING THE 2018 ANNUAL WORK PLAN FOR THE PARKS AND FOREST DEPARTMENT TO COMPLY WITH THE COUNTY FOREST ADMINISTRATION GRANT PROGRAM-

WHEREAS, the State and its political subdivisions may self-insure worker's compensation without a special order from the Department of Workforce Development (Department) if they agree to report faithfully all compensable injuries and agree to comply with the Act and rules of the Department (including passing a resolution to self-insure every 3 years); and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Administration at its February 13th meeting approved the continuation of the self-insured worker's compensation program, in compliance with Wisconsin Administrative Code DWD 80.60(3); and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors does ordain as follows:

- (1) Provide for the continuation of a self-insured worker's compensation program that is currently in effect.

- REQUESTING A CHANGE IN WISCONSIN LAW TO ALLOW THE STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS TO ACCESS WISCONSIN RETIREMENT FUND ACCOUNTS OF PUBLIC EMPLOYEES WHO ARE CONVICTED OF STEALING MONEY FROM THEIR STATE OR LOCAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYER-

WHEREAS, under current Wisconsin law Wisconsin Retirement System ("WRS") benefits are accessible only to the person who earned them except in certain situations including some child support orders, payment of delinquent state taxes and when pensions are divided due to divorce; and

WHEREAS, under current Wisconsin law neither the State nor local government entities have any legal authority to access retirement funds of employees convicted of stealing money from the government entity they worked for; and

WHEREAS, as a result Eau Claire County had no legal right to receive any payments from the WRS retirement accounts of former County Treasurer Larry Lokken nor Office Manager Kay Onarheim both of whom were convicted of theft and misconduct in public office and ordered to pay restitution to Eau Claire County in the amount of \$681,846.92.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Eau Claire County Board of supervisors that it requests the state legislature to change Wisconsin law to allow the state and local governments to access Wisconsin Retirement System accounts of public employees who are convicted of stealing money from their state or local government employer.

Brown are the current owners of a parcel of land described as The Fractional Northwest Quarter (NW1/4) of the Northwest Quarter (NW1/4) of Section 3, Township 26 North, Range 07 West, located in the Town of Lincoln, containing approximately 41.39 acres of land more or less; and

WHEREAS, This parcel of land is vacant forest land located along the Eau Claire River, and is adjacent to the Eau Claire County Forest; and

WHEREAS, this parcel has been recently appraised and has a value of approximately \$103,500.00. Donald D. and Carol J. Brown have indicated they would be willing to sell the parcel to Eau Claire County for the purchase price of \$96,050.00; and

Aviation general liability insurance coverage for commercial airlines, \$12,000,000 each occurrence bodily injury and property damage combined single limit, \$12,000,000 aggregate. (Chapters 12.02-12.09)
- 3. Products/Completed operations coverage, \$2,000,000 each occurrence combined single limit without sublimits, \$2,000,000 aggregate. (Chapters 12.06-12.08)
 - 4. Contractual liability \$2,000,000 each occurrence for bodily injury and property damage.
 - 54. Hangar keeper's liability \$250,000 each aircraft, \$1,000,000 each occurrence. (Chapters

- 65. Aircraft liability, for rental and instruction aircraft; \$1,000,000 each occurrence, and \$100,000 per passenger sublimits are acceptable. For charter aircraft, \$1,000,000 each occurrence without any passenger sublimits. (Chapters 12.02-12.04)
 - 76. Student and renters liability, \$200,000 each occurrence. (Chapters 12.02 and 12.03)
- <u>\$7.</u> CFI nonowned liability, \$1,000,000 each occurrence combined single limit with\$100,000 per passenger sublimits. (Chapters 12.03 and 12.09)
- 98. Environmental liability insurance coverage, \$1,000,000 each occurrence, \$1,000,000 aggregate. Environmental liability insurance shall comply with all federal and state laws and financial responsibility regulations and at a minimum will cover liability resulting from fueling and deicing operations. (Chapter 12.06)

- 109. Auto liability insurance: \$1,000,000 combined single limit for any vehicles to be operated on the airport property. For mobile equipment that is not licensed for on road use, confirmation from insurance carrier that coverage is provided as part of the aviation general liability policy. (Chapter 12.06)
 - C. General Requirements
- 1. Certificates of Insurance shall be furnished to the airport director. The lessor and Eau Claire County must be listed as an additional insured.
 - 2. Insurance shall be continuously in force.
- 3. Policies shall contain a provision that coverage will not be cancelled or materially changed unless 30 days prior written notice is given to the airport director.
- 4. All private Certified Flight Instructors and Certified Flight Instructors Instrument operating from the airport shall have insurance as set forth in B. 68. This insurance shall be individually furnished and proved through a certificate of insurance or shall be through co-insurance on the policy of an operator or F.B.O.

SECTION 8. That Section 12.01.050 of the code be amended to read:

<u>12.01.050 Operators and fixed base operators to provide certain services.</u> Each operator and F.B.O. shall supply the following, in conjunction with its ground operations:

- A. Telephone facilities and computer weather information service for public use;
- B. Adequate heat and light for the operations building Operator's and F.B.O.'s buildings shall include as a minimum hot and cold running water, one or more restrooms, and be fully heated. The building owner shall be responsible for installation of sewer and water lines to the nearest publicly owned sewer and water mains acceptable to the City of Eau Claire Utilities Department.
- C. A paved walkway within the leased premises to provide pedestrian access to its offices;
- C. Heated hangars, only where natural gas hookup is not available, using tanks for heating fuel storage shall have such tanks located above ground, within leased lot lines and in full compliance with all local and state codes.
- D. A paved aircraft apron within the leased premises to accommodate aircraft movement from the operations building to the taxiway to airport runways.
- E. An adequate number of paved parking spaces for employees and customers with the following minimums;
 - 1. One space minimum per two on site employees plus customer spaces.
- 2. Three spaces minimum for customers of operators offering services under Chapters 12.05 through 12.08.
- 3. Five spaces minimum for customers of operators offering services under Chapters 12.02 and 12.03.
- 4. Ten spaces minimum for customers of operators offering services under Chapters 12.04 and 12.09.
- 5. Paved parking spaces shall be installed on the ground space to be leased as part of the airport facilities for the service to be offered. Said paved spaces shall be constructed and paid for by the lessee. **SECTION 9.** That Section 12.01.070 of the code be amended to read:

12.01.070 Enforcement. The commission or its designee shall have the authority to request enforcement through the City of Eau Claire Police Department, airport director, or director's designee airport security police or prosecution by the corporation counsel for any violations of the terms and conditions of this Subtitle. The commission reserves the right to waive, modify or eliminate any or all minimum standards temporarily or permanently consistent with Wisconsin Bureau of Aeronautics and Federal Aviation Administration guidelines at its sole discretion if it deems it to be in the best interest of the airport.

- A. All aviation fuel storage tanks shall be located above ground. Fuel storage tanks shall be located in fuel farm areas designated in the most recent Airport Master Plan as adopted by the committee or as amended and approved by the committee or may be located outside the fuel farm with special approval from the committee. All petroleum storage tank owners must meet insurance requirements of 12.01.040 B. 78. All fuel storage tanks and associated piping shall be installed and maintained in full compliance with all applicable local, state, and federal codes.
- B. All tank owners subject to this chapter whose tanks will be located in the fuel farm shall lease, at a minimum, fuel farm ground space of 15 feet by 50 feet on which the fuel tank(s) shall be placed. Minimum aviation fuel storage tank size shall be 10,000 gallons. All fuel shall be removed from fuel farm storage tanks and delivered to aircraft via trucks or pipeline(s) from the fuel storage tanks. Operators and F.B.O.'s shall provide at least 2 metered, filter equipped dispensers, fixed or mobile, for dispensing fuels. Separate self-fueling option dispensing pumps and motors are required for each grade of fuel.
- D. Each F.B.O. subject to this chapter shall maintain at least 2 fuel storage tanks of the capacity set forth in B. at the airport fuel farm site and maintain an adequate supply of fuel on hand at all times of at least 2 grades of fuel, inclusive of jet fuel, as closely related to the popular demand of the general aviation uses as possible and maintain petroleum tank environmental insurance listing the airport as additional insured with a minimum coverage of \$1,000,000. as provided in 12.01.040 B.8.
- E. Corporations and individuals subject to this chapter for private fueling shall maintain at least one fuel storage tank of the capacity set forth in B. within the airport fuel farm site and maintain petroleum tank environmental insurance listing the airport as an additional insured with a minimum coverage of \$1,000,000 as provided in 12.01.040 B.8.

SECTION 14. That Section 12.06.020 of the code be created to read:

12.06.020 Fuel flowage fee.

- A. There shall be imposed upon the sale of aviation fuel at the airport a fuel flowage fee of \$.080 per gallon for jet fuel and \$.070 per gallon for 100LL fuel. The fee shall apply to the sale of all types and grades of aviation fuel and shall be based upon the total number of gallons delivered by bulk oil distributors.
- B. Each bulk oil distributor who delivers aviation fuel to any person or organization on the premises of the Chippewa Valley Regional Airport shall, within the first 25 days of the month next following delivery, prepare a statement of such aviation fuel deliveries and shall mail or deliver the same, together with a check covering the total amount of the fee imposed under 12.06.020 A., to the airport director. All checks shall be made payable to Eau Claire County.
- C. Every person or organization receiving aviation fuel shall monthly submit to the airport director a list of all aviation fuel delivered to them and shall keep a record of all fuel invoices in their office, available for inspection by the commission.

The provisions of this section shall not apply to emergency equipment or service, maintenance and construction equipment when engaged in performing official duties.
- C. Pedestrian traffic on airport. No pedestrian shall be allowed beyond the terminal area, the apron or aircraft tie-down area unless for the purpose of egress from or ingress to an aircraft, or unless authorized by the airport director. Pedestrian traffic is prohibited on the runway and upon outlying areas of the airport except for those employees of the county, state and federal government or contractors engaged in airport construction or maintenance work.

SECTION 27. That Section 12.25.090 of the code be amended to read:

12.25.090 Policing and enforcement. It shall be the duty of the <u>airport</u> director, <u>and airport personnel</u> and the security police to enforce the regulations contained within this chapter and to issue citations for violations hereof. Prosecution of violations shall be the responsibility of the corporation counsel.

This ordinance shall apply to participants who claim a farmland preservation tax credit for which they are eligible because their land is located in a district zoned exclusive agricultural use. In cases where the tax credits are based on the landowner participating under a farmland preservation agreement, the landowner is subject to the soil and conservation standards in effect at the time the agreement application was submitted to the county clerk after being signed by the landowner unless the landowner agrees to adopt the updated standards. These standards are effective when approved by the Land and Water Conservation Board and adopted by the Land Conservation Commission. (Wis. Stat. § 92.105(7))

The county may issue a notice of noncompliance and suspend the landowners eligibility for tax credits, without offering cost sharing to the landowner. The Land Conservation Commission may not issue a notice of noncompliance before a field inspection of the land has been made. The requirement for a field inspection and hearing may be waived by the Land Conservation Commission if the notice of noncompliance is voluntarily agreed upon. Copies of notices of noncompliance shall be submitted to the appropriate zoning jurisdiction and the Wisconsin Department of Revenue. No farmland preservation tax credits will be allowed to landowners who have been issued a notice of noncompliance with soil and water conservation requirement unless such notice is subsequently canceled by the Commission under Wis. Stat. §§ 92.104(4) or 92.105(5), Wis. Admin Code § ATCP 50.16.
