Approve Minutes from December 06, 2018 Meeting

Secure population: constant fluctuations based on bookings. Current capacity: 81% or 208 inmates.

"Secondhand jewelry dealer" means any person, other than an auctioneer, who 1 IJ. 2 engages in the business of any transaction consisting of purchasing, selling, receiving or 3 exchanging secondhand jewelry, or coins, or any item made in whole or in part from gold, silver, platinum or any metal, mineral, or gem customarily regarded as precious or semiprecious except 4 5 for the following: 6 Any transaction at an occasional garage or yard sale, an estate sale, a gun, 1. 7 knife, gem or antique show or a convention. 8 2. Any transaction with a licensed secondhand jewelry dealer. 9 3. Any transaction entered into by a person while engaged in a business of smelting, refining, assaying or manufacturing precious metals, gems or valuable articles if the 10 person has no retail operation open to the public. 11 Any transaction between a buyer of new jewelry and the person who sold 12 4. the jewelry when new which involves either: 13 14 The return of the jewelry; or a. Holding period. 32 Except as provided in D. 3., any secondhand article purchased or received 33 1. 34 by a pawnbroker, secondhand article dealer, or secondhand jewelry dealer shall be kept on the premises or other place for safekeeping for not less than 30 days, unless a shorter holding period 35 is expressly permitted by state law, after the date of purchase or receipt, unless the person known 36 by the pawnbroker, secondhand jewelry dealer, or secondhand article dealer to be the lawful owner 37 of the secondhand article redeems it or unless the secondhand article dealer or secondhand jewelry 38 39 dealer takes and maintains a as many clear digital photographs of the item(s) as is reasonably 40 necessary to identify the item(s) including, but not limited to, clear digital photograph(s) of the items' serial number in which case the holding period shall be 21 days. If a pawnbroker, 41 secondhand jewelry dealer or secondhand article dealer takes clear digital photograph(s) and 42 43 submits an electronic report that includes an image of all items the holding period shall be 7 days. 44 G. 45 Daily reports to sheriff. Pawnbrokers and secondhand jewelry dealers must submit every reportable 1. 46 transaction to the sheriff's office daily in the following manner. Pawnbrokers and secondhand 47 jewelry dealers must provide to the sheriff's office all information required in C. and other required 48 49 information, by transferring it from their computer to the APS an electronic record keeping system approved by the sheriff or their designee via modem. All required records must be transmitted 50

51 completely and accurately after the close of business each day in accordance with standards and

procedures established by the sheriff's office using procedures that address security concerns of 1 2 the pawnbroker and the sheriff's office. The pawnbroker must display a sign of sufficient size in 3 a conspicuous place on the premises which informs all patrons that all transactions are reported daily to the department and APS. 4

Billable transaction fees. Pawnbrokers will be charged for each billable 5 $\frac{2}{2}$ transaction reported to the sheriff's office. These fees are intended to pay for the cost of 6 7 participation in the APS and costs of enforcing this chapter.

8 If a pawnbroker is unable to successfully transfer the required reports by 3.2. modem, the pawnbroker must provide the sheriff's office with printed copies of all reportable 9 transactions by 12:00 noon the next business day. 10

If the problem is determined to be in the pawnbroker's system and is not 11 4.3. 12 corrected by the close of the first business day following the failure, the pawnbroker must provide 13 the required reports as detailed in 3., and shall be charged a daily reporting failure fee of \$10.00 -14 until the error is corrected, or, if the problem is determined to be outside the pawnbroker's system. the pawnbroker must provide the required reports in 3. and resubmit all such transactions via 15 modem when the error is corrected. 16

Regardless of the cause or origin of the technical problems that prevented 17 5.4 18 the pawnbroker from uploading the reportable transactions, upon correction of the problem, the pawnbroker shall upload every reportable transaction from every business day the problem has 19 20 existed.

21 The provisions of this section notwithstanding, the sheriff's office may, 6.5. upon presentation of extenuating circumstances, delay the implementation of the daily reporting 22 23 penalty.

24 7.6. G. shall not apply to businesses that did not have 200 reportable transactions in the past calendar year. However, any such pawnbroker must follow the daily reporting 25 procedure for each reportable transaction by submitting a written transaction form approved by the 26 sheriff's office to the department on the business day following the date of the reportable 27 28 transaction.

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SECTION 5. That Subsection B. of 9.96.140 of the code be amended to read:

A billable transaction fee of \$5,000/year billed quarterly of \$1 shall be charged for each billable transaction, and such fees shall be billed to each pawnbroker monthly billed 33 quarterly and are is due and payable within 30 days of the billing date. Failure to pay within that 34 35 time period is a violation of this chapter.
