1. Call to Order

Chair Leary called the meeting to order at 5:01 pm.

- 2. Confirmation of Compliance with Open Meetings Law Leary confirmed compliance with the open meetings law.
- 3. Public Input Session (15 minutes maximum) Discussion Marlo Orth, Lake Eau Claire District Chair, thanked everyone within the Land Conservation Division office and the Land Conservation Commission for their support and partnership. The current lake rehabilitation projects, including the dredging, are proving to work.
- 4. Approve Minutes from January 22, 2019 meeting Discussion/Action ACTION: Motion by Henning to approve the minutes as presented. Motion carried, 8-0-0.
- 5. Review Vouchers and Ledger Update Discussion The January expenditures and revenues were reviewed. Several stormwater permit financial assurances were returned as the permit requirements were completed.
- 6. Cost-Share Applications Discussion/Action There were no cost-share applications.
- 7. Water Quality Trading with the City of Augusta– Discussion/Action The City of Augusta has requested to enter into a water quality trading project with the Land Conservation Division. The City's wastewater treatment plant is not currently meeting their discharge goals and wishes to offset their discharges with trading. The projects which are eligible for trading include Best Management Practices (BMPs) that Land Conservation typically install on agricultural lands. Funding for the BMPs would come from the City, with an additional 15% being paid to Land Conservation for services. Details of the project need to be finalized with Corporation Counsel and Finance.
- 8. Update on ThinkWater Discussion Fagen and Adams provided an update on the ThinkWater process occurring with the Groundwater Advisory Committee members and staff.
- 9. Conservation Tree and Plant Program update Discussion Conservation tree sales are similar to past year's sales. The native plant sale is new, but sales are about what staff had anticipated. Trees are distributed near the end of April, but the plants will be distributed in May.

10. Update on Ag Ordinance Review Special Committee process – Discussion

Leonard provide an update on the process to date for the Ag Ordinance Review Special Committee. The last scheduled meeting was cancelled due to weather. Meetings to date have included educational opportunities on NR-151 Ag Performance Standards and Prohibitions, existing Animal Waste Storage Ordinance, Livestock Siting and CAFO regulations, and review of the State of the Groundwater report for Eau Claire County. The next meetings are scheduled to begin discussions on the Special Committee's recommendations.

11. Staff and Agency Updates

Leonard provided an update on the Multi-Discharger Variance (MDV) program. Some funds have been received and are greater than DNR's original estimates. Fagen provided an update on the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) permit reporting, Rain to Rivers (R2R) activities, and the upcoming North American Stormwater and Erosion Control (NASECA) training to be hosted by R2R. Peters provided an update on Nutrient Management Workshops.

12. Future agenda items

Matt Kruger, Executive Director of Wisconsin Land and Water Conservation Association (WI Land+Water), will plan on attending the March 2019 LCC meeting. Water Quality Trading with the City of Augusta and Ag Ordinance Review will be on the next agenda.

13. Set date for next meeting

The date for the next LCC meeting was set for Monday, March 18, 2019.

14. Adjourn

Leary adjourned the meeting at 5:46 pm.

FACT SHEET

TO FILE NO. 18-19/113

On October 2, 2018 the county board adopted Ordinance File No. 18-19/065 which imposed a 6-month temporary moratorium on the expansion and creation of large-scale livestock facilities. Resolution 18-19/113, if granted, will extend the moratorium for two additional months.

Since the passage of the moratorium ordinance, an Ag. Ordinance Review Special Committee (AORSC) was formed and has been meeting regularly since November of 2018. During this time the AORSC has conducted farm tours; heard from county staff (Land Conservation, Land Use, and Health Department) regarding current regulations and issues and from State Agency staff from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection on state law and administrative rule. The AORSC's remaining work involves reviewing the NR 151 standards and prohibitions, the County's animal waste storage ordinance, Wisconsin's Livestock Siting Law and Confined Animal Feeding Operations (CAFO's). Finally, the committee will make final ordinance recommendations to the Department of Planning and Development.

The two additional months are essential for the drafting, and passage of the necessary ordinances to implement the AORSC recommendations.

GRANTING A TWO MONTH EXTENSION OF THE TEMPORARY MORATORIUM ON THE EXPANSION AND CREATION OF THE LARGE-SCALE LIVESTOCK FACILITIES

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Eau Claire County board of Supervisors that the 6-month temporary moratorium on the expansion and creation of large-scale livestock facilities effective October 19, 2018 be extended by 2 months to allow the special committee to complete its work.
