Section A – General Requirements

1. The following relationship has been established for this Water Quality Trading Agreement:

A. The City of Augusta will hereby be known as the **Credit User**. They will hereby be responsible for all monetary costs incurred with the BMP practice installation, which includes but is not limited to: site preparation, clearing, and finished to planned grades; stream shaping; limestone rock riprap and installation; liming, fertilizing, seeding and mulching. The Credit User shall have the right to access the property for inspection or maintenance.

B. The Eau Claire County Land Conservation Department will be known as the **Broker**. The Broker will be responsible for the oversight of the BMP practice design, contractor bidding process and signed agreements, inspection of site preparation and design installation, regulation of applicable performance standards, annual inspections and monitoring of landowners' obligations in the form of performing on-site checks as needed and as stated in Section B. The Broker shall not have any financial obligation for this project except as expressly stated in this agreement.

C. ______ will be known as the **Landowners/Operators**. Landowners will be responsible for all aspects of the operation and maintenance of BMP practices as outlined in Section B below.

1. If any land covered by this agreement is transferred or otherwise changes ownership, this agreement will be held in obligation with the land for the full 20 years and the new owners will be obligated to comply with this agreement. Landowners are obligated to notify any prospective buyers of this agreement and their responsibilities under this agreement and applicable law.

2. The Landowners agree to repay all project costs to the credit user, upon demand by the Broker, if the Landowner fails to comply with the terms of this agreement. Repayment shall not be required if a practice(s) is rendered ineffective by circumstances which are beyond the control of the Landowner.

3. This contract will be recorded in the Eau Claire County Register of Deeds office.

2. This contract may be amended, by written mutual agreement of the parties, during the installation or maintenance period, if the proposed changes will provide equal or greater control of water pollution. For any changes in practice components or costs, the County will determine eligibility and whether to approve such changes. Any increases to the project cost shall be approved in advance in writing by the Credit User.

3. The City of Augusta reserves the right to terminate this agreement if the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) does NOT approve the Water Quality Trading Plan (WQTP). The WQTP identifies this project for phosphorus credits to help Augusta comply with the permit for their wastewater treatment facility. These credits are established in the WP and has been analyzed as a cost-effective project. Should the DNR either deny or reduce the project credits, which results in a higher cost per pound of phosphorus credit, then Augusta may terminate the agreement.

4. The Broker has the right to enter the property to construct and inspect the project.

Section B – Landowner/Operator Shall:

1. Inspect riprap annually and after heavy storms for any erosion or displacement of rocks. The Broker should be contacted immediately and directly if any damage has occurred. Repairs should be done immediately by Landowner, at Landowner's cost. 2. Ensure that no grazing of animals will occur within 30 feet of the stream channel to prevent clogging or rerouting of water in the channel.

3. Ensure that debris is removed from the channel and that vegetation is controlled around the channel only when the vegetation or obstructions are threatening stream function. Invasive vegetation should be controlled and channel obstructions deemed harmful may be removed. Channel clearing to remove stumps, fallen trees, debris, and sediment bars shall only be performed when they are causing or could cause unacceptable bank erosion, flow restriction, or damage to structures. Habitat forming elements that provide cover, food, pools, and water turbulence shall be retained or replaced to the extent possible.

4. Check for sloughing, erosion, or damage to vegetative cover. Damaged areas shall be graded, shaped, and replanted by Landowner as soon as possible with a seed mix pre-approved by the broker.

5. If cattle are introduced to the stream corridor, fencing must be installed to prevent unlimited access of cattle to waters of the State. If fences are installed, they shall be maintained to prevent unauthorized human or livestock access. Fencing shall be set back to allow for a 30-foot vegetative buffer along the stream corridor.

6. Periodically, mow vegetative buffer to control weeds and invading brush. All farm equipment and row crops must remain outside of the agreed upon 30-foot vegetated buffer from the top of the bank.

7. Eliminate all burrowing rodents and repair damage caused by them.

8. Maintain the project consistent with NRCS technical standard 580.

9. Installation of this practice allows the Landowner to comply with the applicable state/local performance standard. Compliance with this performance standard shall be for a period of 20 years. This practice must be maintained or replaced with a practice which ensures continued compliance with the applicable performance standard.

10. The landowner agrees that the annual inspections are to be performed on inspection forms, which will be provided by the Broker. The landowner will be required to take pictures of the BMP for the annual report, which will be submitted with the inspection form to the Broker. The landowner agrees to submit the annual inspection and pictures by September 30th each year. Should the landowner fail to submit the annual inspection to the Broker within 30 days of the due date, then the Broker may enter the Landowner's property to perform the inspection. Should the Broker need to perform the inspection due to failure of the Landowner to submit the inspection, then the Landowner will be responsible for a \$250 inspection fee payable to the Broker.

The City of Augusta needs to implement some Water Quality Trading (WQT) projects in order to maintain compliance with the Phosphorus limit in the WPDES Permit for their wastewater treatment plant. Augusta would like your help. Having the support and involvement of the county Land Conservation Department is the key to successful WQT projects. LCD's work on similar projects all the time and have the experience and relationships necessary to develop concepts, obtain the support of property owners, design and construct projects and monitor performance. The following list covers some of the specific actions recommended for the Eau Claire County LCD:

- 1. Identify potential projects
- 2. Make contact with property owners
- 3. Collect soil samples (required by DNR)
- 4. Photograph site
- 5. Assist with Phosphorus calculations
- 6. Participate in a 3-party agreement and obtain property owner's support. Act as the "broker" (example attached)
- 7. Prepare plans and obtain permits
- 8. Bid construction
- 9. Manage construction
- 10. Provide annual inspections to check on maintenance

We would help, of course, and take the lead in preparing the Water Quality Trading Plan for DNR. The municipality would pay 100% of the construction cost, likely a better deal for the property owner than most County-funded programs. In addition, we will recommend that the municipality also pay a 10% brokerage fee to the County for this assistance.

Augusta's WPDES Permit currently has a 1.0 mg/L Phosphorus limit that will be reduced to 0.075 mg/L. As designed, the treatment facility can meet 0.5 mg/L, perhaps 0.3 mg/L. At the current flow of 90 MG and 0.5 mg/L, the Augusta WWTP discharges about 375 lbs. P/year. The target concentration of 0.075 mg/L yields approximately 56 lbs. P/year. With an assumed Trade Ratio of 3:1, a WQT would need to provide (375 – 56) x 3 = 957 lbs. P/year to offset.

Bank stabilization projects are usually the simplest and most cost-effective for phosphorus reduction. They are also fairly easy to maintain, making the WQT credits somewhat permanent. The amount of Phosphorus reduction is <u>very site specific</u>, of course, but some other projects have generated about 0.3 lbs. P/year per linear foot of bank stabilization. To get the 957 lbs./year estimated for Augusta, about 3,190 lin. ft. of bank stabilization may be necessary. With a cost of \$30 per linear foot, the construction cost is estimated to be \$95,700. For Augusta, we recommend first trying to develop a bank stabilization project on the Erdmann farm in Diamond Valley. Augusta already approached them about getting out of the cattle business but they are not interested. Just in a drive-by, the site needs a lot of work to control bank erosion and cattle damage. Stabilizing the stream banks on both sides for about 1,600 lin. ft. may generate all the credits that Augusta needs.

Augusta needs to start on WQT in 2019 and have the WQT Plan completed by 2020. The Plan needs to have the projects identified, phosphorus credits calculated, concept plans and cost estimates prepared and agreements in place. Construction must begin by 2021.

Augusta is not the only municipality in Eau Claire County that will be doing WQT. Using WQT is actually more important in your county as there are only 4 counties in Wisconsin, including Eau Claire, that are ineligible for the Multi Discharger Variance because they are too "rich". Without the option of that variance, WQT becomes a more likely means of compliance with Phosphorus limits.

This does mean more work for your department but it also means that you will be able to accomplish more. Having some municipal money added will get more projects built and also support some of your staff time. With a 10% brokerage fee, for example, a project like Augusta's could generate \$95,700 x 10% = \$9,570 for the LCD.
