- 1. Call to Order The meeting was called to order by Chair Pro Tem Patrick LaVelle at 5:00 p.m.
- 2. Confirmation of meeting notice Meeting notice was confirmed.
- 3. Election of Committee Officers
 - a. Pat called for nominations for committee chair. Gary nominated Pat LaVelle who has served as the committee chair for 30 years. Bert Moritz nominated Kevin Stelljes. Pat called three more times for additional nominations. There being none, Bert Moritz made a motion to cast a unanimous ballot for Kevin Stellies; motion carried 5-0.
 - b. Bert Moritz nominated Pat LaVelle for Vice Chair and Pat declined as well as Gary and Tami, Tami nominated Bert Moritz for Vice Chair and Bert accepted. Tami moved to cast an unanimous ballot for Bert Moritz as Vice Chair of the Committee: motion carried.
 - c. Appointment of Clerk Kevin made a motion to appointed Bobbi as clerk without committee reservation; motion carried.
- 4. Approval of minutes from April 11, 2018 meeting Tami moved to approve the minutes from the April 11, 2018 meeting; motion carried.
- 5. Public Input No members of the public were present for this item.
- 6. Ski Sprites Lease Extension Request Rich LaFave and Chuck Ebert were present to represent the Ski Sprites. Rich explained the lease did not include additional practice night of Thursday which the Ski Sprites had requested. Discussion ensued. Tami made a motion to approve the Five-Year Lease with the addition of Thursday night practice; motion carried.

Kevin requested the agenda be altered to address item 8.

8. Land Trade proposal in Town of Lincoln - Tim and Jeff Aldrich were present for this item. Josh provided a map of the land trade proposal. The Aldrich's explained the trade would give them access to their 40 acre parcel next to it. Josh will check with the state on the options and the committee requested the item be on the next agenda.

- 7. Capital Improvement Plan for next year and 10 year Josh distributed the proposed Capital Improvement Plan and explained the process. After discussion, Tami made a motion to place item #"1. Water, Septic, Electric, Storm Sewer Upgrades Lake Altoona Park" from the 2020 plan to the 2019 plan; motion carried.
- 9. Update on Lowes Creek Park Josh explained that Senate BII 547 which was passed by the State Senate allows manmade wetlands may be filled. Commonweal Development had contacted Josh and is drawing up plans for Lowes Creek Park and will bring it to the committee. The committee was in agreement that they did not want to allow the wetlands to be filled in.
- 10. Special Events Guidelines/Application for Lowes Creek Park and Tower Ridge Recreation Area – Gary made a motion to approve the guidelines and application for Special Events as presented; motion carried. Kevin thanked the Advisory Committee for their work in formulating the policy.
- 11. Staff and Committee Reports Josh reported legal opinions on the ATV/UTV trail grant reimbursement and closure issues should be available by the next meeting. Gary requested this item be placed on the next agenda so the committee can discuss options.
- 12. Correspondence Nothing received.
- 13. Advisory Committee Input/Assignments Special Use Areas suggested rental policies No action on this item.
- 14. Future and pending items Nothing to add at this time not already mentioned.
- 15. Set next meeting date Discussion ensued about possible meeting days and times. It was agreed to continue meeting on Wednesdays at 5 p.m. Kevin added that he appreciates the 30 years Pat has served as chair of the Parks and Forest Meeting.

Kevin adjourned the meeting at 6:45 p.m.

GROUP CAMP RESERVATION AGREEMENT

The special use area called the Group Camp site is available for group camping during the regular park season – May 1 thru September 15. All reservations must be made in person at the Administrative Office, 227 1st Street West, Altoona WI 54720.

The fee is \$40 per night up to a maximum of 6 days per reservation. A key will be issued to the group for the gate. Gate must be locked when leaving the camp.

A \$50 deposit is required at key pick-up in the Administrative Office by a personal check payable to Parks & Forest Dept. The deposit will be returned upon staff recommendation and key is received back in the Administrative Office. It is understood that there is no water available and campers must provide their own drinking water. There is NO garbage service. All garbage and recyclables MUST be removed from the Group Camp by the reservation holder at the conclusion of the paid period and key returned to the Administrative Office.

Check in time is 2 p.m. and check out 11 a.m.






