## Helpful tips ~ Minor Settlements: (Class code 30203)

A Guardian ad Litem (GAL) in a minor settlement case cannot be the attorney or member of attorney's firm representing the parents on behalf of the minor. The GAL's role is advisory, representing the best interest of the minor.

Filing a new civil case for minor settlement should include the following documents: 1)Petition for Approval of Minor Settlement, 2) Affidavit from Attorney in Support of Petition, 3) Petition for Appointment of GAL, 4) Consent to Act as GAL, 5) Order Appointing GAL, and 6) Proposed Order Approving Minor Settlement.

If a Petition seeking Appointment of a GAL was requested prior to the filing of a new civil action, please reference the GF (Group File) case number with your civil filing. Please note; GF cases are not available for eFiling, and there is no filing fee for appointment of a GAL.

## eFiling Tip:

When initiating a civil, family, or small claims case electronically, it is the responsibility of the filing party to serve the eFiling notice on the defendant(s)/respondent(s). For new small claims actions, service of the defendant's instructions is also required.
