In Camera Proceedings: Any materials/documents to be inspected by the Court should be provided in <u>paper/hard copy</u> format. The clerk will seal documents/materials based on statute and/or Court's order. The Court will order masking or deleting of any material which is not relevant to the case being tried. These materials/documents will be preserved for the purposes of appeal.

eFiling Tip: Stipulations/Orders, Motions/Orders, Petition/Orders

Remember to keep proposed orders separate from the motions and other supporting documents. The Clerk's office continually receives documents with orders as the last page of a multi-page document. Because these documents are now filed separately, it is helpful to reference important details in the Orders (i.e., what is the motion, petition, or stipulation).
