An electronic update for the legal community providing a brief look at news in Eau Claire County Courts.

As record keepers for the Circuit Court in 2019, Clerk of Court staff have attended and recorded actions for **44,498** hearings, processed **40,590** new case type filings, and scanned **313**, **463** documents.

UPDATES IN THE COURTS ~

Technology continues to expand in Eau Claire County with e-Filing providing more efficient and progressive access to court related records. Temporary Restraining Orders (TRO) became mandatory for eFiling effective December 15.

Digital Audio Recording (DAR) equipment was installed in most of the circuit court branches mid-December. There may be times when proceedings may be set and a court reporter (stenographer) is not available. DAR is a recognized method of taking the circuit court record. The use of a DAR machine with a monitor may be used for low transcript hearings and less complex proceedings.
