## COVID-19 and the Eau Claire County Circuit Courts Status Update

- The majority of hearings continue to be held using remote technology via Zoom by phone or video.
- Reminder that requests for in-person hearings must be made in writing to the Judge a minimum of 3 days prior to the hearing date. If request is denied, the Court hearing will be remote by video or phone.
- Remember that court appearances whether in person or remote, require you to abide by the Standards of Courtesy and Decorum as outlined in Supreme Court Rule Chapter 62 including (1)(e) "...dress in a manner showing proper respect for the court, the proceedings and the law".
- There is now a room available for criminal defendants to utilize for Zoom appearances when they don't have a phone. Specific criteria MUST be met in order for them to utilize this room. Criteria as follows:
  - ONLY when defendants show up at the courthouse and **don't** have a phone (most likely during 11:00 Initial Appearances)
  - Criminal Case Defendants Only at this time
  - Only one person in the room at a time due to social distancing requirements
  - Defendant should report to Clerk of Courts to request use of the room. Supervisor will assist.

## Court Appointed Attorney & GAL Invoice payments

Patience is appreciated when waiting for payment of Court Appointed and Guardian Ad Litem Attorney invoices. Delays can be expected as staff throughout the county continue to work remotely due to COVID.
