




Gateway Corridor, Minnesota-Wisconsin




2013 Gateway Corridor Study







Value Capture for Transportation Investments

The West Central Wisconsin Rail Coalition continues to explore the potential for a selfsustaining, passenger rail service to link Eau Claire and other west central Wisconsin cities with the Twin Cities (with the goal of eventually connecting to Chicago). The Coalition has requested that Chippewa-Eau Claire MPO staff provide information on Value capture financing mechanisms for transportation infrastructure particularly rail station site development. This paper provides an overview of value capture, summarizing various value capture mechanisms, providing case studies, and identifying considerations for applying such tools to rail in West central Wisconsin.

Federal funds have long been the primary financial source for major transportation projects. As infrastructure costs increase and federal funding decreases, communities are turning to other financing tools to help fill funding gaps.

Successful public transportation investments improve accessibility to jobs, schools and other destinations. The improved access creates added value, both near a public transportation station (e.g. rail transit station) and also in the general service area/region (e.g. rail corridor). Three general groups benefit from transportation improvements and (e.g. rail corridor). Three general groups benefit from transportation improvements and increased accessibility – general public, system users (i.e. drivers, transit riders) and landowners/developers. The general public benefits through improved access to the region, they contribute to the system through general property taxes. System users, such as transit riders on a new rail line, benefit from enhanced service and accessibility, their contribution into the system comes through fare box/ticket collections. A tract of land with higher accessibility increases in value, bringing benefit to landowners/developers. Land value premiums in excess of thirty percent near commuter rail transit have been observed (HNTB citing report by Robert Cervero). "Capturing some of this land value would allow state and local governments to invest in the operations, maintenance, and in some cases expansion of their transportation networks" (Brookings 2011).

Value Capture is the means by which the increment of increased land value, as a result and income of "cantured" by some means for use by transit agency or

FAST Act

- Consolidated Rail Infrastructure & Safety Improvements program

FAST Act

- Restoration & Enhancement Grants
- What: supports operation of new, restored, or enhanced intercity passenger rail service
- Can provide grants to 6 lines to support operating costs for 3 years on a tiered structure:
 - Up to 80% operating costs in year 1
 - Up to 60% in year 2
 - Up to 40% in year 3

WHEREAS, every day there are thousands of individuals who travel between the Twin Cities and the St. Croix Valley and the Chippewa Valley for purposes of commuting to work; conducting Minnesota; and business; pursuing higher education; engaging in tourism, shopping, and recreation activities; and connecting to travel hubs for national and international travel; and

WHEREAS, both the Wisconsin State Rail Plan and the Minnesota State Rail Plan, federally mandated official transportation plans created by the respective states, include the Twin Cities Eau Claire line as a planned future passenger rail route; and

WHEREAS, activities that the commission could participate in may include:

- Identify the public benefits of passenger rail and other public transportation improvements to connect the Chippewa/St. Croix region to the Twin Cities, as well as Madison, Milwaukee, and Chicago.
- Identify, support, and facilitate initiatives to implement passenger rail service, including public-private partnerships, sponsors, operators, federal and state funding opportunities, relationships among governments and stakeholders, feasibility studies, and the like.
- Pursue opportunities for transit orientated development, value capture financing, and other community-related benefits at station locations to ensure the fullest possible economic benefits from service implementation.
- Foster cooperation among Wisconsin and Minnesota governments, agencies, and other
 entities. Determine the long-term role of the commission, or other organization that might
 be created to coordinate public involvement in the service, including any legislative or
 other action that might be needed. Participate in determining the appropriate project roles
 for this commission, state DOTs, counties and municipalities, private partners and real
 estate developers, and advocacy or educational organizations like the West Central Rail
 Coalition.
- Determine and coordinate zoning, environmental, safety, and other regulatory related requirements.
- Participate in current and future planning processes, including the Wisconsin and Minnesota State Rail Plans, Federal Railroad Administration Midwest Corridor Study, and the local MPO; and











