- COVID updates- Vaccine Assistance- staff continue to help people as they call in helping to identify homebound individuals, transportation options and mobility issues. Providing education on how to receive vaccine. Working closely with health department, Betsy H

helping health department with Volgistics system and volunteers. Lisa R and Linda S are reaching out to apartment settings where health department could send in staff if enough people interested. Heath department is doing excellent job of vaccine administration. Currently at or above state rate percentage.

   Sue made motion to recommend both board applicants to ADRC board, Carl seconds the motion. All in favor Aye. Unanimous vote. Motion passes. Recommendations of board members will be made to the county board chair.
- Aging plan update- moving into plan development phase. Close to 600 survey responses received. Breaking into subcommittees and working on SMART Goals. Management will review draft goals and submit draft goals to GWAAR. Once they give green light draft will be presented to the board for additional feedback and will revise as needed. Board members will see the draft August or September.

Nutrition updates- March for Meals received \$3000 in donation. Will be used for updated equipment for transporting food. Positive Avenues meals ended April 1<sup>st</sup>. March was one of the highest months ever for meal count at 11,088 meals for the month. Highway building committee did officially vote that MOW kitchen will be a part of the building. Meeting with architects and working on design. Discussion about accessibility of the MOW kitchen.

Transportation updates - May have an opportunity to purchase more recumbent bikes for use at the Augusta Senior Center if they are interested. Vehicle modification grant of \$5000 was used for van accessibility.

Linda,

You have asked whether the ADRC can accept a donation of a painting from Barb Schafer, a local artist. This painting depicts a senior woman dancing with her walker. I am unaware if the painting has a title? The painting which is approximately 3 feet by 4 feet in size has no assigned value. We know that it was painted by Barb Schafer, a locally known artist who has had a studio at Banbury Place for several years, where she creates and displays her artwork. While the value of this panting is unknown, it would likely fall in the definition of "anything of value" when considering the County's Ethics code (Chapter 3.50). Barb Schafer does, as she indicated in her email, have a daughter for whom request for service has previously been made to the ADRC. Barb Schafer indicates that she is giving the painting in memory of two other people, Edna Hood and Jeannie Hugo.

Pursuant to Wisconsin Statutes Section 59.51(19) the County Board "may accept donations, gifts or grants for any governmental purposes within the powers of the county."

The ADRC has a governing Board known as the Aging and Disability Resource Center Board that is established pursuant to Section 2.05.610 of the Eau Claire County Code and that gives authority to the ADRC Board to govern the activities of the ADRC.

The painting could not be donated to an induvial employee or board member of the ADRC or the ADRC Board as it is prohibited by Section 3.50.010 of the Eau Claire County Code as a conflict of interest.

There is no express authority in the code or statutes for a gift to be accepted directly by the ADRC or the ADRC Board. By extension of the language of Section 59.51(19) it would seem logical that the ADRC Board would have the authority to accept gifts on behalf of the county to

be used for purposes within the ADRC. Because individual members of the board cannot act on behalf of the board, the ADRC Board would need to formally accept the painting as a gift at a regularly scheduled meeting. This also will serve to act as a record for the donation and under which conditions the painting was given to the ADRC.
