Chair Stelljes called the meeting to order at 5 pm and confirmed public posting of the meeting.

Verbal roll call was taken by the committee clerk and is noted above under present.

No members of the public were present.

The committee reviewed the minutes from the May 10, 2021, meeting. Supervisor Knight moved to approve the minutes as presented. The minutes passed unanimously.

Carbon Credits – The Committee discussed and reacted to the April 12, 2021, presentation by Forest Gibeault of Steigerwaldt Land Services on Carbon Credits. Given the county's carbon neutral goals, more information is needed to assess appropriately whether this program fits with these goals. The workload on staff up front is an issue, but this opportunity should still be considered. A cost/benefit analysis should be conducted as the value of credits may outweigh the cost involved. It may be beneficial to hire someone to do the field studies. Knight motioned to have Director Josh Pedersen proceed with an inventory of the county forest not to exceed \$7,000.50. All in favor, none opposed.

Stewardship Parcels – Director Josh Pedersen presented three (3) parcels for acquisition. See attachment. *Parcel #1 Mine Site* – This parcel has great potential due to its size, river frontage on both sides of the river, and may fit in with the county's carbon neutral goals.

Parcel #2 North Center Road – The Black Creek snakes through this property, and it is connected to existing county forest land near Coon Fork.

Parcel #3 Black Creek – This parcel has the greatest potential to harvest timber and the Black Creek also runs through it. The Committee should consider these and any occasion to acquire land when the opportunity presents itself. It was decided to charter a sub-committee of interested parties to go out and start a discussion with property owners without making a commitment. A stewardship meeting should convene as soon as possible to discuss the county's options.

The next meeting date was set for June 14, 2021, at 5:00 pm virtually.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:08 pm.

Chair Stelljes called the meeting to order at 5 p.m. and confirmed public posting of the meeting.

The committee reviewed the minutes from the February 10, 2020 meeting. Moritz moved to approve the minutes as presented. It passed unanimously.

No members of the public were present.

WDNR Liaison Forester Kyle Johnson gave an informative presentation on the boundaries of the flood plains in Eau Claire County. The committee would like to have another discussion on this before any final decisions are made regarding the code or timber sale extensions. No action was taken at this time.

James Melville and Michael Zwoniarkiewicz represented the Eau Claire National Rifle Club to give a report on estimates for the rifle range sound abatement plan. They discussed pros and cons for both wall options. Melville also proposed putting in a parking lot to keep vehicles off the road. Gibson made a motion to encourage the Rifle Club to continue to explore these options moving forward, and keep the committee posted.

Director Pedersen provided the committee with a report based off financial estimations of senior citizen annual pass purchases. Moritz made a motion to give a \$10 discount to senior citizens, bringing down the cost of an annual pass to \$20. Additional passes registered to the same household will remain \$10. The motion passed. Pedersen will write up a draft resolution and forward the draft to Finance & Budget and the Parks & Forest Committee for approval.

Pedersen presented Resolution 19-20/106 to the committee to apply for motorized trail aids. The approval was unanimous.

Pedersen gave an update on the Lake Altoona utility study. The study is about halfway complete. No action was taken.

The Emergency Fire Warden plan was approved unanimously.

Pedersen gave a report on the Tower Ridge skills park project. Haas has almost completely cleared the area of trees. Hauling sand into the area might need to wait as the frost thawing at this time could be problematic.

The fifteen year forest plan is coming along. Pedersen met with three members from UW Extension to discuss their role in implementing a public meeting in Eau Claire on June 9. Stelljes would like to discuss the addition of a couple chapters on carbon neutrality & climate change impacts.

The next meeting date was set for March 16th at 5:00 PM at the Ag Center.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:43 pm
