Chairs Stelljes and Koziel called the respective meetings to order at 5:00 p.m. and confirmed public posting of the meeting.

Verbal roll call was taken by the committee clerks and is noted above under present.

No comments were received from members of the public.

Kevin Stelljes introduced the resolution authorizing the Parks and Forest Department to apply for contingent funding for future county forest land purchases. Joe Knight motioned to approve resolution. Rick Koziel motioned to dually approve for the Land Stewardship sub-committee. There were some minor grammatical changes discussed and proposed. Concerns over the funding sources for the proposed purchases are to be addressed in the fact sheet to go along with the resolution. Roll call votes were taken of each committee. All in favor, none opposed.

Kevin mentioned that he was planning on visiting the 5 Star site on 1/11/2022 with Jon Johnson to evaluate if any of the sand materials could be used for road building purposes. Another meeting is set with a potential solar developer on 1/12/2022 to review the site for construction purposes.

Dave Dressel made a motion to adjourn the Land Stewardship sub-committee.

Chair Koziel adjourned the Land Stewardship subcommittee meeting at 5:41 PM.

The committee reviewed the minutes from the December 13, 2021, meeting. Supervisor Christopherson moved to approve the minutes as presented. The minutes passed unanimously.

Michele Skinner presented information on updates of the Lake Altoona District. Kevin Stelljes exited the meeting at 5:48 PM.

Joe Knight presented information on the Clean Water Now for Wisconsin Referendum. Rod Eslinger pointed out that there is a date typo contained in the resolution. Motion by Christopherson to approve the resolution as presented. All in favor, none opposed.

Jody Gindt presented a letter to the committee from Wolf River Logging requesting that forfeiture of their bond be no more than 10% of the job value or \$860. The contractor does not wish to fulfil the contract and is seeking leniency on the bond. Staff discussed the importance of the contracts and bond requirements and not wanting to set a precedence of lowering bond amounts. Gary Gibson made a motion to refund \$1500 of the bond and keep the remaining \$1500. All in favor, none opposed.

Josh Pedersen presented information on the Emergency Fire Warden locations for 2022 in Eau Claire County. Missy Christopherson motioned to approve the locations as presented. All in favor, none opposed.

Director's report: Pedersen brought up the need for continued discussion of carbon credits for a future committee meeting. Staff have been busy with ski trail grooming, plowing, and keeping up with park passes to begin the new year. Missy Christopherson also mentioned that she would like to see the carbon credit topic brought up at the next meeting to further discussions.

The next meeting date was set for February 14, 2022, at 5:00 p.m. virtually.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:23 p.m.

1. Call to Order and Confirmation of Meeting Notice Supervisor Stelljes called the meeting to order at 5 p.m. and confirmed compliance with the Open Meeting Law.

Review/Approval of Minutes from September 9, 2019 Meeting Schraufnagel moved to approve the meeting minutes from the September 9, 2019 meeting. The motion passed unanimously.

3. Public Comment

No members of the public were present.

4. Update on Lowe's Buckthorn Demo

Jody Gindt gave an update on the buckthorn project at Lowes Creek. He discussed the conditions of the park before and after Wiscorps came. The newspaper article seemed to have raised awareness of buckthorn to the public. The response seemed to make a positive impact. John Stupak mentioned the possibility of Wiscorps coming back again next year as well to keep controlling the spread of buckthorn. Schraufnagel would like to volunteer to lead a citizen group of volunteers to work further on Lowes Creek buckthorn infested areas in the near future and see the Parks & Forest Department apply for support of Wiscorps coming back to do more work in the future.

5. Winter Trail Use with Dogs at Coon Fork & Evergreen Ski Trails

Josh Pedersen introduced the topic of dogs using the ski trails in the winter. Jeff Thielen discussed how minimal impact the dogs would have on the trails. Pat made a motion to open the ski trails to dogs at Coon Fork & Evergreen ski trails this year with stipulations that the dogs remain on a leash and owners clean up after the dogs. The motion passed with a unanimous approval, 5-0.

6. 2019 Fall Timber Sale Maps

Jake Tumm presented each timber sale map on the overhead projector. There are thirteen new sales, and one rebid in the 2019 fall batch. Moritz motioned to approve sales as they are. The motion passed unanimously, 5-0.

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7. 2020 Budget & Revenue Forecast

Josh Pedersen discussed the budgeting process and presented a PowerPoint of forecasted timber revenue predictions to allow the committee to help determine whether the department could forecast more revenue in the budget. Moritz moves to accept an additional \$100,000 as high as we should allow the budget to reach, with Stelljes and Schnaufnagel in favor. LaVelle was against this and stated we should allow the board to request a higher revenue forecast, and we can cut more timber to accommodate that. The motion passed 3-1, with LaVelle voting "Nay."

Stelljes adjourned the meeting at 6:30 p.m.
