What to do if your vehicle needs to be towed in Eau Claire County:

- ✓ Make sure your vehicle is in a safe location to await a tow service.
- ✓ Call the Eau Claire County (ECC) Communication Center at 715-839-4972 to give them your location and request a tow. If there is an emergency call 911.
- ✓ If possible, have a phone number for a predetermined tow company you would like to utilize.

 This will decrease the amount of time you will spend on the side of the road and may save you money.
- ✓ If you need to leave your vehicle, please place a note on the dashboard with your name and phone number. Also indicate if you have already arranged a tow, or if not, what preferred company you would like contacted to tow your vehicle.
- ✓ The Sheriff's Office will not recommend a specific company to tow your vehicle. If you do not suggest a predetermined company, or cannot locate one on your own, the Sheriff's Office utilizes a Towing Association to contact local tow companies on a rotation basis to tow your vehicle. This process is generally more expensive than if you choose your own company.

- ✓ When your vehicle is towed, it will be stored by the company that towed it. Storage charges
 are assessed by each calendar day. The sooner you pay and pick up your car, the less the
 charge.
- ✓ If the Sheriff's Office has requested a tow of your vehicle and were unable to contact you, with proof of vehicle ownership, you can have one trip through the vehicle to remove items that are not bolted into the vehicle. This is true unless the vehicle is impounded due to suspicion of criminal activity.
- ✓ If you think you were treated unfairly by a towing company, call the Communication Center at 715-839-4972. The Communication Center will contact the Towing Association president, who will contact you.

TO AMEND SECTION 10.01.170 SPEED LIMIT ON CTH "Q"

This ordinance amends the speed limit on CTH Q according to traffic speed study and public input that was completed. Currently the speed limit is 45 mph from USH 53 east for 0.50 miles. Then it lowers to 35mph until 0.75 miles east of CTH "P". The traffic speed study that was conducted shows that 90% of vehicles traveling through the 35mph zone are speeding in excess of 35 mph. To provide better consistency it's recommended that the speed limit be changed to 40 mph from USH 53 east to 0.75 miles east of CTH "P". This will provide a better speed limit transition as well as meet the speed study requirements per state statute 349.11(1).

- Change existing speed limit on CTH Q from 45mph to 40mph starting at USH 53 east for 0.50 mile.
- Change existing speed limit on CTH Q from 35mph to 40mph from 0.50 mile east of USH 53 east to 0.75 miles west of CTH "P".

Fiscal Impact: \$1,140.00, funds are available and budgeted.

Other outcomes of the ordinance include updates to Chapter 2.44 to recognize the sustainability work the department of planning and development is developing, eliminates sections of the code the department no longer oversees or is outdated text, and updates the department's program responsibilities.

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Eau Claire does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. That paragraphs 5., 7., and 8. of Subsection A. of Section 2.04.455 of the code be amended to read:

- 5. Report on all matters relating to town boundaries, municipal annexation studies under 2.44.015 C., and amendments to Chapter 1.08;
- 6. In cooperation with other committees having jurisdiction, it shall report on all matters regarding municipal annexation or detachment of county-owned lands and easements on or over county-owned lands.
- 7. Foster the implementation of the County's Strategic Plan initiatives related to economic development. Oversee county industrial development planning and promotion matters.
- 8. Oversee the county sustainability program. or report on county library service matters.

SECTION 2. That Subsection C. of Section 2.04.455 of the code be amended to read:

C. The committee shall be responsible for the policy oversight of all boards and commissions attached to the department of planning and development under 2.44.020 B. These boards and commissions shall report to the county board through the committee. The committee shall advise the board of all matters pertaining to emergency medical services and perform the duties of the emergency management committee as set forth in Chapter 2.40. This subsection does not apply to the land conservation commission.

SECTION 3. That Subsection A. of Section 2.44.010 of the code be amended to read:

2.44.010 Creation.

A. There is created a department of planning and development under the direction and supervision of a director who shall be appointed under 3.01.010 A. on the basis of recognized interest, administrative ability, training, experience and knowledge of the fields of comprehensive planning, land use management and building code administration, land and water conservation, emergency management, geographic information system (GIS), land information, sustainability, solid waste management, emergency management, and economic and community development.

SECTION 4. That Subsection C. and G. of Section 2.44.015 of the code be amended to read:		
C. Preparation of plans and studies on proposed or possible future municipal annexations and detachments in the county in cooperation with affected municipalities. The department shall also ilsue an analysis of any proposed municipal annexation or detachment of county-owned lands, or easements on or over them, and shall file copies of all executed easement maps in the department;		
G. Support the economic development initiatives as identified in the County's Strategic Plan. Assisting the county board designated agency in the promotion of industrial development in the county by providing authorized land use planning, zoning and surveying assistance as requested.		
SECTION 5. That Section 2.44.020 of the code be amended to read:		
2.44.020 Department divisions programs and attached boards and commissions. A. There are created in the department the divisions programs enumerated in 2.44.030, each to be headed by an administrator appointed by the director of the department with the approval of the committee. Each division program shall have the program responsibilities assigned in this chapter as well as other departmental duties authorized in 2.44.015 that may be delegated thereto by the director. The program administrator of each division shall manager shall be responsible for the programs-oversights therein and shall be accountable to the director. B. The Board of Land Use Appeals and the Land Conservation Commission are attached to the department for administrative purposes.

TO FILE NO. 21-22/080

This ordinance authorizes changes to the Chapters 2.40 of the County Code. These changes include aligning the county's emergency management definitions with state's definitions found in Wis. Stat. Ch. 323.02, it recognizes program staffing changes with the Emergency Management Program Assistant, and creates a chain of command, in the event one or both emergency management staff are unavailable, where the director of planning and development assumes those duties. Lastly, the ordinance eliminates the municipal deputy emergency management coordinator role. The county has a fully staffed emergency management team that can support its program duties.
