Exhibits To E-file or Not to E-file

Any exhibits to be offered into evidence during a hearing should be handled as follows:

Zoom Hearings: Exhibits must be e-filed in advance of the hearing.

Hybrid Hearings:

- If you are appearing remotely, any exhibits must be e-filed in advance of the hearing.
- If you are appearing in person, but other parties are appearing remotely, you must e-file your documentary exhibits in advance of the hearing. If you are offering non-documentary exhibits (videos, etc.), you will need to connect to Zoom on your laptop in the courtroom, and the Court will enable Share Screen. If there is audio, you will need to place the table microphone by your laptop speaker. You will also need to offer this evidence on a DVD or Thumb Drive for retention purposes.

In Person Hearings: Exhibits should NOT be e-filed in advance of the hearing, but offered into evidence during the hearing as was done prior to COVID-19.
