Addressing Jurors

All parties should address jurors/prospective jurors in a non-gender conforming way by utilizing their full name (first and last), or by addressing them as Juror [Last Name] (e.g. Juror Smith).

Posting Cash Bonds or Bail Money in the Jail Kiosk

When someone is depositing funds into the kiosk located in the jail lobby for an incarcerated person, any payer information does not transfer with that deposit. The funds are deposited into a financial account in the jail system for the incarcerated person. Often, people make a deposit into that kiosk with the intent to post a cash bond or to provide bail money for an incarcerated person. If the jail issues a check to the Clerk of Courts office from the incarcerated person's account to pay for a cash bond or bail, that check is provided using the name of the defendant. If there is a refund of all or part of the cash bond or bail, it will be in the form of a check payable to the incarcerated person.

Walk in Warrants

Defendants must first appear in the District Attorney's Office. The DA's Office will then communicate to the Clerk's Office, who will schedule the case(s) for the judge to see on their dashboard. Please do not appear in intake with your client without first going to the DA's Office.
