

**Additional Non-Fiscal Policies, Plans and Ordinances**

Eau Claire County has set forward a wide variety of planning documents, analyses, policies, and ordinances which are intended to guide and direct the County Board's actions and appropriations. These planning processes occur on a variety of timelines, some annually, some as infrequently as every five years. Regardless of when reviewed, they all inform the annual budget process, and often the annual budget informs these processes, as well. Taken in total, this body of work establishes the operational priorities of the County. Administrative staff and the Finance and Budget Committee made specific recommendations relative to the appropriate funding at the departmental and/or programmatic level. The following table identifies the significant impacts of these funding recommendations on ongoing projects and priorities:

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| <a href="#">Land and Water Resource Management (LWRM) Plan</a>             | <p><b>Conservation &amp; Economic Development</b><br/>                     Developed in 2012 in accordance with Wisconsin Statute 92 requirements, this locally developed plan incorporates the input of partners and is recommended by the Land Conservation Commission to the Eau Claire County Board. It is reviewed by the state Land and Water Board. This plan guides and directs all activities in the Land Conservation Division and allows us to be eligible for DATCP grants and funding (SWRM, staffing grants, cost share, nutrient management, etc.).</p>   | Provides guidance for yearly work plan.  |
| <a href="#">Land Information Plan</a>                                      | <p><b>Conservation &amp; Economic Development</b><br/>                     This plan lays out how funds from grants and retained fees will be prioritized. Per Stats. 59.72(3)(b), a “countywide plan for land records modernization” is required for participation in the Wisconsin Land Information Program (WLIP). The purpose of this document is twofold: 1) to meet WLIP funding eligibility requirements necessary for receiving grants and retaining fees for land information, and 2) to plan for county land records modernization in order to improve the efficiency of government and provide improved government services to businesses and county residents.</p> | Provides a three-year work plan just updated for 2022-2024.  |
| <a href="#">Land Stewardship 2150: Eau Claire County, the next century</a> | <p><b>Conservation &amp; Economic Development</b><br/>                     This document provides a very long-term view of what we want the County to look like given the trends that we are seeing today and the need to provide publicly accessible natural spaces.</p>  | The Land Stewardship Subcommittee hopes to finalize this document and forward it to various partner groups and municipalities. They will also provide the final document to the County Board for concurrence prior to that distribution. |
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
