



- 4. In no event would CURT Manufacturing Inc. receive any credit for any principal forgiveness in excess of the original principal amount of the note.

WHEREAS, State Department of Health and Family Services has determined that Eau Claire County's contribution, in order to financially support regional managed care organization(s) and the local aging and disability resource center serving Eau Claire County citizens, is to release and transfer \$1,698,176 or 32.8% in community aids funding in year one, \$1,558,595 in community aids funding in year two, \$1,419,015 in community aids funding in year three, \$1,279,434 in community aids funding in year four and \$1,139,854 or 22% in community aids funding in year five and each ensuing year; and

WHEREAS, the implementation of managed long-term care in Eau Claire County may result in removing more funding than expenses from the Eau Claire County Department of Human Services, resulting in a request for additional county funding which, at this time, is projected to be \$184,372 annually, to support remaining voluntary, involuntary or mandated service responsibilities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors hereby determines that establishing a regional managed long-term care system, including local aging and disability resource centers, is intended to be in the best interest of Eau Claire County residents.

-REAFFIRMING THE AUTHORIZATION OF A QUIT CLAIM DEED BY THE EAU CLAIRE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO THE CITY OF EAU CLAIRE ON JANUARY 25, 1877 FOR BLOCK 11 OF THE PLAT OF THE VILLAGE OF EAU CLAIRE, THEN KNOWN AS "COURTHOUSE SQUARE"; URGING RECOGNITION THEREOF AT WILSON PARK-

WHEREAS, the plat for the "Village of Eau Claire" was filed with Chippewa County before the creation of the County of Eau Claire on October 6, 1856; and

WHEREAS, the Chippewa County Board of Supervisors vacated Block 11 of said plat on June 11, 1856 and named it "Courthouse Square"; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 114 of the Laws of 1856 creating the County of Eau Claire and designating the Village of Eau Claire as the county seat was enacted by Governor Coles Bashford on October 6, 1856; and

WHEREAS, the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors authorized the building of a courthouse on the Emery Street side of "Courthouse Square" on January 14,1862, which housed the county offices until they were moved to the newly constructed 1872 courthouse around 1875; and

WHEREAS, the County Board of Supervisors adopted a resolution on January 25, 1877 authorizing a quit claim deed to the City of Eau Claire for Block 11 of the plat of the Village of Eau Claire, then known as "Courthouse Square", which read as follows:

Resolved that the clerk and chair be, and they are hereby authorized to quit claim to the City of Eau Claire, the "Courthouse Square" on the east side (reserving the building to the county) for a public park when other persons claiming interest therein shall make quit claim deed for such public park to said city.

WHEREAS, it is unknown whether such deed was issued, but the City of Eau Claire did not ever file any such deed with the Eau Claire County Register of Deeds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors that the aforementioned action of the County Board of Supervisors on January 25, 1877 relative to Block 11 of the plat of the Village of Eau Claire, now known as Wilson Park, is hereby reaffirmed.

-OPPOSING THE FOREST-WIDE TRAVEL MANAGEMENT PLAN IN THE CHEQUAMEGON-NICOLET NATIONAL FOREST AS PROPOSED BY THE UNITED STATES FOREST SERVICE-

WHEREAS, the United States Forest Service has published a forest-wide management plan in the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest that proposes closure of 55% of the public roads within the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest; and

WHEREAS, the United States Forest Service fails to recognize the need to manage the national forests as productive managed forests and continues to regulate national forests as though they were national parks, which is contrary to the congressional authority granted to the United States Forest Service for the purchase and management of the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest; and

WHEREAS, the United States Forest Service has not managed the national forests consistent with the provisions of the Clark-McNary Act to furnish a continuous supply of timber for the use and necessities of citizens of the United States; and

WHEREAS, for the most part, these lands were purchased from the counties where said lands are located under the pretext and commitment that these lands would be returned to a forested condition and that these lands would again provide a sound base for the local and regional economy and that local governments would play a major role in the management and operation of the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest; and

WHEREAS, the United States Forest Service has failed to consider the negative impact of reduced employment, and loss of local and state tax generation, that otherwise would be created by tourism opportunities that rely on motorized access to public lands within counties and communities where the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest is located in its recently published United States Forest Service's Travel Management Project Environmental Assessment; and

WHEREAS, lands within the national forests should be accessible to the citizens of these United States of America and not just experienced from the edges of the forest boundaries along major highways; and

WHEREAS, the proposed closure of the roads in the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest eliminates a reasonable level of public access to recreational pursuits including but not limited to hunting, fishing, wood cutting, mushroom and berry picking, birding, wildlife viewing, ATV and snowmobile travel and general access by the

young, elderly, physically and/or mentally impaired, or provide emergency and/or rescue services to visitors to the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest; and

WHEREAS, the lands within the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest boundaries are not large tracts of contiguous property such as within national parks but include significant private property that relies upon travel on these roads for a variety of purposes such as access to employment, their private lands, routes for emergency vehicles and emergency evacuation routes in times of disaster; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be presented to President George Bush, Secretary of the Interior, Secretary of the Department of Agriculture, Chief of the Forest Service, Joan Marburger, project coordinator, Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest, all Wisconsin federal representatives, Governor James Doyle, U.S. senators Russell D. Feingold, and Herbert H. Kohl, representative Steve Kagen, state legislator Jeffrey Mursau and area Wisconsin state representatives, and respectfully request that all counties that contain any lands designated as the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest concur and take similar action.

-TO RECOGNIZE THE VALUE OF LOCALLY IDENTIFIED PRIORITIES IN COUNTY LAND AND WATER RESOURCE MANAGEMENT PLANS-

WHEREAS, local land and water conservation planning and program implementation are necessary to reverse the effects of excessive soil erosion and non-point sources of pollution to state waters; and

WHEREAS, every county has its own unique land and water resource issues based on local land use trends, topography, soils and hydrology; and

WHEREAS, counties are required to identify their local land and water conservation priorities, the foundation of their land and water resource management plans, based on input from county landowners, and are written in direct cooperation with the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture Trade and Consumer Protection with available data from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources; and

WHEREAS, such land and water resource management plan shall include an assessment of water quality and soil conditions throughout the county, specify water quality objectives and identify conservation practices to achieve the water quality and tolerable erosion levels for each water basin, priority watershed and priority lake, identify applicable performance standards and prohibitions related to the control of pollution from non-point sources and to soil erosion control, include a multi-year description of planned county activities related to land and water resources, including those designed to meet the water quality objectives specified and to ensure compliance with standards and prohibitions, describe a system to monitor the progress of planned activities, a strategy to provide information and education related to land and water resource management and describe methods for coordinating plan activities with programs of other local, state and federal agencies; and

WHEREAS, these land and water resource management plans are submitted to the land and water conservation board members for approval and adoption to maintain eligibility for continued state funding for county land conservation; and

WHEREAS, as a part of maintaining this state priority, the Department of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection developed an agreement with Wisconsin counties in 2004 to maintain a level of funding that would ensure the capacity that counties had developed to enact their land and water resource management plans would be secure in the future.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Land Conservation Commission requests that the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection allocation plan recognize the value of each county's land and water resource management plan priorities, not just a single statewide priority, but as a plan to address unique and local needs and asks that funding levels be restored to our original agreement in 2004 to provide equitable funding for each county's plan.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Board and Land Conservation Commission wants to encourage the Wisconsin legislature to continue funding soil and water resource management protection efforts at a local level according to State Statutes 92.14(6).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Wisconsin taxpayer dollars, currently distributed through the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection, are state grant funds allocated to address all the land and water priorities, goals and objectives as spelled out in each individual county's land and water resource management plan.

WHEREAS, adoption of Act 42 in the last session of the Wisconsin legislature effectively eliminated local municipal control by nullifying local franchise agreements and limiting state regulation of video service providers; and

WHEREAS, adoption of Act 42 further limited the effectiveness of PEG access channels by ending local requirements that video service providers fund PEG access channels with designated monthly fees and provide other important services PEG access channels; and

WHEREAS, Act 42 failed to require standards to assure that PEG channels are transmitted with the same technical quality as other cable channels; and

WHEREAS, proponents of Act 42 promised increases in cable competition, lower costs for consumers and thousands of new good-paying jobs; however, consumers have received cost increases, no new alternatives in the Chippewa Valley, and communication companies have announced significant layoffs of communication workers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Eau Claire County expresses its opposition to Charter Communications' plan to digitalize and move local PEG access channels on the basic tier of service.

WHEREAS, it is everyone's right to breathe clean indoor air; and

WHEREAS, the most effective way to protect employees and public health from the hazards of secondhand smoke is to completely eliminate secondhand smoke by creating smoke-free environments; and

WHEREAS, the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors is responsible for developing policy and providing leadership that emphasizes public health needs and assuring that measures are taken to provide an environment in which individuals can be healthy.

-SUPPORTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A HOUSEHOLD PHARMACEUTICAL COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL DAY AND A PERMANENT HOUSEHOLD PHARMACEUTICAL COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL PROGRAM FOR EAU CLAIRE COUNTY-

WHEREAS, Eau Claire County citizens, businesses, industries, villages, towns and municipalities depend on proper management of all waste to protect human health and the environment and to promote continued economic development and the welfare of future generations; and

WHEREAS, unused, unwanted or excess pharmaceuticals and other medications are being indefinitely stored or disposed of improperly, which can lead to the accidental poisoning of children and pets, drug abuse, criminal activity and negative environmental impacts; and

WHEREAS, a 2000 USGS survey of 139 streams in 39 states, including Wisconsin, found an average of 7 to 38 pharmaceutical related contaminants like steroids, hormones and antibiotics, and this condition is only exacerbated with improper disposal; and

WHEREAS, the continued disposal of unused, unwanted or excess pharmaceuticals will only increase the high levels of endocrine disruptors in our waterways resulting in an unhealthy and dramatic decrease in some male fish populations and causing some feminization or sterilization of male fish; and

WHEREAS, unused, unwanted or excess pharmaceuticals are being flushed into individual on-site or municipal wastewater systems or thrown in the trash and there is not a satisfactory collection and disposal option available to most Eau Claire County residents; and

WHEREAS, county and City of Eau Claire law enforcement agencies have indicated that pharmaceuticals have a role in Eau Claire County and Eau Claire City crime; and

WHEREAS, stakeholders and partners including natural resource organizations, health care facilities, nursing and assisted living facilities, law enforcement agencies, pharmacies and residents are interested in properly collecting and disposing of unused, unwanted or excess household pharmaceuticals; and

WHEREAS, the Eau Claire County Prescription Drug Work Group was organized in 2008 to investigate the development of a collection program for unused, unwanted and excess pharmaceutical products; and

WHEREAS, the prescription drug work group has analyzed the issues resulting from the accumulation and/or improper disposal of unused, unwanted or excess pharmaceuticals, investigated the applicable rules, regulations and guidelines for pharmaceutical collection and disposal, reviewed programs established by other Wisconsin jurisdictions, concluded that there is a great need for a household pharmaceutical collection and disposal program, developed a framework for a "one-day event" collection and disposal program and a permanent collection and disposal program, investigated using funding available from the current solid waste recycling fees, donations and private partnerships.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors does hereby support the implementation of a household pharmaceutical collection and disposal program that meets local, state and federal regulations, that provides the service to county residents, that uses environmentally sound means to dispose of the collected pharmaceuticals, that is funded from the current solid waste recycling fees, donations and private partnerships.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors does hereby support a "one-day event" collection and disposal program at two locations within the county that meets the local, state and federal criteria using the resources available from county departments, City of Eau Claire departments, private partners, related businesses and volunteers.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors does hereby support the establishment of a "permanent" collection and disposal program for household pharmaceuticals in compliance with local, state and federal criteria using the resources available from county departments, City of Eau Claire departments, private partners, private citizens, related businesses, grants as available and volunteers.

WHEREAS, establishing a uniform County Vehicle Use Policy consistent with attachment A is in the best interest of Eau Claire County; and


WHEREAS, the use of county vehicles for commuting should be subject to authorization of the department head and the county administrator; and

-TO REPEAL AND RECREATE SECTION 18.30.260 OF THE CODE: PERSONAL (SMALL /RESIDENTIAL) WIND ENERGY SYSTEMS-

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Eau Claire does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. That Section 18.30.260 of the code be repealed and recreated to read:

18.30.260 Wind energy systems.

- A. Purpose. The purpose of this section is to provide a regulatory framework for wind energy systems that will preserve and protect public health and safety.
 - B. Definitions. For the purpose of this section, the following definitions shall apply:
 - 1. "FAA" means the Federal Aviation Administration.
- 2. "Inhabited structure" means a structure that is used as a residence, school, hospital, church, public library, place of employment, or any other structure that is used for a similar purpose.
- 3. "Landowner" means the person that owns the property on which a wind energy system is located.
- 4. Large wind energy system" means a single wind energy system that includes a tower and wind generator that has a nameplate capacity of more than 100 kilowatts or a total height of more than 170 feet, or both, and is primarily used to generate electricity for off-site customers.
- 5. "MET tower" means a tower, including any anchor, base, base plate, boom, cable, electrical or electronic equipment, guy wire, hardware, indicator, instrument, telemetry device, vane, or wiring, that is used to collect or transmit meteorological data, including wind speed and wind flow information, in order to monitor or characterize wind resources at or near a wind energy system.
- 6. "Nonparticipating property" means any separate, saleable parcel of real property that is not included as part of the property on which a wind energy system authorized or permitted under this section is located.
 - 7. "Owner" means the person or entity that owns the wind energy system.
- 8. "Participating property" means a separate, saleable parcel of real property on which a wind energy system authorized or permitted under this section has been located.
- 9. "Shadow flicker" means the effect that results when the shadow cast by the rotating blade of a wind energy system moves across a fixed point.
- 10. "Small wind energy system" means one or more wind energy systems that have a single or combined nameplate capacity of 100 kilowatts or less, have a total height of 170 feet or less, and are primarily used to generate electricity for use by their owner.
- 11. "Total height" means the vertical distance from the ground level to the tip of a wind generator blade when the tip of the blade is at its highest point.
- 12. "Tower" means either the freestanding, guyed, or monopole structure that supports a wind generator, including any guy wires and anchors used to support a guyed tower.
- 13. "Wind energy system" means equipment that converts and then stores or transfers energy from the wind into usable forms of energy and includes any base, blade, foundation, generator, nacelle, rotor, tower, transformer, vane, wire, inverter, batteries or other components used in the system.
- 14. "Wind energy system research facility" means a site where testing of one or more small wind energy systems, one or more large wind energy systems, or a combination of one or more small wind energy systems and large wind energy systems occurs, including but not limited to testing for electrical output, operation in different wind conditions, and sound generation.
- 15. "Wind farm system" means a group of two or more wind energy systems, except a dual single-family residential small wind energy system.
- 16. "Wind generator" means blades and associated mechanical and electrical conversion components mounted on the top of the tower.
- 17. "Windmill aerator" means a device powered by wind that pumps air into water that includes but is not limited to a tower, a multiple-blade rotor, gearbox, tail, a pump, and tubing.

- 18. "Windmill water pump" or "water pump" means a device powered by wind that pumps water that includes, but is not limited to, a tower, a multiple-blade rotor, gear box, tail, pump, and piping.
- C. Exemptions for windmill aerators and windmill water pumps the standards and requirements set forth under this Section (Section 18.30.260) of the Eau Claire County Code shall not apply to windmill aerators and windmill water pumps.
 - D. General siting standards
 - 1. Location.
- a. An individual large wind energy system or wind farm system may be allowed as a conditional use only in areas that are zoned as follows and are subject to the locational exceptions noted in par. d. and e., below:
 - i. A-1 Exclusive Agricultural District;
 - ii. A-3 Agricultural District;
 - iii. C-1 Neighborhood Business District;
 - iv. C-2 General Business District;
 - v. C-3 Highway Business District;
 - vi. I-1 Nonsewered Industrial District;
 - vii. I-2 Sewered Industrial District.
- b. A wind energy system research facility or MET tower may be allowed as a conditional use only in areas that are zoned as follows and are subject to the locational exceptions noted in par. d. and e., below:
 - i. A-1 Exclusive Agricultural District;
 - ii. A-3 Agricultural District;
 - iii. I-1 Nonsewered Industrial District;
 - iv. I-2 Sewered Industrial District.
- c. A small wind energy system is a permitted use in any district, subject to the locational exceptions noted in par. d., below.
 - d. Wind energy systems are not allowed in the following locations:
- i. A wetland within the shoreland-wetland district as designated in Section 18.19.040 A of the Eau Claire County Code;
 - ii. A floodplain except as otherwise permitted in Chapter 18.20 of the Eau

Claire County Code.

- e. Large wind energy systems, wind energy system research facility, and wind farm systems are not allowed in the following locations:
 - i. State or county forests, hunting areas, lake accesses, natural areas or
 - ii. On any property where a public historical, cultural or archeological

resource is located.

parks;

- 2. Setbacks.
- a. Large wind energy systems. The center of a tower for a large wind energy system, each individual wind energy system in a wind farm system, a MET tower, and each individual wind energy system in a wind energy system research facility must be set back:
- i. At least 1.2 times the total height of an individual large wind energy system or 1.2 times the total height of the tallest individual wind energy system in a wind farm system or a wind energy research facility from the property line of a participating property;
- ii. At least 1.2 times the total height of the large wind energy system or 500 feet, whichever is greater, from any public road, railroad, or power line right-of-way;
- iii. At least 1,000 feet from an inhabited structure on a nonparticipating property;
- iv. At least 1,000 feet from any state or county forest, hunting area, lake access, natural area, or park;
 - v. At least 1,000 feet from any public historical, cultural and

archeological resource area.

- b. Small wind energy systems. The center of a tower of a small wind energy system shall be set back:
- i. At least 1.2 times its total height from the property line of the participating property;

ii. At least 1.2 times its total height from any public road, railroad, or

power line right-of-way;

- c. Any anchors for guy wires for a guyed tower for any type of wind energy system shall meet the setback requirements for accessory structures in the zoning district that they are located in.
 - Spacing and density.
- a. Small wind energy systems, large wind energy systems, and every individual wind energy system within a wind farm system must be separated from every other wind energy system by a sufficient distance so that they do not interfere with the other wind energy systems.
- b. Spacing of wind energy systems in a wind energy system research facility may be varied to study the level of wind interference with other wind energy systems.
- 4. Shadow flicker. The shadow flicker generated by a large wind energy system, any individual wind energy system in a wind farm system, or any individual wind energy system in a wind energy research facility on December 21 of any calendar year shall not fall on any inhabited structure on a nonparticipating property.

5. Noise.

- a. The sound generated by the operation of a wind energy system or MET tower shall not exceed the ambient sound level at any time by more than 5 dB(A) as measured at any point on property adjacent to the parcel on which the wind energy system or MET tower is located. A greater setback than required in Section 18.30.260 D.2., may be required to satisfy this requirement, unless a waiver has been granted in accord with c., below. This shall include sound generated by a large wind energy system or wind farm system if furling occurs during high wind conditions.
- b. If two or more complaints about noise are filed by two or more property owners on nonparticipating property adjacent to a wind energy system or MET tower, the county may request an investigation by the city-county health department or use a noise measuring contractor/consultant, at the expense of the person or persons filing the complaint, to ensure that the sound level generated by the operation of the wind energy system does not exceed the ambient sound level by more than 5 dB(A). Sound levels shall be determined during the investigation of a noise complaint by comparing the sound level measured when the wind generator blades are rotating and the wind generator is in operation to the sound level measured when the wind generator blades are stopped and the wind generator is not in operation. Any noise level that falls between two whole decibels shall be the higher of the two for both the measurement of the ambient noise level and the measurement of the noise in excess of the ambient noise level generated by the wind energy system.
- c. If the sound level generated by the operation of a wind energy system or MET tower exceeds the ambient sound level by more than 5 dB(A), a waiver to the maximum allowable increase in the sound level as specified in a, above, may be granted by the supervisor of land use controls provided written consent from the affected property owners on nonparticipating properties has been submitted stating that they are aware of the noise limitations imposed by this ordinance and that they consent to allow sound levels to exceed the maximum allowable increase in sound level. If the owner of a wind energy system or MET tower wishes the waiver to apply to succeeding owners of the property, either a permanent noise impact easement or easement for the life of the wind energy system or MET tower shall be recorded in the Eau Claire County Register of Deeds office which describes the benefited and burdened properties and which advises all subsequent owners of the burdened property that noise levels in excess of those permitted by this ordinance may exist on the burdened property.
- d. If the sound level generated by the operation of a wind energy system or MET tower exceeds the ambient sound level by more than 5 dB (A), the owner of the wind energy system shall reimburse the persons filing the complaint for the cost of an investigation conducted by the Eau Claire City-County Health Department or noise measuring contractor/consultant. The owner of the wind energy system shall pay for all of the costs for preparing and recording any waivers authorized in accord with subsection c., above.
 - E. General construction standards.
 - 1. Structure type.
- a. Any type of tower construction, including a guy-wired tower, a free-standing lattice tower, or a monopole tower, may be used for the installation of a small wind energy system whose generator has a nameplate rating of 30 kilowatts or less.
- b. Wind energy systems, other than small wind energy systems with a generator nameplate rating of 30 kilowatts or less, must be of monopole construction unless it can be shown that it will

significantly increase the cost to construct the system, or unless it can be shown that monopole construction will cause undue environmental degradation.

- c. If it can be shown that constructing a wind energy system, other than a small wind energy system with a generator nameplate rating of 30 kilowatts or less, on a monopole tower will significantly increase the cost of a wind energy system, then the wind energy system must be of freestanding construction unless it can be shown that a freestanding method of construction will significantly increase the cost to construct the wind energy system, or unless it can be shown that a freestanding method of construction will cause undue environmental degradation.
- d. In the event that it can be shown that constructing a wind energy system, other than a small wind energy system with a generator nameplate rating of 30 kilowatts or less, by monopole construction or by freestanding construction will significantly increase the cost of a wind energy system or cause undue environmental degradation, then a wind energy system be constructed using a guyed tower construction method.
- e. MET towers that are placed temporarily and will be removed within 1 year from the date that they were constructed, are exempt from the requirements in a., b., and c., above.

2. Height.

- a. The total height of a large wind energy system, any individual wind energy system within a wind farm system, a MET tower, and any individual wind energy system in a wind energy system research facility shall not exceed 500 feet.
- b. The total height of a small wind energy system or a dual single-family residential small wind energy system shall not exceed 170 feet.

3. Access.

- a. Any component of a large wind energy system, individual wind energy system in a wind farm system, MET tower, or wind energy system research facility shall be secured against unauthorized access by means of a locked barrier or security fence, including any climbing aids.
- b. The tower of a wind energy system shall be designed and installed so as to not provide step bolts or a ladder readily accessible to the public for a minimum height of 12 feet above the ground. Any climbing aid necessary for the tower shall be removed and stored at another location or kept within a locked barrier or security fence.

4. Blade Clearance.

- a. Large wind energy system The vertical distance from the ground level to the tip of a blade of a large wind energy system or any individual large wind energy system in a wind farm system when the blade is at its lowest point shall be at least 75 feet.
- b. Small wind energy system The vertical distance from the ground level to the tip of a blade of a small wind energy system when the blade is at its lowest point shall be at least 30 feet.
- 5. Electrical wires. All electrical wires, other than wires necessary to connect the wind generator to the tower wiring, the tower wiring to the disconnect junction box, and the grounding wires, shall be located underground.
- 6. Lighting. A wind energy system may not be artificially lighted unless such lighting is required by the FAA. If lighting is required, the lighting must comply with the FAA minimum requirements and, whenever, possible, be at the lowest intensity allowed, avoid the use of strobe or other intermittent white lights, and use steady red lights. If more than one lighting alternative is available, the alternative that causes the least visual disturbance shall be used.
- 7. Appearance, color and finish. The exterior surface of any visible component of a-any type of wind energy system shall comply with the following:
- a. The design of buildings and all structures shall use materials, colors, textures, screening and landscaping so that they do not stand out or are not grossly conspicuous within the surrounding natural setting and existing environment and shall not be reflective;
- b. Blades on rotors may be flat black in color to absorb solar radiation in order to minimize icing of blades in the winter;
- 8. Equipment. Any electrical equipment associated with any type of wind energy system shall be located on the property where the wind energy system is located, and shall meet all of the appropriate setbacks for accessory structures within the underlying zoning district.
- 9. Signs. No signs advertising or promoting any product or service shall be allowed on any part of any type of wind energy system, except warning signs intended for public safety shall be allowed and other signs such as owner identification signs may be allowed in accord with Chapter 18.26 of the Eau Claire County Code.

- 10. Land disturbance. All land disturbance shall comply with the requirements in Chapter 17.05 of the Eau Claire County Code.
- 11. Parking areas and driveways. Areas permanently designated for vehicular movement and parking shall be finished with an all-weather dust-free surface with proper surface drainage in accord with Section 18.25.010 H. of the Eau Claire County Code.

12. Code compliance.

- a. A wind energy system or MET tower must comply with the National Electric Code, and all applicable state and federal codes and regulations.
- b. All electrical work done on a wind energy system or MET tower shall be done by a state licensed electrician.

13. Signal interference.

- a. Certification shall be submitted at the time of application for an individual large wind energy system, a wind farm system, MET tower, or wind energy system research facility by an individual with appropriate professional credentials to provide certification, that every reasonable step has been taken to prevent or eliminate any interference with the transmission and reception of electromagnetic communications, such as, but not limited to, microwave, radio, telephone or television signals.
- b. The owner of a small wind energy system must take reasonable steps to prevent and eliminate any interference with the transmission and reception of electromagnetic communications, such as microwave, radio, telephone, or television signals.
- c. A small wind energy system, MET tower, an individual large energy system, wind farm system, or wind energy system research facility may not be located within an emergency communication corridor, which is defined as the area within 500 feet of a line connecting a specific pair of communication towers used for emergency service purposes.

F. Permitting.

- 1. Submittal requirements for permit applications for wind energy systems and MET towers the following information shall be submitted for applications for wind energy systems and MET towers:
 - a. The name, address and telephone number of the applicant;
- b. The name, address and telephone number of the property owner and documentation of land ownership or legal control of the property;
- c. A copy of a lease or easement authorizing the use of the property if the property owner and the owner of the wind energy system are not the same;
- d. A site plan, drawn to scale, shall be submitted, including the following information: the location of the proposed wind energy system and any appurtenant equipment or structures associated with the system on the participating property; the location of any road, railroad, and power line right-of-way; interconnection points with the electrical grid, if any;
- e. A map, drawn to scale, illustrating the general location of the small wind energy system, large wind energy system, or individual wind energy systems in a wind farm system, and showing the location of the following within 1,000 feet: wetlands; floodplains; any state or county forest, hunting area, lake access, natural area, or park; any public historical, cultural, and/or archeological resource area; and any inhabited structure on adjoining non-participating properties;
- f. Specifications for the wind energy system, including the manufacturer, model, capacity, blade length, clearance, and total height, means of interconnecting with the electrical grid, and accessory equipment and structures;
 - g. The cost of the wind energy system and cost to install it;
- h. A map illustrating the area subject to shadow flicker for a large wind energy system or all individual wind energy systems in a wind farm system at noon on December 21 of any calendar year;
- i. For large wind energy systems, information shall be submitted by a sound engineer or other individual qualified to submit the information, verifying that the individual large wind energy system or wind farm system will not exceed the noise restrictions established in Subsection 18.30.260 D.5.;
- j. Information regarding reasonable steps to prevent or eliminate any interference with the transmission and reception of electromagnetic communications as required in 18.30.260 E.13.;
- 2. Conditional Use Permits required for large wind energy systems. A conditional use permit is required for the installation of an individual large wind energy system, a wind farm system, a wind energy system research facility, or MET tower. Issuance of a conditional use permit shall be based upon meeting all of the requirements specified in this section, the requirements of Chapter 18.21 for conditional uses, and upon a finding

that the individual large wind energy system, wind farm system, wind energy system research facility, or MET tower is consistent with the purpose of the zoning code in Section 18.01.010.

Land Use Permits. A land use permit shall be required for a small wind energy system, MET tower, an individual large wind energy system or wind farm system.

- Any type of wind energy system that is out of service (not in operation) for a continuous period of 12 months will be deemed abandoned. The supervisor of land use controls may issue a Notice of Abandonment to the owner.
- If, within 30 days of receipt of a Notice of Abandonment, the owner provides the supervisor of land use controls with information showing that a wind energy system has not been abandoned, the notice shall be withdrawn.
- If the Notice of Abandonment is not withdrawn, a wind energy system must be removed within 180 days of the notice, and the site must be reclaimed to a depth of 4 feet, except that the owners of small wind energy systems having a nameplate rating of 30kWh or less are not required to remove foundations and guy anchors. If the owner fails to remove the wind energy system and reclaim the site, the county may remove or cause to be removed the wind energy system and may reclaim the site or cause the site to be reclaimed at the owners expense.

F. No model home or temporary real estate sales office shall incorporate outside lighting which creates a nuisance due to glare or intensity or contains flashing or intermittent lighting. All lighting shall be shielded and directed downward.

G. All signage shall comply with the sign regulations as contained in Section 18.25 of this chapter.

H. The office must be removed from the development within five (5) years from its date of the land use permit or until eighty-five (85) percent of the development is complete, whichever occurs first.

SECTION 2. That Subsection C. of Section 18.60.070 of the code be amended to read:

C. If the proposed development is approved by the department and meets the building requirements of the affected municipality, a building permit may be issued by the municipality. 2.20.040 Land management. The FBCR shall have charge of such land as was set aside on November 18, 1947, and subsequent thereto, by the board as and for beaver creek reserve purposes. The land and the structures situated thereupon shall be utilized for the educational and recreational benefit of those defined in 2.20.010. Rules and regulations may be adopted by the FBCR, for the usage of said facilities, consistent with the purpose of the beaver creek reserve.

2.20.060 Contributions to educational and recreational activities. The FBCR is empowered, on behalf of and in the name of Eau Claire County, to accept monetary contributions or donations of property to be utilized in the creation, promotion and conducting of educational and recreational programs of the beaver creek reserve which are consistent with the statement of purpose in 2.20.010.



Report of the Committee on Planning & Development

ANALYSIS

On Tuesday, April 29, 2008, the committee on planning and development convened a public hearing to consider the rezoning petition of Mark Erickson, petitioner for HiteTrust, owner, to rezone a parcel of land from the A-1 Exclusive Agricultural District to the A-2 Agriculture-Residential District. The property is described as follows: Part of the NE¼, NW¼, Section 10, T26N, R8W, Town of Washington, lying north of County Road I/Otter Creek Road except the east 900 feet; and part of the NW¼, NW¼, Section 10, T26N, R8W, Town of Washington, lying north of County Road I/Otter Creek Road except the west 275 feet. The property is located on the north side of County Road I/Otter Creek Road, immediately northeast of the intersection of County Road I/Otter Creek Road and County Road IJ.

Staff presented a staff report recommending that the committee file a recommendation to the county board to deny the rezoning petition because the rezoning petition did not meet all of the required standards for rezoning property from the A-1 District to another zoning district. Rezoning would allow for non-farm residential use of the property, and this could result in future conflicts with agricultural uses in the vicinity. Rezoning the property would be inconsistent with the county and town land use plans. The Washington Town Board had voted to deny the rezoning petition at a regular town board meeting held on April 3, 2008.

Under state statutes, when the town board recommends denial of the request prior to the public hearing, the committee must either recommend denial of the rezoning request or recommend approval with changes to proposed rezoning.

The committee considered the public testimony, the town board's action, staff analysis and statutory requirements and voted to recommend denial of the petition.





Those concerns have been answered and addressed, thanks to the Commission members and staff.

She has tackled some ough budget, tenant, and construction problems, and has helped guide us through an excellent strategic planning process this Spring. Our commission meetings are well organized, and we have excellent attendance and participation by all. Our commission members bring a lot of aviation and business sense to the table, and we have very productive liscussions. I now feel that CVRA is on good footings to develop in a sensible and cost-effective manner to serve the esidents and businesses of this region. Thanks to hard work by our commission officers and staff, we were presented with a balanced budget for 2009 that meets our needs without having to ask for a greater subsidy from the two counties than they authorized in earlier discussions.

In your capacity as County Board Chair, you have asked the Circuit Court to provide comments on jail location and jail facilities. There are three important considerations from the perspective of the judiciary: 1.) The need to have the county jail in close proximity to the courts; 2.) The need to ensure public safety; and 3.) The need to have a safe and functional jail that facilitates adequate treatment and services to inmates.

1. The jail and courts must be in close proximity to each other.

Court appearances by jail inmates fill a substantial part of the court's daily calendar. It is important to co-locate a county jail with not only the courts, but also with a myriad of other offices, agencies and departments providing services to jail inmates. Court appearances by jail inmates usually require the coordination of many calendars; the judge, the clerk of court, the district attorney, the defense attorney, probation agents, human services department social workers, child support case workers, and bailiffs at a minimum. For the most part, these individuals have their offices in the courthouse, or close by, and meeting with jail inmates, both before and after court appearances, is an essential and common practice. If the jail is not within easy walking distance of the courtrooms, the professional responsibilities of these other necessary individuals becomes more difficult and time consuming, with resulting increased costs to the public. As meetings with jail inmates by clerks, attorneys, probation agents, social workers, case workers and others become more difficult and time consuming, the courts' calendars will also dramatically slow down. Our ability to expeditiously hold court hearings and dispose of cases will be impaired resulting in increased costs, not the least of which is increased time spent by inmates in the jail.

Another consequence of the jail and courts not being close to one another is the court calendar delay occasioned by the sheriff having to transport jail inmates back and forth between two remote locations for almost all significant criminal court appearances. Not only would timeliness of the regular criminal court calendar be severely hampered, but the effectiveness of recent initiatives such as Drug Court, AIM Court and Mental Health Court would suffer as well. Jail inmates awaiting resolution of their cases make frequent court appearances, sometimes on very short notice, and their physical proximity to the courtrooms is indispensable for a well-run, efficient and fair criminal justice system.

Questions have been asked about the placement of one courtroom at a remote jail site. Given the limited number of court branches in Eau Claire County, the percentage of the judicial caseloads devoted to criminal matters and the difficulty of involving other justice system participants discussed above, hearings at a remote jail site would be completely unworkable.

2. The need to ensure public safety.

Although the responsibility of inmate security primarily lies with the sheriff, that responsibility becomes shared with the judicial branch of government when inmates appear in court. When jail inmates, courthouse employees and the public are brought together in a public setting, public safety becomes a shared concern between the courts, the sheriff and the county board. Experience demonstrates regularly physically transporting large numbers of jail inmates between remote locations is not consistent with public safety. Regularly moving large numbers of jail inmates in and out of buildings, through public streets and up and down public hallways is a security risk to inmates, sheriff's bailiffs, courthouse employees and members of the public.

3. <u>The jail must be safe and functional to facilitate adequate treatment and services to inmates.</u>

There are a number of treatment programs and services that could and should be provided to jail inmates to assist them in successfully transitioning to the community that cannot be provided in the current jail on a consistent and safe basis.

The treatment court programs (Drug Court, AIM Court and Mental Health Court) developed in Eau Claire County, as well as AODA, educational and work programs require the direct assistance of volunteers in the jail. Those volunteers cannot be safely accommodated in the current jail.

The above-mentioned programs would be better served with actual programming in the jail. The current jail is not large enough, nor configured appropriately to provide the services and programming on a regular, ongoing basis. If Eau Claire County is to continue on the present course of providing necessary rehabilitative services and treatment to those incarcerated, provision must be made for a safe and appropriate place to do so.

Thank you for sharing a recent Eau Claire County Resolution with me. I value the correspondence I get from people in Wisconsin and welcome this opportunity to address your concerns.

As someone who has worked hard in the Senate to protect our environment, I am concerned about the proper protection of wetlands. The wetlands of this country are invaluable resources that provide habitat for thousands of plant and animal species. Unfortunately, they are disappearing at an alarming rate, and we must remain committed to their protection and preservation.

As you may know, S. 1870, the Clean Water Authority Restoration Act of 2007, which I co-sponsored, was introduced by Senator Russell Feingold (D-WI) on July 25, 2007. This legislation would amend the Federal Water Pollution Control Act to replace the term "navigable waters," throughout the Act, with the term "waters of the United States." This legislation would also affirm Congress's constitutional authority to regulate the nation's waters and wetlands so that our waterways will be protected by federal law. I am hopeful that ultimate changes in the law will provide a reasonable approach for states and individuals which are making a concerted effort to protect wetlands.

Currently, S. 1870 has been referred to the Senate Committee on Environment and Public Works, of which I am not a member. Please be assured that I will keep your thoughts in mind if this legislation is brought before the Senate.

While the Clean Water Act has had many successes, we clearly need to move aggressively to provide stronger and more comprehensive protection of our water resources. Should this issue come before the Senate in the future, please know that I will continue to work for long-term environmental protections.

Again, thank you for contacting me. I appreciate knowing your thoughts on this important issue.

The following are the basic procedures for conducting the Committee of the Whole Meeting for the proposed 2009 budget:

- 1. Section 2.04.170 of the Code provides that the County Board Rules of Procedures apply except:
 - A. Members can speak from their seats no more than twice on an issue.
 - B. A vote by division of the house can be requested at any time.
 - C. There is no power to recess or postpone consideration of the matters before the Committee of the Whole.
- 2. Section 2.04.170 of the Code also provides the County Board shall resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole as the seventh order of business at the budget adoption meeting and that the First Vice Chair takes over as the Chair of the Committee of the Whole.
- 3. The motion to go into the Committee of the Whole is as follows: "I move we resolve into a Committee of the Whole to consider the 2009 County budget". The motion needs to be seconded and is debatable and adopted by a majority vote. At this time the Chair steps down and the First Vice Chair takes over as the Chair of the Committee of the Whole.
- 4. Debate can be limited during the Committee of the Whole by calling the previous question, which requires six (6) seconds per Section 2.04.240 of the Code.
- 5. Any resolution originating with the Committee of the Whole can be amended and all amendments that are adopted are incorporated into the resolution, which would be presented to the County Board.

- 6. If the Committee wishes to adjourn, one must do the following: MEMBER: "I move that the Committee rise". A second is required followed by a vote. The Committee Chair then reports: "The Committee of the Whole has had under consideration the proposed 2009 Eau Claire County budget and has come to no conclusion thereon and asks leave to sit again at _______." This should be seconded and voted on by the County Board. (Majority vote required).
- 7. When the Committee of the Whole has completed its business, it should be dissolved as follows: MEMBER: "I move that the Committee rise and report". (A second is necessary). The presiding officer of the assembly resumes the Chair. The Committee Chair returns to his or her place in the board room in front of the presiding officer and addresses the Chair as follows: COMMITTEE CHAIR: "Mr. Chair, the Committee of the Whole has had under consideration the proposed 2009 Eau Claire County budget and has directed me to report the same as follows". The Committee Chair reads the resolution and amendments and hands them to the Chair who has them read again. The Chair then puts the question on all of the amendments at one time, unless a member asks for a separate vote on one or more of the amendments. Amendments can be debated further and amended in the County Board meeting as can a main question. After amendments are handled, then the question is put on the resolution as amended.

For additional information see <u>Robert's Rules of Order</u>, pp. 63-65. Please note that if there is a conflict between <u>Robert's</u> and the County Code, the County Code provision prevails.

Dear Gregg and Board Supervisors,

I am writing to provide an update on the state's efforts to prepare for the passage of the federal Economic Stimulus Package.

I continue to work with the Governors' Office and the Joint Finance Committee in anticipation of the passage of the federal Economic Stimulus Package. Specifics of the package are changing by the day, but I expect we will know final details soon.

To prepare for the possible federal dollars, there are several avenues to communicate requests. If you have not sent requests to me, please do. Also, the Regional Planning Commissions have been in touch with the US Office of Commerce through the Economic Development Administration. It would be good for you to be in touch with our local Regional Planning Commission.

Recently the Governor created an Office of Recovery and Reinvestment to serve as a clearinghouse for information regarding needed projects and the Stimulus Package. The Governor also created a website for submitting requests for projects to this new office.

This website is an additional avenue for submitting information regarding your projects. Details can be found at www.recovery.wisconsin.gov.

I expect final approval of the Stimulus Package soon. It is likely the state will take up its own version of a Stimulus Package next week. The primary purpose of this bill is to maintain the financial solvency of the state through this fiscal year which ends on June 30th. Likely included in the bill will be a mechanism for legislative oversight of the dollars the state is to receive from the federal government.

Next week, the Governor is also expected to unveil his 2009-'11 State Budget. The state faces an estimated \$5.8 billion deficit. Even with efforts at the federal level to assist states, we are going to be faced with serious budget cuts.

As you consider the local implications of the Governor's proposals, please communicate your concerns with me. I can best advocate for resources for local government and our schools when I know the details of difficult decisions your face.

I appreciate your service to our community. I am available to assist you in any way I can. Please don't hesitate to call.



Janet K. Loomis County Clerk - EAU CLAIRE COUNTY SUPPORT FOR PASSENGER RAIL SERVICE IN THE CHIPPEWA VALLEY AND WEST CENTRAL WISCONSIN -

WHEREAS, Eau Claire County has and will continue to experience population growth; and

WHEREAS, the Chippewa Valley Region and surrounding areas along the Highway I-94 Corridor between Eau Claire and Hudson have also experienced population growth patterns; and

WHEREAS, Eau Claire County is part of the West Central Wisconsin planning region that encompasses the Chippewa Valley and St. Croix Valley areas from Eau Claire/Chippewa Falls through Menomonie and Hudson/River Falls and this area is recognized as the fastest growing population area in the state; and

WHEREAS, this growth will accelerate congestion on our roadways and hasten the need for a six lane I-94 from Hudson to Eau Claire; and

WHEREAS, Federal Officials in the Midwest Regional Rail System report of 2004 and State Officials in the Wisconsin Connections 2030 report have expressed support for passenger rail in Wisconsin, but the West Central Wisconsin area is not included in the immediate planning, but only considered as an area of future concern; and

WHEREAS, This lack of passenger rail could be a detriment to the economic future and quality of life in the Chippewa Valley; and

WHEREAS, The State's own studies already point to the feasibility of rail service to the region in scenarios examined by WisDOT that included an Eau Claire-Hudson-St. Paul Route that showed that implementing intercity passenger rail service to Eau Claire and West Central Wisconsin would improve the overall financial performance of the system; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors, that the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) make the following changes to Chapter 8 of the Connections 2030 Plan:

- 1. Formally adopt the "Eau Claire plus La Crosse" plan for the portion of the rail network between Madison and St. Paul. When fully completed, this would provide frequent passenger trains operating between Chicago, Milwaukee, Madison and St. Paul. Trains would alternate between using the current Amtrak route via La Crosse and Winona, MN; and the Chippewa/St. Croix route via Black River Falls, Eau Claire, Menomonie and Hudson.
- 2. Undertake engineering, environmental impact studies, and other planning activities for the route via Eau Claire/Hudson simultaneously with the La Crosse route to ensure it is a "ready to go" transportation project.
