NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors that the county administrator, or designee, is hereby authorized to execute on behalf of Eau Claire County, wildlife habitat improvement project agreements with the 'Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources with funds appropriated for game habitat improvement in the Parks and Forests Department budget.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the county shall operate and maintain said projects for their intended purpose. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the county's share of the projects may be in-kind labor, equipment, and other costs which will be included in the Parks and Forests Department budget.

WHEREAS, Eau Claire County provides 117,000 meals each year to senior citizens through the senior nutrition program, which 52 percent of these meals are delivered by volunteer drivers to frail elders who are homebound due to the disabilities of aging and are at risk for nutrition related problems and disease. There has been a 4% increase in the demand for Meals on Wheels in just the last year. Total meals have increased by 2,297 during the time period.

The cost of this meal program continues to increase, and these costs are almost totally borne by consumers themselves along with the federal and county governments. Only 14% of our program costs are contributed by the state as compared to 58% by senior consumers themselves (through donations) and 28% by federal funding. 8.6% of Eau Claire County's residents 60+ live below the poverty level.

Studies clearly demonstrate the senior nutrition program's cost effectiveness. Research indicates that adequate nutrition can reduce hospital and other medical treatment costs among older adults and can also play a major prevention role related to heart disease and other illnesses and conditions related to the need for nursing home care. This program is based on the work of over 600 Eau Claire County volunteers as well as senior citizens who are determined to pay their own way to their best ability. Nutrition programs have been a cornerstone of senior services here and around the state for 25 years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors hereby supports a current proposal to add \$2.1 million to the state Department of Health and Family Services budget for the purposes of funding the increased demands for Meals on Wheels and congregate meals for seniors and the increasing burdens on counties to provide meal and dieti.tian services to elders at risk for nutrition related problems and diseases.



WHEREAS, since 1990 the Wisconsin State Legislature has mandated that all residents, businesses, agencies and organizations recycle a number of items by prohibiting their disposal in landfills or non-grandfathered incinerators; and

WHEREAS, the recycling program has been enthusiastically accepted by Wisconsin citizens as shown by an estimated recycling participation rate of 98%, resulting in a diversion rate of 40% of material previously landfilled, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors appropriate an amount equal to 50% of the county's annual WCA dues to the WCA Tobacco Litigation Fund for 2000 and an amount not to exceed 50% of the county's annual WCA dues thereafter until the litigation is resolved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Eau Claire County's participation is contingent on sufficient participation by other counties to fund the necessary legal retainer negotiated by WCA; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors authorizes the county administrator to execute a letter of agreement to participate in the Wisconsin County Tobacco Litigation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors authorizes transfer of \$5,463 from the County Board account #100-01-51110-219-000, Other Professional Services line item, which represents 50% of the county's annual WCA dues.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Corporation Counsel is appointed as Eau Claire County's representative on the Tobacco Litigation Steering Committee.
