



-REQUESTING COMPLETE FUNDING OF PROBATION AND PAROLE VIOLATION INMATES-

WHEREAS, regulations adopted by the State Legislature requires the county to incarcerate inmates for a longer period of time; and

WHEREAS, inmates released on probation and parole are being monitored for a longer time, causing their return to jail for violations of said probation or parole; and

WHEREAS, the above inmates cause an overcrowding of county jails; and the rate of daily cost of housing said inmates is not covered in total by the State, causing an additional fundamental burden on the county jail budget; and

WHEREAS, this should be reimbursed at the full cost of housing inmates for state probation and parole violations and not be an unfunded mandate required to be paid by county taxpayers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors does hereby request the Governor and the Wisconsin Legislature to provide sufficient funding to support the implementation of state policies when they result in additional cost to county taxpayers for housing probation and parole violation inmates in county jails.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors that the state funding shall cover both the capital costs associated with the increased use of county jails and the staffing costs incurred by a jail facility in order to safely support increased jail population.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the county clerk send certified copies of this resolution to area legislators, Governor Scott McCallum, the Secretary of the Department of Administration, the Secretary of the Department of Corrections, and the Wisconsin Counties Association.

WHEREAS, the state portion of the sales tax helps finance shared revenues to counties, municipalities, and schools; and

WHEREAS, the future viability of the sales tax is threatened by remote sales, including mail order and Internet, where the burden of compliance with tax law is imposed on the customer rather than the retailer; and

WHEREAS, a consortium of 29 states called the Streamlined Sales Tax Project has proposed model state legislation setting forth uniform definitions of certain taxable products; and

WHEREAS, such legislation would simplify administration of the sales tax across the nation, thereby removing obstacles that currently make it difficult for remote retailers to collect the tax;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors strongly supports uniform application of sales tax laws that are fair to on-line vendors as well as retail stores as proposed in model state legislation simplifying the sales tax that has been proposed in the Streamlined Sales Tax Project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the c;ounty clerk send certified copies of this resolution to area legislators, Governor Scott McCallum and the Wisconsin Counties Association.

-REQUESTING AMENDMENT OF WIS. STAT. § 70.11(25) TO CLEARLY LIMIT THE TAX EXEMPTION FOR NON-PROFIT MEDICAL RESEARCH FOUNDATIONS TO ONE CENTRAL FACILITY WHERE DATA IS ACTUALLY RECEIVED, AGGREGATED, AND ANALYZED-

WHEREAS, Wisconsin statutes currently require that for medical clinic property to be tax exempt it must be "used exclusively" for medical research and education purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Marshfield Clinic has taken the position that all of its regional medical centers contribute to the accomplishment of the Marshfield Clinic's purposes and therefore, qualify for property tax exemption; and

WHEREAS, the Marshfield Clinic is currently litigating the tax exempt issue and the "used exclusively" statutory language with the City of Mosinee in Marathon County Circuit Court; and

WHEREAS, in 2000 the Marshfield Clinic filed an application with the City of Eau Claire requesting its properties in Eau Claire be recognized as tax exempt for the year 2000, which was denied by the City of Eau Claire; and

WHEREAS, on January 29, 2001, the Eau Claire City Clerk received a Notice of Circumstances of Claim and Claim from Marshfield Clinic claiming tax exempt status for its facilities located in the City of Eau Claire, alleging that the 2000 property taxes in the amount of \$374,714.61 were unlawful and demanding that the taxes plus interest be paid to the Marshfield Clinic and that its property be exempt from taxation; and

WHEREAS, the City of Mosinee has initiated an effort to amend Wis. Stat. 70.11 (25) relating to non-profit medical research foundations by limiting the exemption by adding the following language:

"If the foundation operates at more than one location, the exemption of this subsection shall only apply to one central facility where data is received, aggregated and analyzed."; and

WHEREAS, the amendment of state statutes as proposed by the City of Mosinee would resolve the existing issue faced by the City of Eau Claire and all local taxing authorities.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors strongly supports and requests amendment of Wis. Stat. 70.11 (25) to clearly limit the tax exemption for Nonprofit Medical Research Foundations to one central facility where data is received, aggregated and analyzed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the county clerk send certified copies of this resolution to area legislators, State Senator Russell S. Decker, the city clerks of Eau Claire, Mosinee, and Wausau as well as the county clerk for Marathon County, Chippewa Valley Technical College President William Ihlenfeldt, Eau Claire School District Superintendent William Klaus, school districts and VTAE districts in Marathon County, and the Wisconsin Counties Association.

-DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND ADOPTING A MORATORIUM FOR ISSUANCE OF CONDITIONAL USE PERMITS, FOR TELECOMMUNICATION FACILITIES TO BE EFFECTIVE FOR A PERIOD OF ONE HUNDRED DAYS-

WHEREAS, the Federal Telecommunications Act of 1996 (Pub. L No. 104-104, 110 Stat. 56, 31-136, hereinafter the "Act"), was designed to remove regulatory barriers and encourage competition among all types of communications companies; and

WHEREAS, the Act ratifies the authority of local government to regulate telecommunications services and carriers, but also limits local governments' authority in certain respects; and

WHEREAS, the Act allows the Federal Communications Commission to preempt any local government regulation which prohibits, or has the effect of prohibiting the ability of any entity to provide any interstate or intrastate telecommunications services (Public Law Nu. 104-104, 110 Stat. 70, Section 253 (a)); and

WHEREAS, Eau Claire County has, within the last six (6) months, received multiple applications and numerous telephone inquiries for conditional use permits to site telecommunications facilities and expects to regularly receive such applications; and

WHEREAS, the county needs to review its ordinances to determine whether they are consistent with the Act and to adopt n w ordinances or revise existing ordinances to effectively address the unique problems presented by the applications for conditional use permits to site telecommunications facilities; and

WHEREAS, the county should impose a moratorium barring the processing of applications for conditional use permits for siting of telecommunications facilities or decision or further action on any applications currently received but not approved, until the necessary ordinance additions or revisions are completed or one hundred days, whichever is less:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors that the above resolution be adopted as follows:

Section 1. Definitions. For the purpose of this resolution, the following definitions shall apply:

- A **Telecommunications Carrier:** means and includes every person that directly or indirectly owns, controls, operates or manages plant, equipment or property within the county, used or to be used for the purpose of offering telecommunications services.
- **B.** Telecommunications Facilities: means the plant, equipment and property, including but not limited to, cables, wires, conduits, ducts, pedestals, antennae, electronic and other appurtenances used or to be used to transmit, receive, distribute, provide or offer telecommunications services.
- C. **Telecommunications Service:** means the providing or offering for rent, sale or lease, or in exchange for other value received, of the transmittal of voice, image, graphic, data and video programming information between or among points by wire, cable, fiber optics, laser, microwave, radio, satellite or similar facilities, with or without benefit of any closed transmission medium.
- **D.** Underground Facilities: means the plant, equipment and property, including but not limited to the poles, pipes, mains, conduits, cables, wires, plant and equipment located under, on or shows the surface of the ground within the streets, road or right-of-way of the county, and used to be used for the purpose of providing utility or telecommunications services.
- <u>Section 2. Purpose.</u> The purpose of this moratorium is to allow the county adequate time to comprehensively study the Telecommunications Act, determine whether the county's existing ordinances are consistent with the Act and to revise existing ordinances or to develop new ordinances to address situations not contemplated by the existing ordinance.
- <u>Section 3. Moratorium Imposed.</u> The county board of supervisors hereby imposes a moratorium on the establishment, location, permitting of telecommunications facilities within the county. During the term of this moratorium unless earlier terminated by the county board of supervisors by resolution, the county will not process any applications for conditional use permits or act upon any pending applications for conditional use pennits for the location, establishment or siting of any telecommunications facilities in the county.
- Section 4. Duration of Moratorium. The moratorium imposed by this resolution shall be in effect for a period of 100 days, beginning on the date of the adoption of this resolution. During this period, the Committee on Planning and Development, and the Department of Planning and Development shall study, analyze and develop a suitable ordinance for Eau Claire County and return their final recommendations to the county board of supervisors within 100 days of the effective date of this resolution.
- <u>Section 5. Severability.</u> If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this resolution should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this resolution.
- Section 6. Declaration of Emergency and Legislative Findings. The county board of supervisors hereby declares that an emergency exists necessitating that this resolution take effect immediately upon passage by a two-thirds vote of the members of the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors, and that the same not be subject to a referendum. The county board also makes the following findings: 1) Without an immediate moratorium of the county's processing of permit applications under the Building and Zoning Codes, processing of such applications by the county could occur under regulations that may be inconsistent with the Telecommunications Act of 1996 and regulations that could possibly be preempted by the Federal Communications Commission; 2) the siting of telecommunications facilities without an ordinance in place to specifically address concerns presented by those siting would have a potential detrimental effect to the safety, aesthetics, prosperity, efficient land use and welfare of Eau Claire County and its residents. Therefore, the

county's moratorium must be imposed immediately to prevent any development rights from vesting and to preserve the county's ability to process applications under appropriate ordinance(s).

-RATIFYING A TWENTY-YEAR CELLULAR TOWER SITE AGREEMENT WITH AIRADIGM COMMUNICATIONS, INC. TO BE LOCATED ON THE COUNTY HIGHWAY SHOP PROPERTY IN THE CITY OF ALTOONA; AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR TO EXECUTE THE SITE AGREEMENT AND ANY OTHER NECESSARY DOCUMENTS ON BEHALF OF EAU CLAIRE COUNTY-

WHEREAS, Airadigm Communications, Inc. approached the Eau Claire County Highway Committee in June 2000 for purposes of considering placement of a cellular communications tower on the Altoona highway shop property; and

WHEREAS, under the direction of the highway committee, an agreement has been negotiated by the highway commissioner and corporation counsel; and

WHEREAS, the main points of the agreement are:

- 1. Term approximately 20 years with the initial term running through December 31, 2005 and three subsequent five year option periods.
- 2. Rent \$8,000 per year for the initial term payable on or before the first business day of each calendar year.

\$11,220 per year for the first option. \$15,735 per year for the second option. \$22,070 per year for the third option.

- 3. The premises 35' x 35' parcel plus access easement.
- 4. Use Communications Facility consisting of a monopole tower of 165 feet plus a small structure to house necessary equipment.
- 5. Removal- responsibility of Airadigm on termination of agreement.
- 6. Co-location -will accommodate up to two other providers subject to City of Altoona tower elevation approval.
- 7. Conditions precedent-Airadigm must receive all required permits including conditional use and building permits, receive approval from local airspace authorities and FAA determination of no hazard to airspace, authorization from the FCC to utilize the location for the intended use and completion of the facility on or before September 1, 2001.

WHEREAS, additional provisions are delineated on the attached fact sheet; and

WHEREAS, ratification of this agreement will provide an additional revenue.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors hereby ratifies a 20-year cellular tower site agreement with Airadigm Communications, Inc. located on county property at the highway department Altoona shop site;

WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin established recycling mandates in 1989 requiring Responsible

Unit (RU) municipalities to provide recycling services to their residents, and

WHEREAS, 98% of Wisconsin residents actively recycle; and

WHEREAS, the diversion of recyclable materials from landfills into the marketplace saves energy and natural resources, reduces air and water pollution, creates jobs, and extends the life of landfills; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's proposed budget would reduce state funding of local RU recycling programs by over 40%, and

WHEREAS, the current method of distributing state grants is unequal to recipients and administratively cumbersome and inefficient, and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources has proposed a \$1.55 landfill tipping fee surcharge increase that would generate the funds necessary to maintain state grants to the RUs at their current level.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors opposes the Governor's proposed recycling budget and endorses maintaining state funding of municipal recycling programs by increasing the landfill tipping fee surcharge by \$1.55 per ton, with provisions to allow for future increases based on the consumer price index.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Board of Directors supports future distribution of recycling grant monies using the following:

- 1. County RUs providing service to 75% or more of their population will receive a minimum grant of \$100,000, and



  C. 'Contractor' means any person that enters into a service contract with the county in an amount equal to or greater than \$100,000.

E 'Employer' means any person who is a contractor or subcontractor.



If any nominee receives a majority of the votes cast, he <u>or she</u> shall be declared elected. If no nominee receives a majority of the votes cast on the 1st ballot, successive ballots shall be taken with the nominee receiving the lowest number of votes on the 3rd ballot being eliminated, until one of the nominees shall receive a majority of the votes cast;
- 2. Written ballots provided herein shall be secret for the election of the officers of the county board, but shall be endorsed on the reverse thereof by the person casting the ballot in the case of all other elections;

Any member of the board may give notice to the board at a regular or special meeting that a motion will be made to withdraw a matter from committee at the next succeeding regular meeting of the board, and such motion when made may be adopted by a majority vote of the members present. If such notice is not served, a matter may be withdrawn from committee only by a 2/3 vote of the members present, provided notice of such action has been entered on the calendar in accord with Seetien Wis. Stat. § 19.84, Statutes.
- F. The land conservation commission, the airport commission, the exposition center facility commission and the human services board shall be considered standing committees within the meaning of this section and shall report to the board as provided in this section and Seetien 2.04.030.

#### **SECTION 22.** That Subsections C. and D. of Section 2.04.170 of the code be amended to read:

C. The lst vice-chairpefsea of the county board, or in the lst vice-chall]:}8fS0fl's absence or inability to serve, the 2nd vice-chall]:}8fS0fl, shall act as chairpefsea of the committee of the whole. The county clerk shall serve as clerk of the committee, and shall present the reports of the committee to the board.

D. The committee shall rise and report to the board at the appointed time on the matters referred thereto, whereupon the committee shall be dissolved. The final report shall be in writing, signed by the committee chairpefsen, and in substantially the form prescribed by rule for committee reports. It shall be recorded and published in the journal of proceedings as provided in Sections 1,22,031 A. and 1,22,045 A.

#### **SECTION 23.** That Section 2.04.190 of the code be amended to read:

<u>2.04.190</u> Rule 19-Duties of the chaimeysoo. The chairpefsen shall preserve order and shall decide questions of order, subject to an appeal to the board, and shall vote on all questions taken by ayes and noes except for appeals from the chairpefsen's own decision.

Members appointed to represent the board on the governing bodies of independent agencies shall submit to the county administrator written reports of such agency activities or issues as may be of interest to the board by the calendar deadline in Section 2.04.110 A. on a semi-annual basis at the January and July meeting. Copies of such reports shall be sent with the calendar to each board member. Discussion of and directives by the board for action by the appropriate committee on any matters so reported shall be in order.
- F. Persons representing agencies funded, created by or functioning in a contractual relationship to the board may present reports to the board as authorized by the board chairperson.
- G. Persons to whom the county board has authorized the chairperson to present citations or commendations for service or merit may be scheduled upon the directive of the chairperson to appear before the board for said presentations.
- I. Reports other than those authorized herein shall not be scheduled on the calendar or presented in the absence of prior approval having been given by the chairperson of the county board or under suspension of the rules.

#### **SECTION 28.** That Subsection B. of Section 2.04.340 of the code be amended to read:

B. Every nomination by the chairperson of the county board for any appointment to any governmental body or position which requires the confirmation of the county board shall be considered prior to submittal for confirmation by the committee on administration, or such other committee or governmental body provided by ordinance. Confirmation action shall be by resolution introduced by the committee or governmental body.

#### **SECTION 29.** That Subsection B. of Section 2.04.350 of the code be amended to read:

B. All charges filed by the county administrator or other person for the impeachment and removal of the head of any department or office for which the county board is the removing party shall be referred to the appropriate standing committee. The committee shall investigate and report on such charges to the board in accord with Section Wis. Stat. §17.16, Statutes. If removal of the impeached person is recommended by the committee, it shall be by resolution adopted by 2/3 of the entire board.

#### SECTION 30. That Subsections A. and C. of Section 2.04.400 of the code be amended to read:

There is created a segregated trust fund to be known as the "Eau Claire County board of supervisors segregated trust fund," to consist of the segregated revenues deposited pursuant to Section 4.07.050 D. - **SECTION 33.** That Subsection B. of Section 2.04.435 of the code be amended to read:
  - B. The chairperson and vice-chairperson of the county board shall be the chairperson and vice-chairperson of the committee, respectively. The chairpersons of all other standing committees in Rule 12 shall be exofficio members of the committee without voting privileges.
- **SECTION 34.** That Subsection D. of Section 2.04.440 of the code be amended to read:
  - D. The committee shall act as the grievance committee under Chapter 3.19, for discrimination grievance hearings under the affirmative action plan adopted pursuant to section 3.03.040, and where authorized by approved collective bargaining agreements. All grievance hearings shall be conducted in accordance with due process standards and the C corporation C counsel, or designee, shall be present whenever possible. No grievance involving the following may be settled by the committee without the approval of the county board:
- **SECTION 35.** That Subsections B, and C, of Section 2.04.450 of the code be amended to read:
  - B. The committee shall exercise those powers and duties authorized under Section Wis. Stat. § 59.87, Statutes, except that the appointment of the chairperson of the office shall be under 3.11.042 A. All agreements under Section Wis. Stat. § 59.56(3)(c)2., Statutes, shall be approved by the county board.
  - C. The committee shall act as the county board liaison with agencies under paragraph A. 3. and in such capacity shall:

- SECTION 36. That paragraphs 1., 2., 5., 7., 8., 10., and 11. of Subsection A. of Section 2.04.455 be amended to read:
  - 1. Oversee the administration of authorized department functions in Chapters 2.44 and 15.01 and Titles 17 and 18, and exercise the committee duties prescribed therein;
  - 2. Oversee enforcement of the provisions of Titles 17 and 18 and Chapter 8.12; examine and report to the board on all petitions for or proposed amendments to any of the provisions thereof;
  - 5. Report on all matters relating to town boundaries, municipal annexation studies under Section 2.44.015 C., and amendments to Chapter 1.08;

  - B. No transfers between line items of the adopted county budget shall be made except with the approval of the committee on finance and budget or the county board as provided in Section Wis. Stat. §65.90(5)(b), of the Wisconsin Statutes, and Chapter 4.04.
  - C. The chair<del>person</del> of the county board shall select one member from and residing in each of three areas:
  - 1. The city of Eau Claire;

- B. The committee shall undertake, on behalf of the board, such powers and duties set forth in <u>Wis. Stat. ch.</u> Chapters 27 and 28 of the Wisconsin Statutes, regarding operation of the county parks and forest system, as are hereinafter enumerated:
- 1. To conduct a thorough study of the county in accord with Section Wis. Stat. § 27.04 of the Wisconsin Statutes, with reference to making reservations and acquisitions of lands for public purposes and the improvements thereof for park related functions, and to carry out such other functions as are specified therein. The county board reserves the authority to adopt, modify, change or extend plans proposed by them as provided in Section Wis. Stat. § 27.04(2) of the Wisconsin Statutes. Such plans shall annually be reviewed by the committee and amendments thereto submitted to the board in the same manner;
- 2. To have charge and supervision of all county parks, parkways, waysides and special use areas pursuant to Section Wis. Stat. § 27.05 of the Wisconsin Statutes, with the express exception of subsection (4) thereunder, and subject to the provision that all grants, conveyances and devices of land accepted on behalf of the county pursuant to subsection (2) thereunder, are in accord with ordinances thereon;
- 3. To negotiate and enter into agreements for timber sales from county forests, pursuant to Section Wis. Stat. § 28.11(6) of the Wisconsin Statutes, subject to awarding or approval thereof by the county board of any sale exceeding one thousand dollars in appraised value;
- 4. To administer all county forest lands under the concept of multiple-use management, pursuant to Section Wis. Stat. §28.11 of the Wisconsin Statutes, reserving to the county board the authority vested therein in subsection (3)(a) to (e) and (i) thereunder;
- 5. To take options for purchase of lands in the county for authorized park or forest purposes, such options not to exceed in the aggregate more than five percent of the total land acquisition line item in the departmental budget in any year;
- D. The committee shall appoint an advisory committee, approved by the county board chairperson, whose function it shall be to actively participate in the formulation of the yearly and long range plans as and for the Eau Claire County forests and parks. It shall be composed of eleven members experienced or interested in the management and development of the county parks and forests and broadly representative of the county population. No members of the county board shall be appointed thereto.

# SECTION 41. That paragraph 2. of Subsection B. and Subsection D. of Section 2.04.485 of the code be amended to read:

- B. The committee shall have the following powers and duties:
- 2. Exercise control over all non-tax deeded land acquired by the County through any of its departments, agencies, officials and employees.

The Ccommittee shall refer all land acquisitions to appropriate governing committees whenever such lands abut or adjoin lands under the control of any such committee. No county official or employee may acquire, purchase or accept any land on behalf of the county without the prior written permission of the Ffinance and Bbudget Ccommittee except as otherwise provided by law. The Ccounty Cclerk, acting under the supervision of the committee, is hereby empowered to manage and sell all non-tax deed lands owned by Eau Claire County, subject to approval of the Ccounty Bboard consistent with provisions of Chapter 4.20 of the Code.

C. At the second meeting of the county board in each month, the committee shall report to the board in writing its action on any claim under Section 4.90.020 C. and any transfer of funds authorized by the committee under Chapter 4.04 during the previous month.




