WHEREAS, by the provisions of Chapter 24 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands of Wisconsin is authorized to make loans from the State Trust Funds to municipalities for such purposes. (Municipality is defined by Wis. Stat. § 24.60(2), means a town, village, city, county, public inland lake protection and rehabilitation district, town sanitary district created under§ 60.71 or § 60.72, metropolitan sewerage district created under§ 66.22 or 66.882, joint sewerage system created under§ 144.07(4), school district or technical college district.).

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the County of Eau Claire, Wisconsin, borrow from the Trust Funds of the State of Wisconsin the sum of Eight Hundred Sixty-seven Thousand Four Hundred Eight Dollars (\$867,408.00) for the purpose of purchasing an airport hanger building at the county airport and for no other purpose.

The loan is to be payable within 20 years froin the 15th day of March preceding the date the loan is made. The loan will be repaid in annual installments with interest at the rate of 5.00 percent per annum from the date of making the loan to the 15th day of March next and thereafter annually as provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that there shall be raised and there is levied upon all taxable property, within the County of Eau Claire, Wisconsin, a direct annual tax for the purpose of paying interest and principal on the loan as they become due.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no money obtained by the County of Eau Claire by such loan from the state be applied or paid out for any purpose except purchasing an airport hanger building at the county airport without the consent of the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in case the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands of Wisconsin agrees to make the loan, that the chair and the clerk of the County of Eau Claire, Wisconsin are authorized and empowered in the name of the county to execute and deliver to the Commission, certificates of indebtedness, in such form as required by the Commission, for any sum of money that may be loaned to the county pursuant to this resolution. The chair and clerk of the county will perform all necessary actions to fully carry out the provisions of Chapter 24 and Wis. Stat. § 67.05(4) and these resolutions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution and the aye and no vote by which it was adopted, be recorded, and the clerk of this county forward this certified record, along with the application for the loan, to the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands of Wisconsin.

-RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE BORROWING OF \$1,665,000; PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS THEREFOR; AND LEVYING A TAX IN CONNECTION THEREWITH-

WHEREAS, the County Board of Supervisors of Eau Claire County, Wisconsin (the "County") hereby finds and determines that it is necessary, desirable and in the best interest of the County to raise funds for the purpose of paying the cost of refunding certain outstanding obligations of the County, to wit: a portion of its \$4,500,000 General Obligation Promissory Notes, dated February 1, 1998 (the "1998 Notes") and \$1,700,000 State Trust Fund Loan, dated August 15, 2000 (the "2000 Loan") (collectively, the 1998 Notes and the 2000 Loan shall be referred to herein as the "Prior Issues") (hereinafter the refinancing of a portion of the County's Prior Issues shall be referred to as the "Refunding"), and there are insufficient funds on hand to pay said costs;

WHEREAS, none of the proceeds of the general obligation refunding bonds shall be used to fund the operating expenses of the general fund of the County or to fund the operating expenses of any special revenue fund of the County that is supported by the property taxes;

WHEREAS, the County Board of Supervisors deems it to be necessary, desirable and in the best interest of the County to refund the Prior Issues for the purpose of restructuring the County's outstanding indebtedness;

WHEREAS, counties are authorized by the provisions of Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes to borrow money and to issue general obligation refunding bonds to refinance their outstanding obligations; and

WHEREAS, the County Board of Supervisors now deems it to be necessary, desirable and in the best interest of the County to authorize the issuance of and to award the sale of its general obligation refunding bonds to Robert W. Baird & Co. Incorporated, Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of Supervisors of the County that:

<u>Section 1. Authorization of the Bonds.</u> For the purpose of paying the cost of the Refunding, there shall be borrowed pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the principal sum of ONE MILLION SIX HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,665,000) from Robert W. Baird & Co. Incorporated, Milwaukee, Wisconsin (the "Purchaser") in accordance with the terms and conditions of its purchase proposal (the "Proposal") attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u> and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section IA. Sale of the Bonds. To evidence such indebtedness, the Chairperson and County Clerk are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to make, execute, issue and sell to the Purchaser for, on behalf of and in

the name of the County, General Obligation Refunding Bonds aggregating the principal amount of ONE MILLION SIX HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,665,000) (the "Bonds") for the sum set forth on the Proposal, plus accrued interest to the date of delivery.

Section 2 Terms of the Bonds. The Bonds shall be designated "General Obligation Refunding Bonds"; shall be dated June 15, 2002; shall be in the denomination of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof; shall be numbered 1 and upward; shall bear interest at the rates and shall mature on August 1 of each year, in the years and principal amounts as set forth on the schedule prepared by the Purchaser and attached hereto as Exhibit B (the "Schedule"). Interest is payable semi-annually on February 1 and August 1 of each year commencing on February 1, 2003,

Section 3. Redemption Provisions. The Bonds shall not be subject to optional redemption.

<u>Section 4. Form of the Bonds.</u> The Bonds shall be issued in registered form and shall be executed and delivered in substantially the form attached hereto as <u>Exhibit C</u> and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 5. Direct Annual Irrepealable Tax Levy. For the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the Bonds as the same becomes due, the full faith, credit and resources of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged, and there is hereby levied upon all of the taxable property of the County a direct annual irrepealable tax in the years 2002 through 2007 for the payments due in the years 2003 through 2008 in the amounts set forth on the Schedule..

The direct annual irrepealable tax hereby levied shall be carried onto the tax roll and collected in addition to all other taxes and in the same manner and at the same time as other taxes of the County for said years are collected. So long as any part of the principal of or interest on the Bonds remains unpaid, the tax hereinabove levied shall be and continues irrepealable except that the amount of tax carried onto the tax roll may be reduced in any year by the amount of any surplus in the Debt Service Fund Account for the Bonds created below.

Section 6 Segregated Debt Service Fund Account. There is hereby established in the County treasury a fund account separate and distinct from all other funds or accounts of the County designated "Debt Service Fund Account for \$1,665,000 Eau Claire County General Obligation Refunding Bonds dated June 15, 2002", which fund account shall be used solely for the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the Bonds. There shall be deposited in said fund account all accrued interest paid on the Bonds at the time the Bonds are delivered to the Purchaser, any premium, all money raised by taxation pursuant to Section 5 hereof, any amounts transferred from the debt service fund account for the 1998 Notes as set forth above and all other sums as may be necessary to pay principal of and interest on the Bonds as the same become due. Said fund account shall be used for the sole purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the Bonds, shall be maintained for such purpose until such indebtedness is fully paid or otherwise extinguished, and shall at all times be invested in a manner that conforms with the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), and any applicable income tax regulations (the "Regulations").

<u>Section 7. Borrowed Money Fund.</u> The proceeds of the Bonds (the "Bond Proceeds") (other than any premium and accrued interest which must be paid at the time of the delivery of the Bonds into the Debt Service Fund Account created above) shall be deposited into an account separate and distinct from all other funds and disbursed solely for the purposes for which borrowed or for the payment for the principal of and the interest on the Bonds.

Section 8 Arbitrage Covenant. The County shall not take any action with respect to the Bond Proceeds which, if said action had been reasonably expected to have been taken, or had been deliberately and intentionally taken on the date of delivery of and payment for the Bonds (the "Closing") would have caused the Bonds to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Section 148 of the Code and the Regulations.

The Bond Proceeds may be temporarily invested in legal investments until needed, provided however, that the County hereby covenants and agrees that so long as the Bonds remain outstanding, moneys on deposit in any fund or account created or maintained in connection with the Bonds, whether such moneys were derived from Bond Proceeds or from any other source, will not be used or invested in a manner which would cause the Bonds to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of the Code or Regulations. The County covenants that it will not invest in any obligation if such investment would violate the "prohibited payment" requirement of Section 148 of the Code.

The County Clerk, or other officer of the County charged with responsibility for issuing the Bonds, shall provide an appropriate certificate of the County, for inclusion in the transcript of proceedings, setting forth the reasonable expectations of the County regarding the amount and use of the Bond Proceeds and the facts and estimates on which such expectations are based, all as of the Closing.

Section 9. Additional Tax Covenants Including Rebate: Six Month Expenditure Exemption from Rebate: <u>Qualified Tax-Exempt Obligation Status.</u> The County hereby further covenants and agrees that it will take all necessary steps and perform all obligations required by the Code and Regulations (whether prior to or subsequent to the issuance of the Bonds) to assure that the Bonds are obligations described in Section 103(a) of the Code, the interest on which is excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes, throughout their term. The County further covenants that it will not take any action, omit to take any action or permit the taking or omission of any action within its control (including, without limitation, making or permitting any use of the proceeds of the Bonds) if taking, permitting or omitting to take such action would cause any of the Bonds to be an arbitrage bond or a private activity bond within the meaning of the Code or would otherwise cause interest on the Bonds to be included in the gross income of the recipients thereof for federal income tax purposes. The County Clerk or other officer of the County charged with the responsibility of issuing the Bonds, shall provide an appropriate certificate of the County as of the Closing, for inclusion in the transcript of proceedings, certifying that it can and covenanting that it will comply with the provisions of the Code and Regulations.

Further, it is the intent of the County to take all reasonable and lawful actions to comply with any new tax laws enacted so that the Bonds will continue to be obligations described in Section 103(a) of the Code, the interest on which is excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes throughout their term.

The County covenants that it is a governmental unit with general taxing powers and that the Bonds are not "private activity bonds" as defined in Section 141 of the Code.

For purposes of complying with the Regulations, particularly the rebate requirements of the Regulations, the portion of the proceeds of the Bonds that will be used for refunding the 1998 Notes and the portion of the proceeds of the Bonds that will be used for refunding the 2000 Loan shall be considered proceeds of separate issues, respectively referred to herein as the "Advance Refunding Portion" and the "Current Refunding Portion."

In accordance with Section 148(:f)(4)(B) of the Code, the County covenants that ninety-five percent (95%) or more of the net proceeds of the Current Refunding Portion of the Bonds are to be used for local governmental activities of the County and that 100% of the proceeds of the Current Refunding Portion of the Bonds will be expended for the governmental purposes of the issue within six months of the Closing. If for any reason the County did not qualify for the six month exemption from the rebate requirements of the Code for the Current Refunding Portion of the Bonds, the County covenants that it would take all necessary steps to comply with such requirements.

The County does not anticipate that it will qualify for any exemption from the rebate requirements of the Code for the Advance Refunding Portion of the Bonds. Accordingly, the County hereby covenants and agrees that there shall be paid from time to time all amounts to be rebated to the United States pursuant to Section 148(:f) of the Code and any applicable Regulations. This covenant and agreement shall survive payment in full or defeasance of the Bonds. In order to fulfill such covenant and agreement, the County is hereby authorized to employ independent accountants, consultants or attorneys to assist in detennining the rebate amounts.

The County Board of Supervisors hereby designates the Bonds to be "qualified tax-exempt obligations" pursuant to the provisions of Section 265(b)(3) of the Code and in support of such designation, the County Clerk or other officer of the County charged with the responsibility for issuing the Bonds, shall provide an appropriate certificate of the County, all as of the Closing.

Section 9A Rebate Fund. If necessary, the County shall establish and maintain, so long as the Bonds are outstanding, a separate account to be known as the "Rebate Fund". The County hereby covenants and agrees that it

shall pay from the Rebate Fund the rebate amounts calculated pursuant to the provisions of the Code and Regulations to the United States of America.

Amounts held in the Rebate Fund and the investment income therefrom are not pledged as security for the Bonds and may only be used to pay amounts to the United States.

The County shall maintain or cause to be maintained records of such calculations and shall make such records available upon reasonable request therefor.

The County hereby agrees it will disburse all moneys in the Rebate Fund to the United States of America at the times and in the manner set forth in any applicable Regulations proposed or promulgated thereunder.

<u>Section 10. Execution of the Bonds.</u> The Bonds shall be prepared in typewritten or printed form, executed on behalf of the County by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Chairperson and County Clerk, authenticated, if required, by its fiscal agent, if any, sealed with its official or corporate seal, if any, or a facsimile thereof and delivered to the Purchaser upon payment to the County of the purchase price thereof, plus accrued interest to the date of delivery. In the event that either of the officers whose signatures appear on the Bonds shall cease to be such officers before the delivery of the Bonds, such signatures shall, nevertheless, be valid and sufficient for all purposes to the same extent as if they had remained in office until such delivery. The aforesaid officers are hereby authorized to do all acts and execute all documents as may be necessary and convenient for effectuating the Closing.

<u>Section 11. Payment of the Bonds.</u> The principal of and interest on the Bonds shall be paid in lawful money of the United States of America by the County Clerk or County Treasurer.

Section 11A. Persons Treated as Owners; Transfer of Bonds. The County shall keep books for the registration and for the transfer of the Bonds. The person in whose name any Bond shall be registered shall be deemed and regarded as the absolute owner thereof for all purposes and payment of either principal or interest on any Bond shall be made only to the registered owner thereof. All such payments shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and discharge the liability upon such Bond to the extent of the sum or sums so paid.

Any Bond may be transferred by the registered owner thereof by surrender of the Bond at the office of the County Clerk, duly endorsed for the transfer or accompanied by an assignment duly executed by the registered owner or his attorney duly authorized in writing. Upon such transfer, the Chairperson and County Clerk shall execute and deliver in the name of the transferee or transferees a new Bond or Bonds of a like aggregate principal amount, series and maturity and the County Clerk shall record the name of each transferee in the registration book. No registration shall be made to bearer. The County Clerk shall cancel any Bond surrendered for transfer.

The County shall cooperate in any such transfer, and the Chairperson and County Clerk are authorized to execute any new Bond or Bonds necessary to effect any such transfer.

The fifteenth day of each calendar month next preceding each interest payment date shall be the record date for the Bonds. Payment of interest on the Bonds on any interest payment date shall be made to the registered owners of the Bonds as they appear on the registration book of the County at the close of business on the corresponding record date.

<u>Section 12 Utilization of The Depositol}' Trust Company Book-Entry-Only System.</u> In order to make the Bonds eligible for the services provided by The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York ("DTC"), the County agrees to the applicable provisions set forth in the Blanket Issuer Letter of Representations previously executed on behalf of the County and on file in the County Clerk's office.

Section 13. Undertaking to Provide Continuing Disclosure. The County hereby covenants and agrees, for the benefit of the holders of the Bonds, to enter into a written undertaking (the "Undertaking") required by SEC Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities and Exchange Act of 1934 (the "Rule") to provide continuing disclosure of certain financial information and operating data upon request and timely notices of the occurrence of certain events in accordance with the Rule. This Undertaking shall be enforceable by the holders of the Bonds or by the Purchaser on behalf of such holders (provided that the rights of the holders and the Purchaser to enforce the Undertaking shall be limited to a right to obtain specific performance of the

obligations hereunder and any failure by the County to comply with the provision of this Undertaking shall not be an event of default with respect to the Bonds).

The County Clerk, or other officer of the County charged with the responsibility for issuing the Bonds, shall provide a Continuing Disclosure Certificate for inclusion in the transcript of proceedings, setting forth the details and terms of the County's Undertaking.

Section 14. Escrow Agent; Escrow Agreement; Escrow Account. Associated Trust Company, National Association, Green Bay, Wisconsin, is hereby appointed escrow agent for the County, for the purpose of ensuring the payment of the principal of and interest on a portion of the 1998 Notes (the "Escrow Agent").

The Chairperson and County Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute an escrow agreement substantially in the form attached hereto as <u>Exhibit D</u> (the "Escrow Agreement") (such form may be modified by said officers prior to execution, the execution of such agreement by said officers to constitute full approval of the County Board of Supervisors of any such modifications), with the Escrow Agent, for the purpose of effectuating the provisions of this Resolution.

The Bond Proceeds allocable to refunding a portion of the 1998 Notes, other than any premium and accrued interest which shall be deposited in the Debt Service Fund Account created above, shall be deposited in a refunding escrow account which is hereby created with the Escrow Agent, pursuant to the Escrow Agreement, for the purpose of retaining the required amount of cash, if any, and acquiring the United States obligations provided for in the Escrow Agreement.

Upon transfer of the Bond Proceeds and any other necessary funds allocable to refunding a portion of the 1998 Notes to the Escrow Account, the taxes heretofore levied to pay debt service on a portion of the 1998 Notes shall be abated to the extent such transfer together with investment earnings thereon is sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on a portion of the 1998 Notes, but such abatement shall not affect the County's pledge of its full faith, credit and resources to make such payments. The refunding escrow account created by the Escrow Agreement shall hereinafter serve as the debt service (or sinking) fund account for a portion of the 1998 Notes. The Escrow Agrent shall serve as custodian of said debt service (or sinking) funds.

Section 15. Bond Insurance. The Chairperson and County Clerk are authorized to agree to such additional provisions as any municipal bond insurer which makes a commitment accepted by the County to insure the Bonds may reasonably request and which are acceptable to the $Chai_{r,p}$ erson and County Clerk, including provisions regarding restrictions on investment of Bond Proceeds, the payment procedure under the municipal bond insurer and notices to be given to the bond insurer. In addition, appropriate reference to the municipal bond insurance policy shall be made in the form of Bond provided herein.

Section 16. Redemption of the 2000 Loan. The County Board of Supervisors hereby calls the 2000 Loan due on and after March 15, 2003 for redemption on or about July 19, 2002. The County hereby directs the Purchaser to cause a notice of redemption, in substantially the fonn attached hereto as <u>Exhibit E</u> to be provided at the times, to the parties and in the manner provided thereon.

<u>Section 17. Conflicting Resolutions; Severability; Effective Date.</u> All prior resolutions, rules or other actions of the County Board of Supervisors or any parts thereof in conflict with the provisions hereof shall be, and the same are, hereby rescinded insofar as the same may so conflict. In the event that any one or more provisions hereof shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provisions hereof. The foregoing shall take effect immediately upon adoption and approval in the manner provided by law.

WHEREAS, Eau Claire County wishes to support economic development and the creation and retention of jobs within the County; and

WHEREAS, Heartland Aviation, Inc. has recently completed an FBO facility consisting of a 120' x 120' x 28' hanger as well as 20' x 120' x 10 of office space which is connected to the 1987 FBO facility; and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Finance and Budget has introduced a resolution to purchase and lease back the FBO facility to Heartland Aviation who intends to use the facility to expand it's airplane maintenance operations; and

WHEREAS, the total purchase cost would be \$867,408.12 of which \$430,000.00 would come from the Economic Development Fund and \$437,408.12 would come from a state trust fund loan; and

WHEREAS, the Economic Development Fund would be reimbursed, with interest, on a monthly basis from the lease payments for a period of 20 years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors authorizes \$430,000.00 from the Economic Development Fund to be used to help fund the purchase of the FBO facility from Heartland Aviation, Inc. under the following terms: interest on the allocation shall accrue at 6 5% per year for the first five years. The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Eau Claire does ordain as follows:

- **SECTION** 1. That Paragraphs 41. through 152. of Subsection A. of Section 18.02.010 of the code be renumbered to Paragraphs 42. through 153.
- **SECTION 2.** That Paragraph 41. of Subsection A. of Section 18.02.010 of the code be created to read:

41. "Exclusive Agricultural-compatible single-family dwelling" means a single family dwelling and customary accessory uses and structures, constructed in an A-1 Exclusive Agricultural zoning district in accord with Section 18.04.041, that is occupied by persons who may not be employed in the farming industry, who nevertheless understand and accept that they are living in an industrial neighborhood where the industry is farming;

SECTION 3. That Subsection I. of Section 18.04.030 of the code be created to read:

- I. Exclusive Agricultural-compatible single-family dwellings, subject to the provisions in Section 18.04.041.
- **SECTION 4.** That Section 18.04.041 of the code be created to read:

<u>18.04.041</u> Standards for approval of conditional use permits for Exclusive Agricultural-compatible single-family dwellings. In addition to the factors in Section 18.04.040 that must be considered by the committee when reviewing a conditional use permit request, the standards in this section shall apply to Exclusive Agricultural-compatible single-family dwellings. A The intent of this section is as follows:

1. To allow for a limited amount of residential development in the A-1 Exclusive Agricultural zoning district for individuals or families who accept and approve of the industrial activities associated with farming and choose to live in areas where the industry of farming is practiced;

2. To direct this limited amount of residential development to areas that are marginal for agricultural use but suitable for development; and

3. To enhance the protection and preservation of farmland. B. Exclusive Agricultural-compatible single-family dwellings shall be allowed at a density equivalent to one residence for each government protracted quarter-quarter section or for any contiguous 40 acres of land under one ownership. C. An Exclusive Agricultural-compatible single-family dwelling can be constructed only after a lot has been created meeting the standards for lots listed below, and only after the balance of the land remaining in the government protracted quarter-quarter section or 40 acre tract has been deed restricted according to the standards below:

1. Standards for lots for Exclusive Agricultural-compatible single-family dwellings.

a Each lot shall contain a minimum of one acre and shall not exceed 2.5 acres.

b. Each lot shall have a minimum of 150 feet of public road frontage.

c. Each lot shall have a preferred depth to width ratio of two to one (2:1).

d A lot shall contain soils that are adequate for a private sanitary system.

2. Standards for setting aside the balance of the land remaining after a lot is created from a protracted quarter-quarter section or 40 acre tract of land.

a A minimum of 35 acres shall be set aside to maintain eligibility for farmland preservation tax credits.

b. A deed restriction shall be placed on the set aside land that prohibits structural development and allows only non-residential agricultural or other open space uses that are allowed in the A-1 Exclusive Agricultural zoning district.

3. Standards for placement of two or more lots for Exclusive Agricultural-compatible single-family dwellings by transferring lots allowed on one quarter-quarter section or 40 acre tract to another quarter-quarter section or 40 acre tract under the same ownership.

a If one or more protracted quarter-quarter sections or 40 acre tracts of land under one ownership do not have sites that meet the standards for creating lots in 1, above, then lot eligibility may be transferred to another quarter-quarter section or 40 acre tract of land under the same ownership that does meet all of the standards in 1, above.

c The entire protracted quarter-quarter section or 40 acre tract from which any lot has been transferred shall be deed restricted in accord with 2.b., above, and at least part of the quarter-quarter section or 40 acre tract to which the one or more lots have been transferred shall be deed restricted in accord with 2.b, above, such that the sum of acreage that is deed restricted is equal to or greater than 35 acres when divided by the number of lots created.

D. The Owner or owners of any lot created for an Exclusive Agricultural-compatible single-family dwelling allowed under Section 18. 04. 03 0 I. shall be required to sign and record in the Eau Claire County Register of Deeds Office a right-to-farm agreement at the time of purchase, and all subsequent owners of the lots shall be required to sign and record in the Register of Deeds Office a right-to-farm agreement that meets the standards of this section.

1. A right-to-farm Agreement shall include, at a minimum, the following provisions:

a. A statement stipulating that the owner of the lot acknowledges that they are moving into an area where farming is promoted and encouraged as a land use and that the intent of the land use or zoning regulations are to preserve and protect farming.

b. A statement stipulating that the owner of the lot agrees that any farmer who, operates a farm adjacent to or in the vicinity of the owners lot shall have the right to operate the farm in accord with common agricultural practices.

c. A statement stipulating that the owner of the lot agrees that common agricultural practices include, but are not limited to the following:

1. plowing;

Il. harvesting;

iii. application of fertilizers and pesticides in accord with proper application rates and in accord with legal standards whenever applicable;

Iv. collection, storage, and spreading of manure from livestock on the farm;

v. application of municipal sewer sludge in accord with an approved Wisconsin DNR application plan;

vi. raising of livestock of all types, including pens and buildings intended for the housing and/or breeding of livestock;

vII. all dai_{rv} ing activities;

viii operation of heavy equipment including tractors, harvesters, excavation equipment, and trucks used in any of the agricultural practices mentioned above.

d A statement stipulating that the owner of the lot acknowledges and agrees that agricultural practices, including the noises, odors, dust, and other characteristics associated with those practices, can occur at any time of the day or night due to factors such as, but not limited to, weather conditions.

e A statement stipulating that at the time that the original owner sells the lot, and at the time all subsequent owners sell the lot, an addendum to the original agreement shall be prepared for the buyer to sign indicating that the buyer has read and understood the terms of the original agreement and that the buyer agrees to the terms of the original agreement. No sale of the lot shall be allowed without the buyer signing such an addendum.

f. A statement stipulating that the agreement shall be in effect for as long as Eau Claire County exercises zoning jurisdiction on the lot.

RESOLUTION

-AUTHORIZING THE EXPENDITURE OF A PORTION OF ROAD CONSTRUCTION FUND BALANCES ON CTH "K" -

WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin is now working out their budget reconciliation act and the impacts upon Eau Claire County will not likely be as negative as first feared; and

WHEREAS, said legislation will likely cause minimal impact upon the 2002 highway department budget; and

WHEREAS, the right of way acquisition for a planned project on county trunk highway (CTH) "K" was included in the initial 2002 budget proposed by department staff and approved by the highway committee; and

WHEREAS, this project was dropped from the budget during administrative and finance committee reviews to help meet county wide. limitations upon the 2002 budget; and

WHEREAS, cost savings in 2001 left an unanticipated balance in the road construction account of the highway department budget; and

WHEREAS, in an attempt to get the improvement program back on schedule it now seems reasonable to allow a portion of the unanticipated end of 2001 road construction fund balance to be used to fund the right of way acquisition project cut from the proposed 2002 budget in the fall of 2001.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors that the expenditure of \$30,000.00 from the unallocated road construction fund balance for right of way acquisition on CTH "K" near Burnell Drive is hereby authorized.

Upon termination, except discharge for just cause, an employee with 10 years or more of creditable employment in a permanent or project position shall have the option to either be paid 1/3 of the accumulated sick leave balance to a maximum of 240 hours, or apply 1/3 of the accumulated sick leave balance to a maximum of 240 hours toward payment of health insurance premiums. An employee with 20 years or more of creditable employment in a permanent or project position shall have the option to either be paid $\frac{1}{2}$ of the accumulated sick leave balance to a maximum of 360 hours, or apply ¹/₂ of the accumulated sick leave balance to a maximum of 360 hours toward payment of health insurance premiums. Employees with 20 or more years of creditable employment with Eau Claire County and who are eligible for retirement under the Wisconsin Retirement System or disability retirement under the Wisconsin Retirement System, shall receive 100% of their unused sick leave, in cash, upon terminating. (Note: "eligible for retirement" means reaching the age an employee can retire under WRS. Employees do not have to begin receiving retirement payments.)

- 1. Committee on administration (3 of whom shall be the county board officers);
- 2. Committee on personnel;
- 3. Committee on judiciary and law enforcement;
- 4. Committee on UW-Extension education;
- 5. Committee on planning and development;
- 6 Highway committee;
- 7. Committee on parks and forests;
- 8 Committee on finance and budget;
- 9. The human services board (for appointment of 6 county board members);

B. The <u>chair-ofthe-board ad hoc committee on appointments</u> shall make written announcements of appointments to said committees to the board, and <u>the chair of the board</u> shall designate a chair pro tempore of each of said committees. Each member shall be appointed to at least one committee. All appointments shall be for 2 year terms commencing on the 3rd Tuesday of April in even-numbered years. In case of a vacancy in any committee the same shall be filled by written appointment of the chair as and for the unexpired portion of the term. In the event of a vacancy in the office of chair of the board and a successor is elected, such successor may, within 30 days, make changes in committee appointments in the manner provided in this section.

SECTION 3. That Subsection A. of Section 2.04.140 of the code be amended to read:

A. Each committee shall be convened to organize by the chair pro tempore not later than 3 weeks following the filing of the appointments thereto by the chair-of-the-county-board <u>ad</u> <u>hoc committee on appointments.</u> At such meeting each committee, except those named in 2.04.120 A.1., shall elect a chair and a vice-chair. The chair shall appoint a member thereof or a

staffperson as committee clerk.

A The committee shall be responsible to the county board for making appointments to the standing committees.

C. The committee shall serve only until standing committee appointments are made, but no later than the first Tuesday in May.
