



-SUPPORTING ASSEMBLY BILL 255 HIGHWAY REPAIR LIABIITY OF MUNICIPALITIES-

WHEREAS, under current law, cities, villages, towns and counties ("municipalities") are immune from claims arising out of the performance of a discretionary duty, or duty that requires a governmental entity to use judgment or discretion in carrying out the duty; and

WHEREAS, under current law, municipalities are liable for damages of up to \$50,000 arising out of the performance of a non discretionary duty; and

WHEREAS, under current law, municipalities are liable for damages of up to \$50,000 to a person or property resulting from an insufficiency or want of repair of a highway which includes shoulders, sidewalks, and bridges. Municipalities are also liable for damages resulting from he accumulation of snow or ice that has existed on a highway for at least three weeks; and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Supreme Court in Morris v. Juneau County 219 Wis. 2d 544 (1998), held that the statutory provisions imposing liability on municipalities for highway defects is an exception to the more general provision granting immunity to the municipalities from liability arising out of the performance of discretionary duties; and

Wl;[EREAS, under current law, if the negligence or deliberate wrong doing of a person contributes to the creation of highway defect that results in damages to a person or property, the negligent or wrong doing person is primarily liable and the municipality is secondarily liable only if the negligent person or the person who committed the wrong does not satisfy the judgment and the municipality is secondarily liable only if the negligent person or the person who committed the wrong does no satisfy the judgment, and the municipality is otherwise liable for the damages; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 255 eliminates the specific immunity exception under which municipalities may be held liable for an insufficiency or want of repairs of a highway and also eliminates secondary liability for municipalities; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 255 does not effect the immunity exception under which municipalities may be held liable for damages up to \$50,000 for the accumulation of snow or ice that has existed on a highway for at least three weeks.

WHEREAS, all of the proposed alternatives in the proposed management plan for the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest deviate from the historic and agreed upon principles for the creation of the Forest; and

Whereas, for the most part, these lands were purchased from the Counties where said lands are located under the pretext and understanding that these lands would be returned to a forested condition, that these lands would again provide a sound base for the local and regional economy and that local governments would play a major role in the management and operation of Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest; and

WHEREAS, all of the proposed alternatives call for a greatly reduced level of timber harvesting as compared to current levels, which are already set far below resource sustainable levels; and

WHEREAS, lack of appropriate forest management on the part of the USFS could put the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest in a position of dire consequence as it relates to fire, disease, insect, social well being, economic viability and overall environmental health of the forest; and

WHEREAS, the insufficient level of timber harvest has reduced the amount of funds local governments receive through the 25% Program and when coupled with the Federal Government's unwillingness to fund the PILT Program at lawful levels, local governments are denied reasonable compensation for the loss of tax base resulting from Federal ownership of this acreage; and

WHEREAS, the proposed alternatives also direct forest management away from a reasonable level of public access for recreational pursuits including but not limited to hunting, fishing, wood cutting, mushroom and berry picking, ATV and snowmobile travel and general access to the elderly and the physically and mentally disadvantaged; and

WHEREAS, the reduced level of timber harvest translates into the loss of thousands of jobs in both primary and secondary wood using industries in Wisconsin and the entire upper Midwest. These same industries are shifting their capital investment dollars to other parts of the country or elsewhere in the world where they are reasonably assured of being able to acquire the raw products they need. The loss of this industrial base only exasperates the exportation of good paying jobs to other countries and increases our National debt by requiring importation to meet our market demand.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors recognizes the tremendous importance of the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest as an exceptional natural resource with the capability of providing social and economic benefits on a sustainable basis, and as none of the proposed alternatives lead the forest toward the goals as negotiated and promised years ago, this Board recommends that the USFS reevaluate the social and economic rationale for existence of the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest.

WHEREAS, since that time, additional insurance coverages were added by municipal mutual insurance companies including self-insured services, worker' compensation, nursing home liability and owner-controlled insurance purchase programs for public construction projects; and

WHEREAS, under cunent law, municipal mutual insurance companies are precluded from offering property insurance are restricted coverage at renewal rates, which have skyrocketed in recent years; and

WHEREAS, for many years, the Local Government Property Insurance Fund (LGPIF) has met the property insurance needs of Wisconsin's local units of government; and

WHEREAS, adverse changes in the property insurance marketplace began over 24 months ago and escalated following the tragedy of September 11, 2001; and

WHEREAS, while able to compete at the time, the LGPIF was not immune to reinsurance and capacity problems within the industry and due to this, combined with increased in loss activity over the past several years, was forced to take rate actions in response; and

WHEREAS, the recent actions of the LGPIF, combined with the inability to provide property insurance coverage, has placed the municipal mutual insurance companies, owned by local units of government, in the position of purchasing insurance coverage in an uncompetitive market; and

WHEREAS, the solution to this dilemma is a change in the current statutes to allow municipal owned mutual insurance companies to provide quality, cost effective property insurance coverage to those eligible for coverage through municipally-owned mutual companies or their affiliated insurance companies; and

WHEREAS, 2003 Senate Bill 176 authorizes a municipal insurance mutual to provide property insurance to its members.

The Eau Claire County and Chippewa County Board Chair shall each appoint 1 County Board Supervisor. The Dunn County Board Chair shall appoint 1 member, either a County Board Supervisor or citizen. The period of appointment shall be 2 years commending April 2004. The remaining 4 members shall be citizens and residents of Eau Claire County or Chippewa County jointly appointed by the Eau Claire County and Chippewa County Board Chairs and approved by their respective County Boards.

4. Ownership - Eau Claire County would retain ownership with an option to purchase that could be exercised by Chippewa County during the specified time period.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that \$150,000 ofundesignated general fund balance be designated and used for workforce reduction expenses.

WHEREAS, under current law, the State Public Defender (SPD) provides counsel to represent people in various legal proceedings, including criminal proceedings that may result in imprisonment, emergency detention or involuntary civil commitment proceedings, proceedings for the protective placement of an adult, paternity determination and juvenile delinquency proceedings; and

WHEREAS, the SPD provides counsel to children regardless to the child's income or assets, but only provides counsel to adults who the SPD determines are indigent; and

WHEREAS, current law provides that a person is indigent for purposes of SPD representation when a person's income and assets, after deductions for reasonable and necessary living expenses, are insufficient to cover the cost of effective legal representation based on the amounts of the former AFDC program; and

WHEREAS, in determining whether a person can afford counsel, courts are not limited by the SPD indigency criteria and not appoint private counsel when they determine the person cannot afford counsel, and the county in which the courts sits must pay the appointed counsel.

WHEREAS, in 2002 Eau Claire County paid in excess of \$112,000 for individuals that did not meet SPD indigency criteria; and

WHEREAS, effective May 1, 2005 the Assembly Bill Substitute Amendment to this bill changes the criteria for determining indigency for purposes of SPD representation based on whether he or she meets the financial eligibility criteria for the Wisconsin Works program which in part is based on 115% of the federal poverty guideline as updated annually; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly Substitute Amendment to this bill provides for hiring 44.25 full-time equivalent general purpose revenue positions on May 1, 2005; and

WHEREAS, effective May 1, 2005 the Assembly Substitute Amendment to this bill requires the SPD to provide legal representation to any person, regardless of whether the person is indigent, who seeks SPD

representation and is the subject of an involuntary commitment proceeding for mental health or alcoholism treatment, a protective placement proceeding, or a proceeding to appoint a guardian because the person is alleged to be not competent to refuse psychotropic medication.

WHEREAS, since 1995 state shared revenues to Eau Claire County have been reduced \$1,613,824 or 33.8%; and

WHEREAS, in the Eau Claire County 2004 budget process the board was faced with a loss of over \$1,000,000 in state shared revenue and categorical aids, double-digit increases in health insurance costs plus negotiated salary increases costing \$1,400,000; and

WHEREAS, the 2004 Eau Claire County budget decreased total spending by 1.8%, increased the tax levy by 8.8% while reducing the tax levy rate by 0.3%; and

WHEREAS, to keep the levy increase at the adopted level a \$2.5 million spending reduction plus revenue increases were required; and

WHEREAS, the 2004 budget included a workforce reduction of 35 positions or 25.5 FTE's equivalent to \$1.2 million in levy funds; and





3.60.010 Failure to timely complete.

- A non-represented employee responsible for evaluating other employees shall be denied a step increase if required performance evaluation(s) are not filed within 30 days of the due date. Personnel shall send performance evaluation forms to evaluators 30 days prior to the due date of the performance evaluation. - 18.23.001 Purpose. The purpose of this chapter is to set standards under which home occupations and home businesses may be conducted so that such occupations do not undermine the purpose and intent of Title 18 and the purposes of the zoning districts that home occupations and home businesses are allowed in.
- 18.23.010 Standards for home occupations. Home occupations shall be allowed without permit in all agricultural and residential districts, provided they conform to the following performance standards:

- A. The occupation shall be conducted entirely within a dwelling unit or an accessory structure customarily located with a farm or dwelling unit;
- B. The floor area devoted to the occupation shall not exceed 500 square feet, except as a conditional use under 18.23.015;
- C. No person other than a resident of the dwelling shall be employed therein; except that one nonresident full-time equivalent (FTE) employee can be approved as a conditional use excluding motor vehicle and small engine repairs (18.23.015 C.) with the exclusion of the A-1 district where the State Farmland Preservation Standards shall be met;
- D. No inventory of a commodity shall be sold on a regular basis on the premises except as a conditional use granted under Chapter 18.21;
- E. The occupation shall not be objectionable to neighboring uses due to noise, dust, odors, hours of operation, traffic generation or electrical interference;
- F. One business sign for a home occupation is permitted, not to exceed 6 square feet per sign face in agricultural zoning districts, provided that the sign be located not less than 15 feet from a property line or right-of-way line, nor shall it extend higher than 10 feet from grade level, and shall not be located in a vision triangle of a public road or private driveway; and
- G. There shall be no outside storage or display of products, materials, or equipment, except:
- 1. In a home occupation for repairing motor vehicles no more than 2 motor vehicles may be stored outside under the following conditions:
- a. The vehicle(s) shall be stored within an enclosed area approved by the department which may include appropriate landscaping;
- b. The vehicle(s) stored must be customer vehicles only, not those of the holder of the permit or relatives of the permittee;
- c. The vehicle(s) must be repaired immediately and in no event shall be on the premises for longer than 2 weeks;
- d. The vehicle(s) shall be allowed as limited by the proximity to the neighbors; and
- e. No repair work may be done outside, other than that which is necessary to start a vehicle to move it into the building where repair work takes place.
- 2. The outside storage and display of specialty seasonal products such as Christmas trees is allowed for a period not to exceed 8 weeks.
- 18.23.015 Home occupations as conditional uses. The following uses may be permitted as home occupations, provided the requirements of Chapter 18.21 are followed and the standards of 18.23.010 are met:
- A. Professional offices, including but not limited to physicians, chiropractors, dentists, lawyers, real estate brokers, insurance agents and contractors;
 - B. Beauty and barber shops;
- C. Repair of motor vehicles and small engines including the construction and operation of racing machines such as stock cars, snowmobiles, and tractors; and
- D. Storage of motor vehicles and recreational vehicles in accessory structures that were existing at the time of adoption of the zoning code (1983).
- 18.23.020 Standards for home businesses. The following rules and regulations shall apply to home businesses wherever they are allowed as a permitted or conditional use:

- A. The single-family dwelling and business shall be collectively considered the principal use of the property.
- B. The single-family dwelling and business shall be subject to the appropriate setback requirements for principal structures, and all structures that are accessory to the principal structures shall be subject to appropriate setback requirements for accessory structures.
- C. The business shall be conducted by a resident of the single-family dwelling on the property.
 - D. The business may employ as many as 6 FTE's.
- E. Any business activities that are conducted on the premises, other than loading or unloading vehicles, shall occur inside the business structure. Appropriate noise abatement measures shall be used for those types of businesses that may generate excessive noise.
 - F. Size limitations for home businesses.
 - 1. Limitations on the size of structure for a home business.
- a. If the business is conducted within the single-family dwelling, it shall occupy no more than 60% of the floor area of the main floor.
- b. If the business is conducted within another structure, the floor area of the structure shall be no more than 2,400 square feet on the property for lots 2 acres in size or less. For lots greater than 2 acres in size the total square footage for a separate structure for the business shall comply with the following table:

- c. Under no circumstances shall the floor area of a separate structure for a home business exceed 4,800 square feet.
 - 2. Limitations on the size of a home business use on a parcel of land.
- a. The sum of the following shall not exceed 40% of the total area of the lot that the home business is located on, nor shall it exceed 2 acres in size: the floor area of separate structures or that part of the single-family dwelling that is occupied by the business; the floor area of any accessory structures associated with the business; all parking and outside storage areas associated with the business.
- G. Outside storage of equipment and vehicles associated with the home business is permitted, and parts or materials used in the business may be stored outside provided the following standards are met:
 - 1. All stored materials shall be kept in a neat and organized manner;
- 2. Parts or containers that contain fluids, gels, liquids, powders, granules or any other materials that could potentially leak onto the ground surface shall not be stored outside;
- 3. Outside storage areas designated for materials used in the business shall be located to the rear of the single-family dwelling on the property, or to the rear of a separate principal structure constructed for the business if one is constructed; and
- 4. Vehicles being repaired at automobile repairs shops allowed as home businesses may be stored outside under the following conditions:
 - a. No more than 12 vehicles shall be stored outside at any time;

- b. The vehicles stored must be customer vehicles only;
- c. The vehicles shall be stored within an enclosed area approved by the department that may include appropriate landscaping in addition to the landscaping required in 18,20,020 H.;
- d. The vehicles must be repaired immediately and in no event shall be on the premises for longer than 2 weeks; and
- e. No repair work may be done outside, other than that which is necessary to start a vehicle to move it into the building where repair work takes place.
- H. The area dedicated to the home business use on the property shall be screened from view from neighboring properties with a vegetative screen not less than 8 feet in height by planting any of the following types of shrubs that are at least 24 inches tall at the time of planting: burningbush (euonymus alutus), chinese lilac (syringa chinensis), arrowwood viburnum (viburnum dentatum), american cranberrybush viburnum (viburnum trilobum), techny arborvitae (thuja occidentalis), or any other suitable vegetation that can achieve a height of 8 feet within 5 years.
- I. Adequate parking shall be provided for both the residential use and business use of the property in accord with Chapter 18.25.
- 18.23.025 Home businesses as conditional uses. The following types of businesses, which include but are not limited to selected types of small businesses that do not generate heavy volumes of vehicular traffic or require special sanitary waste systems, may be allowed as home businesses in any zoning district where home businesses require a conditional use permit, except where permitted by land use permit in Chapter 18.34:
- A. Service oriented businesses such as lawn care businesses, tree trimming businesses, janitorial services, septic pumping services, and other similar businesses that provide services at locations other than the home business location;
- B. Contractors' offices such as building contractors, electrical contractors, plumbers, masons, cement contractors, well drilling contractors, landscape contractors, and excavation contractors;
- C. Custom production and repair of furniture, cabinetry and woodworking shops, and upholstery shops, provided all production and repair activities occur indoors and appropriate noise abatement measures are implemented to eliminate external noise;
 - D. Small engine repair shops;
 - E. Automobile repair shops; and
- F. Specialty stores that draw a specific clientele such as western shops and art galleries. General merchandise retail businesses are not included in this category of use.

O. Home businesses, subject to the standards in Chapter 18.23.

18.34.001 Purpose. The HB home business district is established to provide areas where selected businesses, which do not generate large volumes of traffic and do not require special sanitary waste systems, can be established in conjunction with single-family dwellings on the same property. The purpose of this district is to allow for the creation of neighborhoods where home business activities can occur without creating land use conflicts. The standards set out in this chapter shall apply in the district.

18.34.010 Permitted principal uses. The following principal uses are permitted in the HB district:

- A. Agriculture, including those agricultural uses under 18.04.010 A.;
- B. Single-family dwellings; and
- C. The following types of home businesses, or uses similar to those listed here, that can occur in conjunction with the residential use of the property, subject to the special requirements in 18.23.020:
- 1. Service oriented businesses such as lawn care businesses, tree trimming businesses, cleaning services, and other similar businesses that provide services at locations other than the home business location.
- 2. Contractors' offices such as building contractors, electrical contractors, plumbers, masons, cement contractors, well drilling contractors, and excavation contractors.
- 18.34.015 Permitted principal structures. The following principal structures are permitted in the HB district:
- A. Agricultural structures, including but not limited to barns, plant greenhouses, and stables;
 - B. Single-family dwellings; and
 - C. Structures associated with home businesses permitted as principal uses.
- 18.34.020 Permitted accessory uses. The following accessory uses are allowed in the HB district:
 - A. Home occupations as defined in Chapter 18.23;
 - B. The private storage of motor vehicles and farm related equipment;
- C. Private recreational activities, including but not limited to swimming, tennis, and playground activities; and
 - D. Parking of vehicles used in conjunction with a home business.

- 18.34.025 Permitted accessory structures. The following accessory structures are allowed in the HB district:
- A. Structures for the private storage of motor vehicles and farm related equipment; and
 - B. Structures for the storage of equipment and materials associated with a home business.
- 18.34.030 Conditional uses. The following uses are considered conditional uses in the HB district and are subject to the provisions of Chapter 18.21:
- A. The following types of home businesses, or uses similar to the uses listed here, that can occur in conjunction with the residential use of the property, subject to the special requirements in 18.23.020:
- 1. Custom production and repair of furniture, cabinetry and woodworking shops, and upholstery shops, provided all production and repair activities occur indoors and appropriate noise abatement measures are implemented to eliminate external noise;
 - 2. Small engine repair shops; and
 - 3. Automobile repair shops;
 - B. Kennels; and
 - C. Religious and governmental uses.
- 18.34.035 Structures subject to conditional use permits. The following structures may be allowed in the HB district under conditional use permits, issued pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 18.21:
 - A. Structures associated with home businesses permitted as conditional uses;
 - B. Kennels;
 - C. Governmental structures such as police stations, fire stations, and town halls;
 - D. Structures utilized for religious purposes including convents and churches; and
 - E. Public and quasi-public utility structures not covered by Chapter 18.30.
- 18.34.040 Lot, height and yard requirements. The following lot, height and yard requirements are established for the HB district:
 - A. Yard Requirements.
 - 1. Lot area shall be a minimum of 1 acre.
 - 2. The minimum width for all lots shall be 100 feet.
 - B. Maximum Height.
 - 1. The maximum height of a residential structure shall be 35 feet.
- 2. The maximum height for all other principal structures shall be 30 feet or ½ the distance to the nearest property line for all structures exceeding 30 feet.
 - C. Setbacks.
 - 1. The minimum highway setbacks shall be regulated under Chapter 18.22.
- 2. The minimum side-yard setback shall be 20 feet for principal and accessory structures, and the minimum side-yard setback for principal structures other than residences abutting a residential district shall be 50 feet.
- 3. The minimum rear-yard setback shall be 20 feet for principal and accessory structures and the minimum rear-yard setback for principal structures other than residences abutting a residential district shall be 50 feet.
 - 4. Side-yard setbacks on a corner lot shall be 50 feet.

5. No accessory structure may be placed in a required front yard.

18.34.045 Additional requirements. The following additional regulations shall apply in the HB district:

- A. Provisions for parking shall conform to the requirements in Chapter 18.25;
- B. The placement and use of signs shall conform to the requirements of Chapter 18.26; and
 - C. Site plans shall be submitted in accordance with the requirements of 18.31.030.

-TO AMEND SECTION 3.21.010 A. OF THE CODE; ELIGIBILITY-

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Eau Claire does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. That Subsection A. of Section 3.21.010 of the code be amended to read:

A. Permanent Full-time Employees. Individuals appointed to full-time permanent positions <u>normally scheduled to work a minimum of 1,716 annual hours</u> shall be eligible for all employee benefits in this chapter.

PLACED ON FILE: October 7, 2003

-SUPPORTING COMPANION LEGISLATION, 2003 SENATE BILL 286 AND 2003 ASSEMBLY BILL 598, AS WELL AS 2003 SENATE BILL 285 AND 2003 ASSEMBLY BILL 599 MAKING CHANGES TO CURRENT LAW REGARDING EMPLOYMENT RELATIONS BETWEEN LOCAL GOVERNMENTS AND THEIR EMPLOYEES-

WHEREAS, 2003 Senate Bill 286 and 2003 Assembly Bill 598 would make the following changes in the current law relating to employment relations between local governments and their employees:

- 1. The arbitrator must give greater weight to economic conditions in the jurisdiction of the municipal employer and specifically consider revenues available without the municipal employer having to increase its property tax rate to maintain essential services.
- 2. The arbitrator would be limited to considering comparable employment data from employees performing similar work within the community.
- 3. The arbitrator would be required to specify in writing how he or she applied factors, before the award could take effect.
- 4. It would make contracting services a prohibited subject of bargaining.
- 5. Restrict back pay awards.

WHEREAS, 2003 Senate Bill 285 and 2003 Assembly Bill 599 would change current law relating to employment relations between local governments and their employees by requiring newly hired employees to pay the first 3% of the employee portion of their Wisconsin Retirement System cost, as a non-bargainable contribution.

WHEREAS, these Bills will encourage prompt and fair settlement of public employee contracts, provide local governments with greater flexibility to work smarter and more efficiently and make the impact on property tax rates a factor in public employee bargaining.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors that it supports 2003 Senate Bill 286 and 2003 Assembly Bill 598 as well as 2003 Senate Bill 285 and 2003 Assembly Bill 599 making changes to current law regarding employment relations between local governments and their employees.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Clerk be directed to forward a copy of this resolution to all area legislators, members of the Committee on Labor, Small Business Development and Consumer Affairs, Joint Survey Committee on Retirement Systems, Governor Jim Doyle and the Wisconsin Counties Association.

- As soon as practical, the following standing committees shall be appointed by the A. chair of the board ad hoc committee on appointments and shall consist of 5 members each except as specifically designated in this section:
 - Committee on administration (3 of whom shall be the county board 1. officers);
 - 2. Committee on personnel:
 - 3. Committee on judiciary and law enforcement;
 - Committee on UW-Extension education; 4.
 - 5. Committee on planning and development:
 - 6. Highway committee;
 - 7. Committee on parks and forests;
 - 8. Committee on finance and budget:
 - The human services board (for appointment of 6 county board members); 9.
- The chair of the board ad hoc committee on appointments shall make written announcements of appointments to said committees to the board, and the chair of the board shall designate a chair pro tempore of each of said committees. Each member shall be appointed to at least one committee. All appointments shall be for 2 year terms commencing on the 3rd Tuesday of April in even-numbered years. In case of a vacancy in any committee the same shall be filled by written appointment of the chair as and with the 1st vice-chair and 2nd vice-chair for the unexpired portion of the term. In the event of a vacancy in the office of chair of the board and a successor is elected, such successor may, within 30 days, make changes in committee appointments in the manner provided in this section.

SECTION 3. That Subsection A. of Section 2.04.140 of the code be amended to read:

Each committee shall be convened to organize by the chair pro tempore not later than 3 weeks following the filing of the appointments thereto by the chair of the county board ad hoc committee on appointments. At such meeting each committee, except those named in
