



WHEREAS, in November, 1999, Subchapter X of Chapter 66 of the Wisconsin Statutes was enacted, commonly referred to as the Wisconsin "Smart Growth" law, which established requirements for comprehensive planning in the State of Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, the Smart Growth law requires Eau Claire County and most municipalities in the county to prepare comprehensive plans; and

WHEREAS, the Smart Growth law supports intergovernmental cooperation, requiring any jurisdiction that prepares a comprehensive plan to evaluate and plan for intergovernmental cooperation; and

WHEREAS, the new statutory language in 46.279 makes "the most integrated setting" the dominant factor in a court's determination of a Protective Placement order; and

WHEREAS, this statutory change has the effect of potentially eliminating any budgetary constraint arguments counties may make under "County Shield" language in Wis. Stats. 55.06(9) and would require counties to pay the non-federal share of any placements of any ICF/MR court ordered placements; and

WHEREAS, there are no assurances that these state funds are sufficient to cover the cost of maintaining these people in either their current ICF/MR placement or community placement; and

WHEREAS, if this state allocation proves to be insufficient to meet the needs of the people and the costs, it will create an additional unfunded mandate upon the counties;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors opposes this action unless there are assurances from the State of Wisconsin that they will cover all reasonable costs associated with the ICF/MR downsizing initiative and court ordered new or ongoing protective placements and requests that the Wisconsin Legislature in its next regular session take action to correct this potential cost shift and unfunded mandate by assuring complete funding.

WHEREAS, the public has reasonable expectation that farming operations that receive public funding to enlarge their dairy herd will not threaten the quality of the State of Wisconsin's waters; and

WHEREAS, in order to protect the State's ground water and surface water quality, care must be taken to ensure that manure generated from dairy cows is stored and managed so that it can most safely decompose, and its nutrients be utilized by plants without the threat of water quality degradation.



The property is described as parcels 27.10.30.2-1-D + 1-2-K, Lot 4 of a Certified Survey Map recorded on pages 233 and 234 of Volume 3. 

WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin has partnered with counties to provide Youth Aids funding to offset costs related to court ordered out of-home placement of juvenile offenders; and

WHEREAS, counties are mandated to pay the cost of court ordered placement of juveniles in state operated juvenile correction facilities; and

WHEREAS, the proportionate share of the costs for juvenile out-of-home placements statewide borne by the counties has increased dramatically from 8% in 1982 to over 57% in 2002; and

WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin continues to raise the daily rates charged to counties at juvenile correctional facilities well in excess of cost of living increases, resulting-increased costs to the local county taxpayers and exacerbating the financial burden on counties and propertytaxjayers to pay a greater share of the costs of the juvenile justice program; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's 2005-2007 budget recommends an 18.8% increase over the biennium in the daily rate for placements in state juvenile correctional facilities, from \$187/day (\$68,255/year) to \$224/day (\$81,760/year), resulting in a projected cost increase to Eau Claire County in excess of \$180,000 over the biennium.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Eau Claire County Board of Supervisors hereby opposes any increase in the daily rates charged to counties at state juvenile correctional facilities that are above the cost of living rates without an equal increase in the amount of Youth Aids funding allocated to counties.
