Schools Fight Food Waste Grant Application

Eau Claire County has received funding through the USDA to reduce food waste in our community. Part of that funding has been dedicated to assisting K-12 schools in Eau Claire County establish or improve upon food waste diversion efforts and education about food waste and composting. The maximum award amount is \$1,000. If you are applying for multiple schools separate applications should be submitted. Applications for the first round will be due August 18th by 4PM.

Eligible Project Activities

Preference will be given to applications that incorporate 2 or more of the following:

- 1. Implement a compost program during student mealtimes. Extra points will be given to programs that plan to compost in the kitchen and in the cafeteria.
- 2. Establish a Share Table or a similar program that diverts food that is still safe to consume from being wasted.
- 3. Engage students in the project implementation and educating students about food waste and composting.
- 4. Improve upon an existing composting program.

Eligible Project Expenses

- 1. Subscription to curbside compost service.
- 2. Purchase of a compost bin or the materials needed to construct one.
- 3. Purchase of compostable materials such as bags, cutlery, etc.
- 4. Purchase of materials for a Share Table. Learn about Share Tables and safety requirements at https://www.fns.usda.gov/cn/use-share-tables-child-nutrition-programs
- 5. Purchase of educational materials such as books, lessons, activities, etc. that discuss composting, food waste, or soil health.

Reporting Requirements

As part of this funding opportunity, you will be required to perform a waste audit prior to project implementation and then again either at the end of that school year or within 1 year of receiving the grant. Eau Claire County staff and volunteers will be available to assist during these waste audits if the applicant chooses at no cost to the applicant.
