1) Call to order by Chair

Chair Leary called the meeting to order at 1:00 pm.

Roll call was taken. A quorum was present with 6 members in attendance.

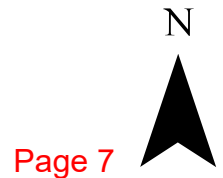


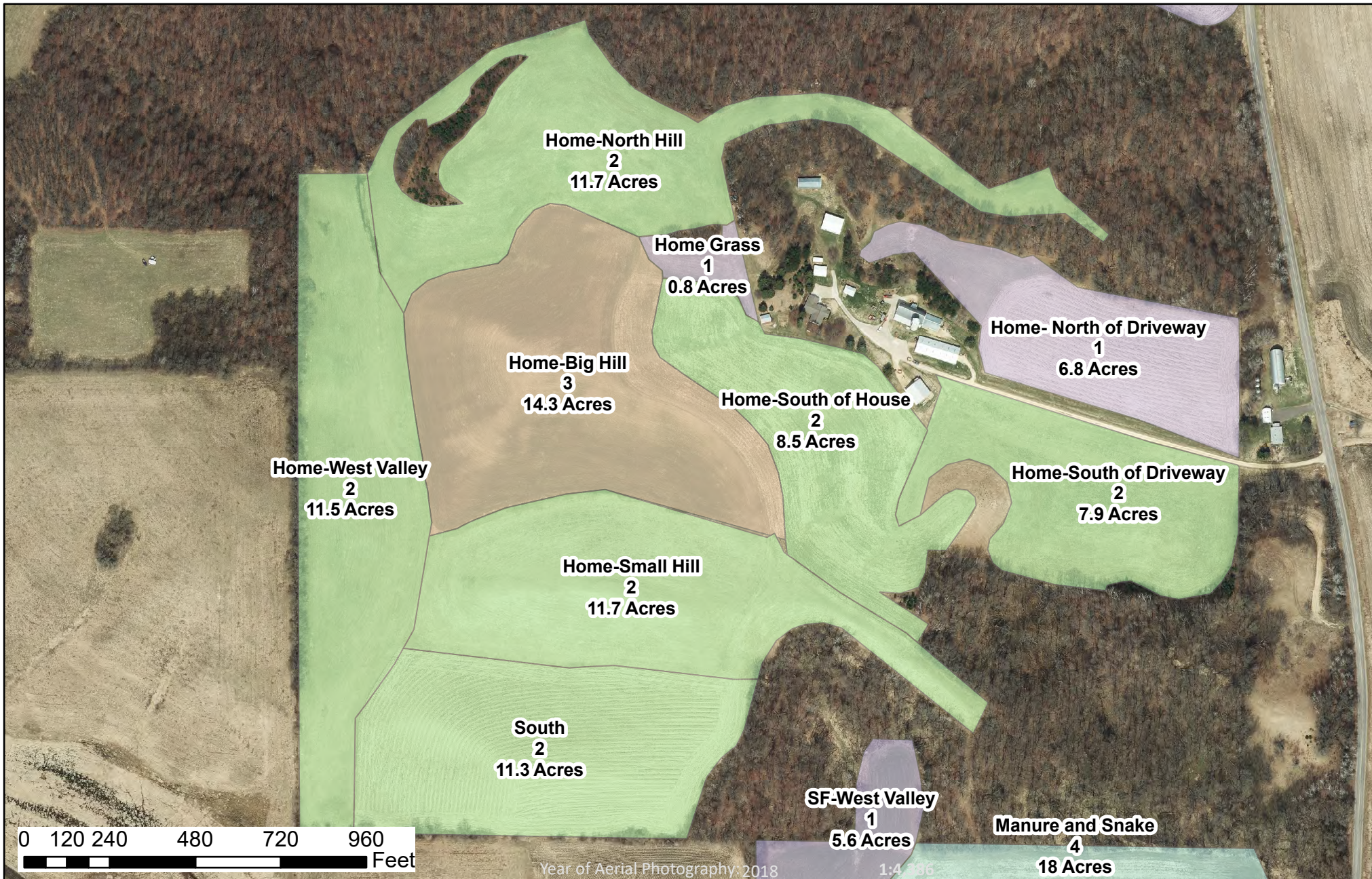
