Review of August 21st, 2023, ADRC Board Minutes / Discussion – Action, Handout #1-Jean Doty motions to approve as presented-all in favor. None opposed. Approved August minutes as presented.

Unwinding Presentation – Kathy Welke, Great Rivers Consortium Administrator, Handout #2:

Kathy Welke explained that during the pandemic beneficiaries of Foodshare, Medical Assistance, Badger Care, etc., were not being reviewed to determine if they still qualified for benefits, there were no reviews, or disenrollments conducted during this time. The Great Rivers Consortium is essentially unwinding benefits to pre-pandemic benefit levels.

Stella asked how the unwinding affects the ADRC? Linda and Lisa explained the process when a beneficiary is disenrolled from managed care organizations and how Options Counselors assist those individuals. Also, if Foodshare and Medicaid benefits have been decreased or stopped, the Elder and Disability Benefit Specialists might get involved to explain the complex public assistance programs and/or work with the consortia to find out other options.

Health Promotion Programs Presentation – Deb Brunning, Prevention Program Coordinator, Handout #3:

Deb Brunning explained the roll of health prevention programs and how they increased life expectancy which has taken place over the last 100 years. Deb discussed the programs that are offered in Eau Claire County and why some are offered virtually, in-person, self-directed or both and the benefits of each program.

Transportation Updates –

Betsy Henck and Linda Struck informed the board that management is currently working on the Regional Coordinated Plan with the regional Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), as a requirement for the 85.21 plan. The Regional Coordinated Plan is updated every five years and this year, as in years past, we are working with Chippewa County. This process looks at transportation as it is now and how to address any gaps in transportation for the community. A required public hearing is scheduled for October 4th at 10 a.m. to 12 p.m., which will be held at the VFW Post 305, in Eau Claire.

The 85.21 application is due in December for Eau Claire County. As part of the application, the ADRC will be hosting a public hearing. Discussion of possible locations and virtual options held. The

board decided to hold the public hearing before the November 20th ADRC Board meeting at 4 p.m., with a virtual attendance optional available. The ADRC Board meeting will begin directly following the public hearing which will end at 5 p.m. on Monday, November 20, 2023.

The request for proposals has been sent for the Paratransit Program transportation contract which is a joint program with the City of Eau Claire. Currently the contract is held by Abby Vans.

Nutrition Updates -

Besty stated that the request for proposals will be sent out for the food vendor for the Meals on Wheels program. Currently the contract is held by Sysco.

Betsy conducted an overview of the results of the Nutrition Satisfaction Survey for the home delivered and the congregate dining sites. Overall, there is a high level of satisfaction. Some of the highlights of the home delivered meals is the increase in feeling safe and the decrease in the number of participants who say that the Meals on Wheels volunteers are their only visitors.

Follow Up on 2024 Budget Presentation –

No questions.

Compensation/Performance Evaluation Project -

Linda informed the board of the compensation project for the Eau Claire County employees.

Advocacy/Unmet Needs –

No discussion.

Future Agenda Items-

Stella asked to see the transportation stats, after the coordinated transportation meetings.

Stella also stated that on future agendas the Board Introductions will be listed as Roll Call.

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Chippewa and Eau Claire Counties Locally-Developed Human Service Transportation Coordination Plan

Purpose

Federal transportation law, as amended by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) (2023), requires that projects selected for funding under the Enhanced Mobility of Seniors & Individuals with Disabilities (Section 5310) be "derived from a locally developed, coordinated public transit-human service transportation plan" and that the plan be "developed and approved through a process that includes representatives of public, private, and non-profit transportation and human services providers and participation by members of the public." This plan is intended to meet this requirement while providing guidance to the Counties and region in providing and improving specialized transportation services over the next five years. The State of Wisconsin also requires the development of these "coordination plans" for projects within the 85.21 program, Specialized Transportation Assistance Program for Counties.

This process began in 2006, when Chippewa and Eau Claire Counties developed a coordination plan to meet the then-new federal requirements under The Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU), prior to the issuance of FTA guidance on the requirement. In 2008, another process was undertaken to update the 2006 process to meet the new guidance. As the legislation includes a requirement for updates of the plans every five years, Chippewa and Eau Claire Counties updated the plan in 2013 and 2018 and are now presenting this plan to coordinate human service transportation for the years 2024 through 2028.

Process/Meeting Summary

A meeting was held in Eau Claire, Wisconsin (in Eau Claire County) on October 4th, 2023, to review and update the 2019-2023 Locally Developed Transportation Coordination Plan. An invitation flyer for the the meeting was sent to transportation providers and related agencies serving the two counties, and a public notice was published in the local paper. The meeting invitation flyer, invitation list, public notice, attendance list, and the meeting agenda are included in Attachments A through E, respectively.

The meeting was opened with a presentation about the coordinated planning process, the purpose of the process, and illustration and discussion of the demographics of the counties and the greater west central and northwest Wisconsin regions, including the location and distribution of elderly, people living with a disability, low-income persons, and those without access to an automobile. (See Counties maps in Attachment F.) The coordination plan from 2018 was summarized and service gaps and needs were updated. The strategies for coordination were categorized under three broad goals, reviewed, revised as appropriate, and updated to meet the changing needs of the counties. The meeting participants then approved the final goals and strategies.

The final product, this document, is a plan for Chippewa and Eau Claire Counties to continue moving ahead to meet the transportation needs of its citizens who are elderly and/or have a disability. Chippewa and Eau Claire Counties are also committed to working with neighboring counties to meet a growing need for transportation on a regional scale.

Transportation needs and related action recommendations

The participants from Chippewa and Eau Claire counties updated the needs expressed in their 2013 plans and added newly-identified gaps/needs, resulting in the following list: The group also developed broad goals, and more specific activities, to address the needs. The goals were prioritized and responsibilities and implementation timelines were assigned to the activities, as shown in Table 1.

- Connectivity between Chippewa Falls and Eau Claire transit services
- Improved workforce transportation

- Better information of available services to target populations to encourage use
- Expand existing services to meet demand
- Stability of funding
- Increased funding to meet increasing demands
- Accessible service after current daytime hours
