ISSUES ON THE HORIZON AND SIGNIFICANT TRENDS
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The populations of those age 60+ continues to increase at a rapid rate as the baby boomers grow older. All communities throughout the United States are experiencing this to some degree and Eau Claire County is no exception. It is anticipated that the percentage of adults 60+ in Eau Claire County will continue to grow. From 2010 to 2020, Eau Claire County had an increase of 26% and from 2020 to 2040, we are projecting to have an additional 18% increase in this population. 2. Due to population increase in older adults, service demand for our programs continues to increase significantly, however the funding has remained still. We continue to explore ways to modify how we provide these services to keep up with the rising demand. 3. The population boom has put a strain on all resources for seniors and people living with a disability, such as low-income housing, nursing home beds, caregiver support, etc.
