### Putting American Veterans into Piping Apprenticeships

The Veterans in Piping (VIP) Program has been brought back to the State of Wisconsin. VIP can provide a positive re-entry into civilian life with the opportunity of a long-term lucrative career opportunity within the Piping Trades. Training qualified pipe tradesmen longer than anyone else in the industry. The UA boasts the most comprehensive training programs available in the industry today, including five-year apprenticeship programs, extensive journeyman training, organized instructor training, and certification programs.

#### The Sacrifice

The men and women of the UA's VIP Program will endure a total of 18 weeks of a structured training. The training consists of 6 weeks of class room that consist of 4 days a week /10 hours each day and up to 12 weeks of On the Job Training (OJT). VIP Candidates will receive an opportunity to work directly for an approved participating Union Contractor.

#### High Unemployment

Veterans are facing high unemployment rates. The unemployment rate is extremely high for returning Veterans between the ages of 18—24 years of age. Non-Veterans the unemployment rate is even higher.

#### Military to Civilian Life

Veterans face the challenge of transferring military skills to civilian workforce. Though many benefit and support systems are available to them, they are often very complicated, and many veterans find it difficult.

#### Success in Training

United Association Journeymen and Apprentices of the Plumbing and Pipe Fitting Industry and the US military have partnered to create the VIP Program. This program provides returning veterans, veterans and disabled veterans with 18 weeks of accelerated training in the pipe trades.

#### **Employment Opportunities**

Through the structured training VIP program, each VIP Candidate will have the opportunity to perform for an approved contractor.

#### **Cost to Veterans**

There is no cost to Veterans for the training. The training is free for Veterans. All the training funding is provided by UA's International Training Fund. BAS will provide the Veteran aid in Lodging Costs. This will provide the Veteran the opportunity to completely focus on the new career opportunity learning objectives.
