White Pine	<i>Pinus strobus</i>	Clay, Loamy & Sandy Soils. Well-drained.	Full Sun, Tolerates some shade under open woods	Soft, green needles, 2-5" long with 5-8" cones. Wispy needles in clusters of 5.	80-100'	Lumber/pulp/wildlife cover. WI's largest conifer; picturesque. Fast growing
Red Pine	<i>Pinus resinosa</i>	Clay, Loamy & Sandy Soils. Well-drained.	Full Sun, Partial Sun	Long, dark green (4-6") needles, beautiful bark turns red as it matures. Self-pruning.	60-80'	Windbreak, pulp & lumber. Fast growing.
White Spruce	<i>Picea glauca</i>	Clay, Loamy & Sandy Soils	Full Sun, Partial Sun, Shade Tolerant	Nice conical shape; stiff, short needles.	50-70'	Popular Christmas tree. Naturally deer resistant and high wildlife value. Pulpwood and lumber. Moderate/Fast growing.
Norway Spruce	<i>Picea abies</i>	Clay, Loamy & Sandy Soils. Well-drained.	Full Sun, Partial Sun	Short, shiny, and stiff needles 1/2 to 1" long. 4 to 6" cones.	60-90'	Windbreak & wildlife cover. Can stand winds up to 100mph. Naturally deer resistant. Fast growing.
Colorado Blue Spruce	<i>Picea pungens</i>	Clay, Loamy & Sandy Soils.	Full Sun, Partial Sun	Sharp, pointed needles, green to blue in color. 2-4" cones, start green then turn brown.	60-80'	Windbreak & wildlife cover. Naturally deer resistant. Moderate growing.
Balsam Fir	<i>Abies balsamea</i>	Loamy & Sandy Soils. Well-drained.	Full sun, Partial Sun, Shade Tolerant.	Dark, flat, bright green needles, 1/2 - 1" long, 2-4" cones.	50-70'	Nice, fragrant Christmas trees; slower growing.
Fraser Fir	<i>Abies fraseri</i>	Loamy & Sandy Soils, moist but well-drained, acidic.	Full Sun	Dark green-blue, flattened 3/4" long needles slightly upward.	40-60'	Fragrant needles; Very similar to Balsam Fir, with softer needles & rounder branches. Slow growing.
Tamarack	<i>Larix laricina</i>	Clay, Loamy & Sandy Soils.	Full Sun	Soft green foliage during spring, then turns yellow-orange in fall. Branches show during the winter months.	50-70'	Fall color, unique foliage, naturalizing lowland areas (wetlands). Moderate growing.
White Cedar	<i>Thuja occidentalis</i>	Clay, Loamy & Sandy Soils.	Full Sun, Partial Sun	Flattened branches with green, scaly, fan-like foliage. Cold/Heat tolerant.	30-40'	Used for hedges and other types of border and shelter planting. Wildlife habitat. Slow growing.
Canadian Hemlock	<i>Tsuga canadensis</i>	Loamy & Sandy Soils. Well-drained.	Full Sun, Partial Sun, Shade.	Small needles, dark green on top and light green underneath.	40-60'	Fragrant, privacy screening and wildlife cover. Moderate growing.

Bur Oak	<i>Quercus macrocarpa</i>	Clay, Loamy & Sandy Soils. Drought resistant.	Full Sun, Partial Sun	Will grow acorns once it matures. Large and stately form.	80-100'	Windbreaks/food & cover for wildlife. Excellent shade tree. Moderate grower.
White Oak	<i>Quercus alba</i>	Clay, Loamy & Sandy Soils.	Full Sun, Partial Sun	Pale gray bark; leaves are deeply divided in to 5-9 lobes.	60-80'	Good for large spaces and windbreaks. Great for shade. Moderate growth rate.
Silver Maple	<i>Acer saccharinum</i>	Clay, Loamy & Sandy Soils.	Full Sun, Partial Sun	Leaves that are green on top and silvery-white on bottom.	50-70'	Seeds used by songbirds/ small mammals. Very hardy and fast growing shade tree.
Sugar Maple	<i>Acer saccharum</i>	Deep, moist, well-drained soils.	Full Sun, Partial Sun, Shade	Dark green foliage, turning yellow to orange, to fiery red in the fall.	50-70'	Planted for timber/shade trees/maple syrup. Moderate growth rate.
Red Maple	<i>Acer rubrum</i>	Clay, Loamy & Sandy Soils.	Full Sun, Partial Sun, Shade	Bright red flowers in spring, followed by green leaves. Fall colors vary from yellow to scarlet.	40-60'	Maple syrup production. Pulpwood and timber. Shade tree, with red color all year round usually. Moderate growth rate.
River Birch	<i>Betula nigra</i>	Clay, Loamy & Sandy Soils.	Full Sun, Partial Sun	Ivory, tan, and cinnamon-colored bark unique for peeling off.	50-70'	Erosion control along streams and banks. Tree for areas to temporary flooding. Great cover for deer plots. Moderate growth rate.
Balsam Poplar	<i>Populus balsamifera</i>	Moist sandy loam; slightly acidic.	Full sun, partial shade	Broadly ovate leaves. Dark green leaves, silvery green below; orange/brown budding.	50-80'	Windbreaks/food & cover for wildlife. Fast grower.
Hybrid Poplar	<i>Populus sp.</i>	Clay, Loamy & Sandy Soils.	Full sun	Vibrant scarlet fall color. Cross between cottonwoods, aspens, and Europe's poplars.	75-100'	Extremely fast growing, used widely in paper industry due to rate of growth, makes excellent windbreaks.

American Hazelnut	<i>Corylus Avellana</i>	Clay, Loamy & Sandy Soils.	Full Sun, Partial Sun, Shade	Green Leaves, broad and serrated changing to orange, red & yellow in fall. The nut has a paper-like husk.	10-15'	Makes an excellent windbreak. Nuts are eaten by humans and small animals. Moderate to fast growth rate.
Highbush Cranberry	<i>Viburnum trilobum</i>	Clay & Loamy Soils.	Full Sun, Partial Sun	Upright, tall shrub; showy flat clusters of whitish flowers; glossy scarlet fruit clusters.	8-12'	Good nesting habitat; fruit is good source of wildlife food; used by 28 species of birds. Moderate growth rate.
Black Chokeberry	<i>Aronia melanocarpa</i>	Loamy & Sandy Soils.	Full Sun, Partial Sun	Small shrub with white flowers; edible, dark purple fruit.	5-10'	Renowned for making of jelly and wine; good food/cover for wildlife. Bee's favor the flowers. Moderate growth rate.
Red Osier Dogwood	<i>Cornus sericea</i>	Clay, Loamy & Sandy Soils.	Full Sun, Partial Sun	White berry; Red twigs in winter.	8-10'	White berries that attract up to 18 different kinds of birds. Great for erosion control and wildlife cover. Fast grower.
Downy Serviceberry	<i>Amelanchier arborea</i>	Acid, Moist, Well-Drained Soils.	Full Sun, Partial Sun, Shade	Four-season tree offering white flowers in spring, small red berries in summer, excellent fall color, and gray bark in winter.	15-25'	Edible berries, attracts birds and wildlife. Good privacy screen. Moderate growth rate.
Ninebark	<i>Physocarpus Opulifolia</i>	Clay, Loamy & Sandy Soils.	Full Sun, Partial Sun	Medium green leaf color; yellow to bronze fall color; white, pinkish flowers May-June; red fruit in fall.	8-10'	Good for erosion control. Attracts many birds and shelter for birds and small animals. Moderate to fast grower.
Common Chokecherry	<i>Prunus virginiana</i>	Clay, Loamy & Sandy Soils.	Full Sun to Partial Shade	Fragrant white flower. Drought tolerant.	20-30'	Great food source/habitat for wildlife; wind break, mass plantings for erosion. Moderate growth rate.

Anise Hyssop	<i>Agastache foeniculum</i>	Med Dry - Moist	Full Sun - Part Shade	June-Oct	Blue	Beautiful 3" flower spikes attract butterflies throughout summer. Excellent cutflower and nice in perennial gardens.
Black Eyed Susan	<i>Rudbeckia hirta</i>	Med Dry - Med Wet	Full to Part Sun	June-Oct	Yellow	Very common short-lived perennial occurring in a wide range of habitats. Produces lots of color the first year.
Butterfly weed	<i>Asclepias tuberosa</i>	Dry - Moist	Full to Part Sun	June-Sept	Orange	Gorgeous bed plant that attracts monarch butterflies and nectar source for others.
Harebell	<i>Campanula rotundifolia</i>	Med Dry	Full Sun - Part Shade	June-Sept	Blue	Blue bell-shaped flowers atop delicate, grassy foliage. Great plant for restorations. Common throughout WI in all dry habitats. Shade-tolerant.
Prairie Coreopsis	<i>Coreopsis palmata</i>	Dry - Moist	Full Sun - Part Shade	June-Oct	Yellow	Yellow daisies above ferny foliage. Native of driest prairies and bluff communities throughout southern 2/3 of MN and WI. Good for butterflies.
Prairie Phlox	<i>Phlox pilosa</i>	Dry - Med Wet	Full to Part Sun	May-June	Pink	Broad heads of deep pink flowers. Very nice wildflower for restorations and perennial gardens.
Purple Coneflower	<i>Echinacea purpurea</i>	Dry - Med Wet	Full - Part Sun	July-Aug	Purple	Spectacular display of broad-headed purple daisies. Great for restorations and perennial gardens.
Smooth Aster	<i>Aster laevis</i>	Med Dry - Moist Wet	Full Sun to Part Shade	July-Oct	Blue	Very showy vibrant blue flowered perennial. Several cultivated varieties exist, attesting to its beauty. Great butterfly plant and cutflower.
Swamp Milkweed	<i>Asclepias incarnata</i>	Med-Wet	Full Sun to Part Shade	June-Aug	Lavender	Host plant for monarch butterflies, very good nectar source for butterflies and hummingbirds. Great for lake edges.
Wild Bergamot	<i>Monarda fistulosa</i>	Dry - Moist	Full Sun to Part Shade	July-Aug	Lavender	One of the most common and widespread native wildflowers. Good in herbal teas. Used medicinally by Native Americans.
Wild Columbine	<i>Aquilegia canadensis</i>	Dry - Moist	Full Sun to Shade	May-June	Orange	Free-flowering woodland perennial that forms large clumps with attractive foliage. Excellent hummingbird plant. Deer deterrent. Often referred to as "honeysuckle." ☐

June Grass	<i>Koeleria macrantha</i>	Dry-Moist	Full Sun to Part Shade	June-July	Green	Clump-forming grass, most commonly associated with dry sandy soils. Low-grower suitable for edging native restoration plantings.
Little Bluestem	<i>Schizachyrium scoparium</i>	Dry-Moist	Full Sun to Part Shade	July-Sept	Amber	Fabulous ornamental grass native to dry, sandy to mesic habitats throughout the region. Amber foliage maintains color through winter. Forms neat clumps.
Switch Grass	<i>Panicum virgatum</i>	Dry-Moist	Full to Part Sun	June-Oct	Purple	Fast growing clump former with attractive open inflorescence. Suited to soils ranging from mesic to wet. Good for steep banks and slopes.
